With returns from 1,672 of the state's 1,778 precincts, unofficial totals were: Stevenson, 210,233 or 50.87 per cent; Kefauver, 208,001 or 49.13 per cent. Stevenson had 22 votes in the Democratic national convention to six for Kefauver. The vote was tight and the results closer than expected. Neither candidate could claim a smashing victory.

**REVENUE ACT OF 1956**

The new legislation provides that 1956 price supports on the so-called feed grains—corn, sorghum, and millet—be advanced to 70 per cent of parity for 1956. It further exempts growers of these crops from acreage controls this year.

The administration disapproves this change but the President has enough of a deal-making Congress to realize that few measures which come to his desk are ideal from the White House viewpoint.

Mr. Eisenhower had asked that the bill be amended to include provisions to 1956 to American farmers who signed intent to take part in it.

Congress refused to authorize such payments.

In fact, it turned the matter around and put the heat on the administration by providing that Secretary of Agriculture Benson must get the program under way this year despite the fact that farm planting is already well in progress.

This will not be easy, since basically the program is one calling for taking marginal and other land out of production, in return for cash payments. But this is not a crippling handicap. At least the administration can try to comply with the congressional mandate in 1956.

The best news about the new bill is that it is the least of the rigid price support provisions tacked onto the earlier measure. Those made that bill a highly complex, and in some ways chief reason for the President's veto.

We cannot look for miracles from the current legislation. But at least government has made a start down a slightly different road. We can hope that ultimately this path will take the nation out of the dilemma it has been in since mountainous surpluses first cast their shadow over the farm scene.

Simpson said operation of the park should be geared "to the traveling public's demands rather than bourgeoisie demands."

### Presidential Decision Meter Designed To Ease Daily Chores for Eisenhower

WASHINGTON, May 30 (AP)—At 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, President Eisenhower's daily chores became easier.

"For at that moment he was given a 'Presidential Decision Meter'—a contraption designed to help him make important executive and strategic decisions—by Gerald Miller, a 16-year-old high school junior from Halespelt, Mont.

"Good," said Eisenhower, with a grin. "How I'll have more time to play golf."

The idea behind the machine is simple enough. All Eisenhower has to do is to put down the reasons for and against taking any step, apply a plus or a minus value to each, and settle back and see what the PDM has to say.

Eisenhower also got a big kick out of a small radio, which sets its power from the sun, given him by Miller's schoolmate, Everett O'Hare, O'Hare, a 17-year-old senior, figures the President can use it to keep

track of the news while he golfs. "Doesn't the sun have to hit us?" Eisenhower asked.

O'Hare assured him a little sunlight would keep it charged. "You can keep it in your pocket," he said.

Unfortunately, Murray Snyder, the President's assistant press secretary, already had put away both the radio and the decision meter when the President met the boys, so the chance of a first hand demonstration was missed.

The two boys are here with their science teacher, Richard M. Nelson, 30, who has been named teacher of the year by McCall's magazine. The radio and the decision meter were both built as projects in Nelson's science courses.

Probably you have trouble with decisions, and would like to know more about Miller's meter. Here is his explanation:

"It is a circuit consisting of five potentiometers connected in parallel across the DC voltage supply. Po-

tenentiometer contacts connect to a summing network which consists of the five 10,000 ohm resistors and the meter—200 ohm potentiometer combination."

His explanations go on for several more equally frothy sentences, and clearly shows what happens to the youth of today when they hang around the laboratory instead of the pool hall.

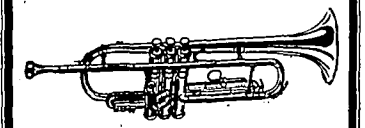

### Writer-Critic Burned Alive, Report Avers

NEW YORK, May 30 (AP)—The district attorney's office today investigated a Dominican revolutionary's charges that a missing critic of the Dominican government was thrown alive into the boiler furnace of a ship in New York harbor.

The missing man, Dr. Juan de los Rios, vanished March 12. He had just completed a book which was widely expected to be a scathing critique of the Dominican Republic and charges the Dominican Republic had committed a "crime against humanity" in the assassination of a Dominican revolutionary leader in exile here, told New York authorities yesterday.

It was reported that Rios had been aboard the freighter Pandamonium, owned by the Dominican government.

Bernard Alvin, with aid members of the ship's crew and scores in the Trullio government who are collaborating with the New York state said that the ship had been burned alive.

The district attorney's office also investigated the books and it has subpoenaed the books and Cuba Mail Steamship company, agents for the Dominican line. Authorities said they intended to question members of the Pandamonium's crew when it docks in New York again.

It was reported the ship had been changed since the crew left last March 27.

Rios, who said that he had received threatening telephone calls, charged that Generalissimo Trullio ordered the execution of two others before the New York and two others in Havana.

Another Dominican ship, the Antigua also in the New York port, shortly after Rios disappeared. It was later returned to the port because of mechanical trouble.

