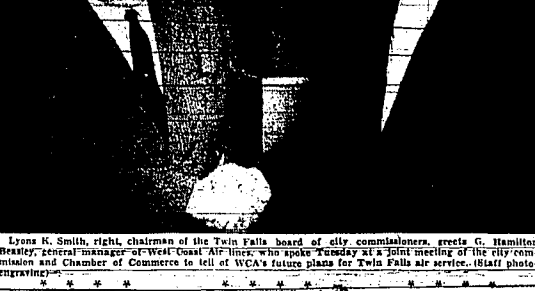

U.S. Changes Its Plans for Labor Talties

WASHINGTON, June 6.—The government is changing its system for computing employment and unemployment figures for the second time in a year. The new system will be in effect from the month of May, 1956, and is expected to be in effect for the next few years.

The earlier system—based on the number of hours worked—resulted in a considerable number of persons being counted as unemployed who were actually working. The new system will be based on a sampling of 2,000 households in all areas, all of which will be included in the new count. The present figures were also based on 2,000 households, but in only 88 areas.

Some experts blame the 1954 jobless figure on the "one-time" effect of the Korean war. The government expects to start publishing the new jobless figures in April. It is expected that the new system will result in a smaller number of unemployed persons than the present figures.

Shops Looted In Rioting in Ceylon Areas

COLOMBO, Ceylon, June 6.—Demonstrators looted shops belonging to Tamil-speaking Ceylonese yesterday in day-long language riots. Fighting first started around Ceylon's house of representatives while lawmakers debated a bill that would make Sinhalese the only official language of the island.

Later mobs shouting "we want Sinhalese only" attacked Tamil speakers at the demonstration. Cars were overturned. Tamils were dragged from buses. Some were thrown into the nearby sea and a lake bordering the house of representatives.

The trouble began when about 250 persons representing Ceylon's Tamil-speaking minority went on a picket strike near the house. They were attacked by Sinhalese-speaking crowds. Two members of parliament leading the picket line were injured.

Free TV Asked

WASHINGTON, June 6.—Five Democratic senators yesterday introduced a bill that would force television stations and networks to make free time available to presidential candidates.

The measure would require networks and stations to give a half-hour's time to each of the major parties' presidential candidates in September and an hour to each candidate in October and November. It also would require a station to make equal time available to opponents of candidates who make paid television appearances.







Hope Is Held For Drugs to Cure Cancers

DETROIT, June 6 (U.P.)—Scientists may find a kind of "penicillin" to control most, if not all, forms of cancer, a British scientist said yesterday.

It would depend upon discovering a common denominator difference between cancerous and healthy cells. The drug would take advantage of the difference.

"It is so important that such a 'penicillin-like' drug might be found, because of the research developments in the last five years, said Dr. Alexander Haddow, famous cancer researcher from the Chester Car Research Institute in London.

Prospects Explained

Dr. Haddow explained the prospects and problems in a new conference at the opening of the third national cancer conference sponsored by the American Cancer Society and National Cancer Institute of the U. S. public health service.

The conference, it being started to inform physicians of the latest findings helpful in diagnosing and treating cancer. It is being attended by about 1,000 scientists and 100 clinicians, including 40 delegates from 24 foreign countries.

Slide lectures on various types of body organs, and some experts consider it a variety of different diseases in its various forms—others think it might have a common cause, from a virus or something else.

One view is there is little hope that any single drug could affect all forms of cancer, or even a mutator, like penicillin kills numerous bacterial diseases.

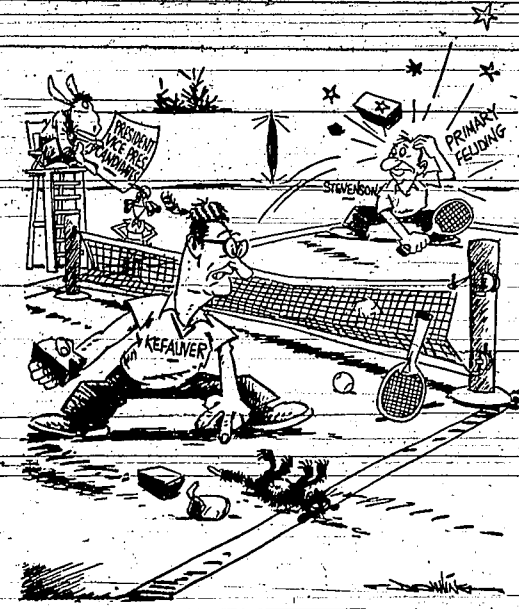
Scientists have discovered differences in the microscopic appearance of various cancerous cells compared with healthy ones. And they have detected many differences in the chemical makeup or chemical properties of cancerous compared with healthy cells.

