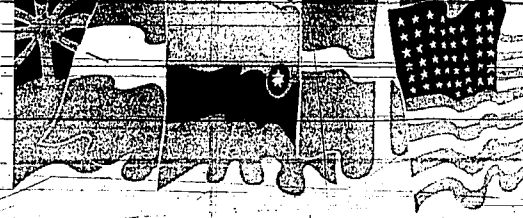

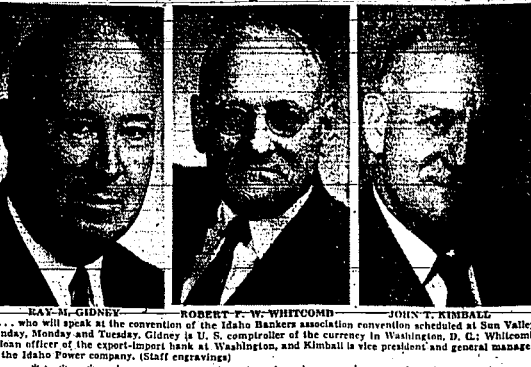

### Soviets Claim 200 Millions In New Count

MOSCOW, June 7.—Soviet Russia reported its population today as 200,000,000—a figure 16 million below the latest western estimate. The figure was printed in the first government statistical yearbook published since the Stalin era. A review of the handbook was printed today in Pravda, the official Communist party organ.

Western observers said the new official estimate might indicate that Russia's World War II losses were much heavier than the estimated 20 million reported previously.

In 1949 Russia estimated its population at 194,400,000. On Dec. 31, 1954, the United Nations economic commission for Europe put the figure at 210,000,000. Western observers here were at a loss to explain the difference, especially in view of the 1949 estimate. They suggested that war losses might have been even greater than the figure of 20 million now given.

There were 1,254,000,000 cases of soft drinks sold in the United States in 1955.

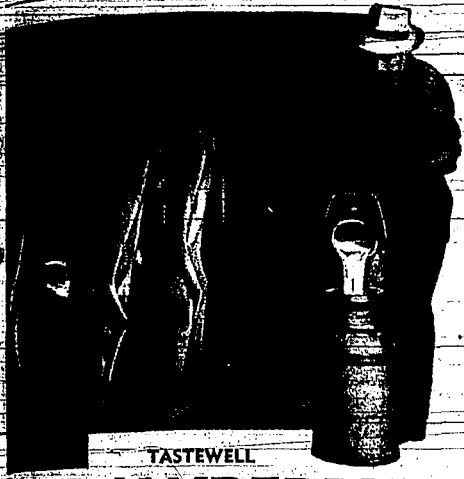

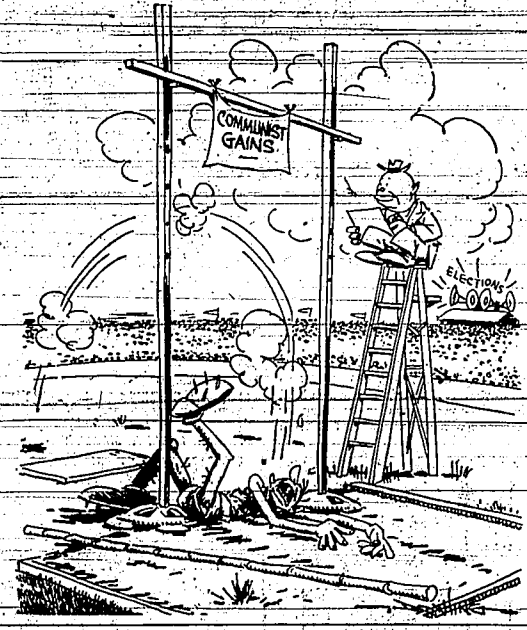

NEW YORK, June 7.—Within the next decade you may be living in a home made almost completely of plastic. That is the prediction of a study made by the president of the American Chemical company, who says such a home will be made to keep clean and cheaper to maintain.

Features listed:

- The home will feature such things as:
- Large molded plastic units built to fit into walls, and floors of similar composition.
- Waterproof and lightweight painted or enameled plastic in a variety of colors and degrees of transparency.
- Conductive and porous mastic plastic and corrosion-resistant plastic and integrally formed into all the floor and wall sections.
- Removable partitions and curtains will permit "rental" of desirable furniture.