Gallender, 42, was a Spanish-Desque painter at Columbia and wrote the anti-Trullio book. The book has not been published in the United States because of legal questions raised by his disappearance but is about to be published in Santiago, Chile.

### Latest Naval Skylander Is Fast, Deadly

WASHINGTON, May 30 (AP)—The navy announced today its new Douglas F4D Skylander exceeded 500 miles an hour, the speed of sound, on its first test flight on April 21.

It said the flight was made at the Edwards air force base, Calif., with test pilot Robert O. Rain at the controls. Rain holds a navy record of 733 miles an hour for its F4D Skylander, a somewhat smaller predecessor of the Skylander.

The Skylander, new all-weather carrier-based jet, features thin, bat-shaped wings and a slender fuselage. It is designed for steep climb and rapid altitude climb to intercept and destroy the swiftest enemy aircraft.

The navy said the Skylander's speed, range, and performance make it a multi-purpose plane that can be used as a general fighter, all-weather interceptor as well as three-point interceptor.

The plane, it said, can carry the most modern weapons, including guns, rockets, and missiles. It is designed to operate from existing aircraft carriers as well as the new Forrestal class.

LONDON, May 30 (AP)—Parliamentary leaders firmly slammed the door yesterday on any further Socialist attempts to find out what happened to Cmdr. Leslie (Buster) Crabbe, the missing frogman.

Labour member John Dugdale told the house he had tried to ask a question about developments in the case of the frogman whose disappearance April 18 touched off Britain's biggest spy story in years.

Dugdale said he had been informed by leaders in the house of commons that he could not ask the question on the grounds Prime Minister Anthony Eden had already refused to say "one word more" on the subject.

Crabbe died while investigating the underwater structure of the Soviet cruiser that brought Marshal Nikolai Bulganin and Nikita S. Khrushchev to Britain on a state visit.

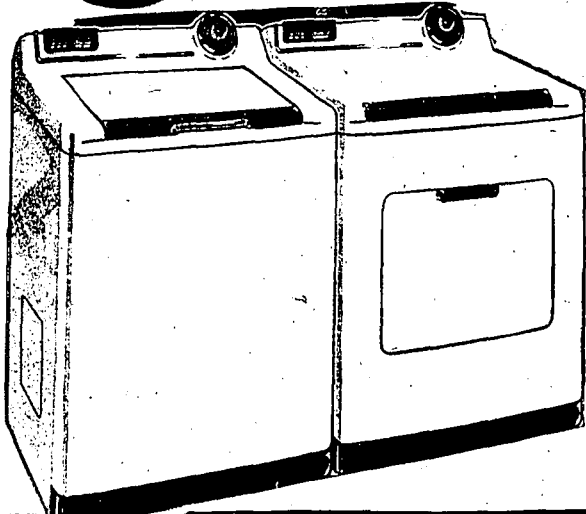

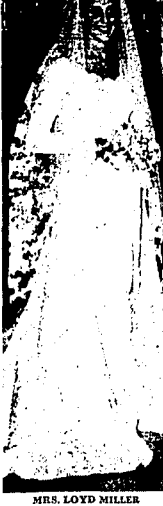

### Auto Exhaust Is Blamed for Cancer Cause

CHICAGO, May 30 (AP)—A group of scientists has added auto exhaust fumes to the list of possible causes of lung cancer.

Dr. W. S. Schur, assistant director of the Armour Research Foundation, said yesterday that over 11 million gallons of auto exhaust fumes are pumped into the air each year. He said that the fumes contain "benzene," a known cause of leukemia, and "nitrobenzene," which may contribute to the incidence of the "lung cancer."

Other scientists have blamed cigarette smoking as partly responsible for the increase of human lung cancer.

### Okay of Loan Is Announced

SEATTLE, May 30 (AP)—Approval of a Pacific Northwest loan, totaling \$50,000, was announced Tuesday by the small business administration.

Robert F. Buck, regional director, said the April 25-day 25 loans were the regional record for a 30-day period.

Twenty of the loans were for small business firms in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Alaska. These were disaster loans, from \$1,000 to \$25,000, for trees, food and side loans.

The 30 small business loans were in financing a new grain storage elevator in Montana, Buck reported.

### Russia Plans Council Meet For Mid July

MOSCOW, May 30 (AP)—Russia yesterday announced the supreme Soviet is to hold a full session starting July 11, the first since the late Josef Stalin's death.

The call for a full session was reported by the news agency Tass. It did not disclose the agenda.

It will be the first session of the year and the 15th of the present parliament.

At the last previous meeting in December, the supreme Soviet approved the state budget for this year and received detailed reports on internal and foreign policy.

Observers speculated that the agenda of the new session would include a report by Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin and Communist Party First Secretary Nikita S. Khrushchev on their trip to Britain in April.

The summons for a July session was not considered unusual. Since Stalin's death, the supreme Soviet has met several times a year.