Class Studied

Speaking in this, Dr. Haddow said the difference common to all cancerous cells "we cannot exclude the possibility of a penicillin-like drug," he said.

"Some animal tumors have been cured, he said, and many different kinds of cancer, and radiation therapy, perhaps they do act through some common denominator effect."

Ruling Given for Bus Segregation

MONTGOMERY, Ala., June 6 (U.P.)—A three-judge panel in federal court ruled yesterday that segregation on city buses in Montgomery violates the federal Constitution.

But the court took no immediate action to issue an injunction against enforcement of city and state segregation laws.

Oily and state officials are expected to appeal direct to the supreme court in what may become the first clear-cut decision by that court on city bus segregation.

The panel, anticipating that, gave opposing lawyers two weeks to submit written suggestions on how the formal anti-segregation order should be entered, and whether a stay should be granted pending an appeal.

Size Reduced

PARIS, June 6 (U.P.)—Daily newspapers in France will reduce the size of their editions this summer because of a shortage of newsprint, the National Press federation said yesterday.

The federation said newsprint will be delivered from northern countries and failure to find other sources of supply on the international market.

16 Points OK'd In Hoover Plan

WASHINGTON, June 6 (U.P.)—The citizens committee for the Hoover report said yesterday the White House has endorsed 16 Hoover commission proposals for streamlining the government.

The proposals range from simplification of paper-work to establishment of a national medical library.

Ancient Town Called 'Semira' Found in Ruin

DAMASCUS, Syria, June 6 (U.P.)—Syrian archaeologists using clay tablets from Egypt as their guide have discovered a buried Mediterranean seaport at least 3,000 years old, it was announced yesterday.

Selim Abdul Hak, director of the government archaeological department, said it is the ancient port of Semira which lies just south of the city of Latakia, a city of 100,000.

First reports from the excavations (excavated rich treasure of pottery, tablets and other archaeological finds dating from the Phoenician, Assyrian and Greek eras in the second millennium before Christ.

Researchers from many nations have spent years seeking Semira since its existence was first disclosed in pottery tablets unearthed in Egyptian excavations of pottery. Archaeological evidence indicated it had lain buried in coastal sand dunes for about 25 centuries—since the fall of the Greek empire, a few well before the Christian era.

Semira is closely tied into the period of Old Testament history. It had firm commercial relations with ancient Egypt and in those days Egyptian forces often came to the city's aid against hostile tribesmen attacking from the north.

The city was major base for Assyrian and Phoenician trade in the Mediterranean. Silent testimony on the industrial role Semira played in those days was given by the findings in Egypt of tablets that tied to Semira's past.

Abdul Hak said digging was continuing on the site of the city.

Soviet Power Struggle May Be Due Soon

WASHINGTON, June 8 (AP)—A new battle for power which could lead to "any number of terror tactics for which they now denounce Stalin may develop among Russia's leaders, diplomats said yesterday.

Experts said such a struggle within the Kremlin should not be expected despite the current Soviet emphasis on collective leadership and the bitter denunciation of Stalin's one-man rule.

Moscow's atmosphere of suspicion and political intrigue, they said, may have become more intense since Soviet Communist Boss Nikita S. Khrushchev delivered his now-famous condemnation of Stalin last February. Full details of the Khrushchev speech were made public by the state department yesterday. The department obtained a copy of the 56-page, 20,000-word speech from a confidential source.

Question raised: Among other things, the speech again raised the question of whether Stalin died of a natural death March 5, 1953, or was murdered. Speculation that he might have been murdered by the state department yesterday.

When Stalin's death was announced, it was attributed to a "sudden brain hemorrhage." Many experts still believe that a hard-working life, a heart condition and old age was the cause. Khrushchev's disclosure that Stalin had been planning to resign before his death is a fatal blow to those who believe that Stalin had good reason to kill.

Diplomats said there is no reason to believe that the struggle for power which began with Stalin's death has ended. They said that Khrushchev now is riding "the waves" by taking steps to consolidate his power. Inside the Kremlin government and the Communist party.

They noted that of the three men who delivered orations at Stalin's funeral, one is dead and two downgraded. Malenkov has lost his foreign minister job. Georgi Malenkov, who succeeded Stalin for a short while, lost that job.