Model planned

Charles E. Kline, general manager of Monomer's chemical division, says his plastic home—later this month, at the plastic exposition in New York, will be in concept, he says, "the home of tomorrow" will utilize plastic structural and engineering techniques in a way possible only with plastics.

Each of the design is a molded plastic which is bent to form ceiling, wall and floor and which may be easily removed or altered. They come to meet a family's changing needs.

Police investigation of the ship's cabin room revealed that the blast of flame and heat would burn anyone close by to a crisp. Any one of the three boilers were open and they were steam rising.

"I want to repeat again," Sifra said on orders of Dictator Fulgencio Batista, "that on the order of Dictator Batista, the body of Arce was thrown into the furnace of a boiler of the Dominican steamship, 'Fundacion' and being used to a crisp to remove any trace of this revolution critical of the regime.

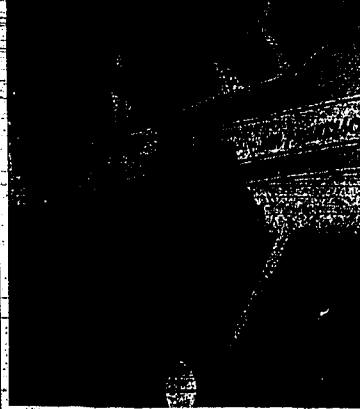

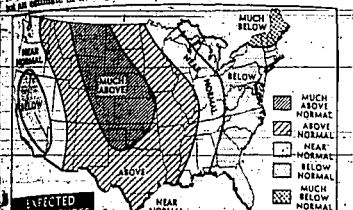

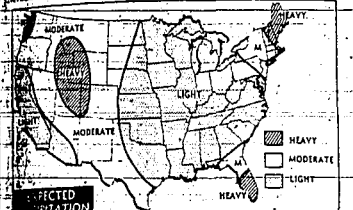

### Coast Voting Lead of Adlai Is Increasing

**SAN FRANCISCO, June 7 (AP)—**Adlai Stevenson's lead over Dwight D. Eisenhower mounted to more than 400,000 today, nearly complete returns from the California primary election showed.

As a result, Stevenson declared his California victory "virtually assured" and the Democratic nomination for President. He added his belief that Gov. Averell Harriman of New York now appears to be his strongest rival for the nomination.

Returns from 21,728 of 51,145 precincts gave Stevenson 1,612,725 votes to 527,770 for Kefauver. President Eisenhower, unopposed on the Republican ballot, had 1,175,445 ballot.

He feels more confident than ever of winning the nomination, Stevenson declared in Los Angeles.

Asked if he was accessible to having former President Truman as his running mate, Stevenson replied:

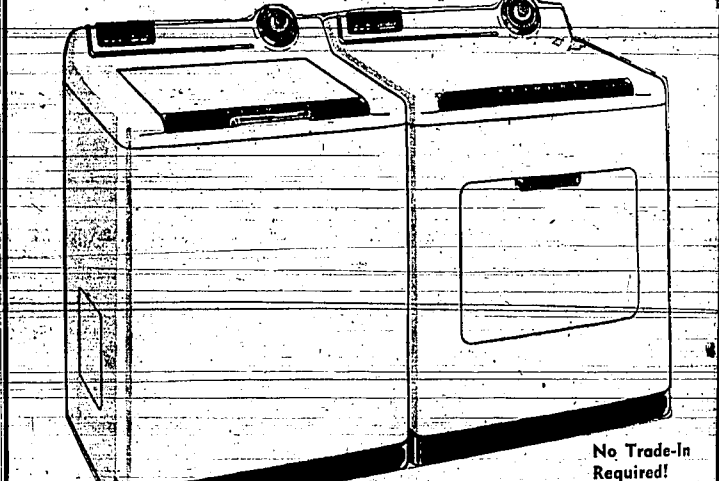

### People Receive Vaccine From Own Cancers for Experiment

BRISTOL, June 7.—About 30 cancer-stricken humans have been given vaccines made from their own cancers, a Boston physician disclosed today.

It is too early to tell whether they benefited. But there was signs they did, and good experimental reasons to think the vaccines can help.

Each vaccine was prepared from bits of each person's own cancer, and then injected under the skin of that same person. The aim was to increase natural resistance to advanced cancer.

It could work by forming antibodies against the cancer, and by increasing the number of healthy defensive cells that resist the spread of cancer.

X-rays to kill cancer cells are often used, but the new experimental work was described to the third national cancer conference by Dr. John B. Orr, a physician, and his wife, a cytologist or expert on cells. Both are from Vincent Memorial hospital in Boston.

Mrs. Graham has found an apparent reason for the tragic difference often noted in how well women respond to X-ray treatments of cancer of the cervix, the neck of the womb.

She finds the results best if the women, before treatment, already have high amounts of one of both of two types of healthy cells found near the cancerous cells. If they have high amounts of both, 80 per cent of women are still living five years after X-ray treatment. If they have low amounts only 10 per cent survive.

There is evidence so far that one patient developed specific anti-bodies against her own cancer, the Orrs said. It is too early to say whether they had an improvement in the response of healthy cells and a bigger killing effect upon the cancer cells from X-rays.

### Aid Eyed for Sore Spots of Tense Egypt

CAIRO, June 7.—All signs pointed today to an eventual improvement in Anglo-Egyptian relations, currently one of the sorest spots in the turbulent Middle East.

Premier Gamal Abdel Nasser is expected to dwell on relations with Britain in a special speech he will deliver on June 10. By that date, the last British soldier will have left Egyptian soil.

Nasser currently is strengthening his ties with the Communist bloc in his role as neutral in the global political arena. He has accepted an invitation to visit Red China and has scheduled a meeting with President Tito of Yugoslavia in Belgrade after Tito returns from the "brotherly" friendship tour of Russia.

Observers said Nasser also appears to be moving in the direction of the West to shore up sagging relations.

Feeling between Egypt and Britain has been at low ebb for some time. Many Egyptian and British newspapers have been launching bitter attacks on Britannia and politics in each other's country.

But since British ambassador Sir Humphrey Trevelyan met Nasser on May 26, there have been many reports regarding the prospects of settling the situation.

Here in Cairo, there are signs that certain circles close to the premier want to bury the hatchet with Britain. But it seems doubtful whether the vast propaganda machine which exists in Cairo can change its anti-British approach overnight.

### As Reason for Most Cancers

ANN ARBOR, June 7.—A Nobel prize scientist has said he thinks cancer virus cause most of all cancers, including human.

The evidence is all logical, and it is increasing, said Dr. Wendell M. Stanley, University of California.

It is a wholly new attack on cancer from this theory. It is said to vaccines to prevent cancer, and new ways to cure it.

It is possible that all of us are being attacked with "cancer-causing" viruses, Dr. Stanley said. We don't even "catch" non-infectious viruses from other healthy cells. But he stressed that you don't "catch" cancer itself from other people. Cancer itself is not contagious.

The cancer viruses wouldn't do any harm, until and unless some thing made them become active. Something could be aging, stress in hormones, dietary habits, chemicals, radiation, or other things, a combination of them.

From being a "carrier" of the virus opens the way to new methods to find "methods" of curing cancer, Dr. Stanley told a conference, attended by 1,200 scientists and 23 foreign countries from 25 States and 23 foreign countries.

### Door Opened To Let Soviet Brass in U.S.

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP)—President Eisenhower has opened the way to a series of high-level visits between U. S. and Soviet officials if the Russians want them.

Indications are the Soviet bosses would like nothing better. The result could be eventual visits to the United States by Marshal General K. Zhukov, Premier Bulganin and Communist Party boss Nikita Khrushchev.

Mr. Eisenhower gave the green light to such exchanges when he told his news conference yesterday that he would extend invitations to Soviet officials "on a completely reciprocal basis."

That apparently means the United States will be ready soon to invite to this country the Russian counterpart of air force chief of staff Marshal V. D. Sokolovsky, chief of the Soviet chiefs of state, who issued the invitation to Twining. However, the United States appeared to be waiting for the outcome of Twining's trip to see exactly what kind of a visit should be planned for the Soviet leader.

The President said he knew when he agreed to Twining's acceptance of the Russian invitation that he would expect to reciprocate.

"I will do exactly that," he said. Mr. Eisenhower added that he would extend "the same courtesies, on the same conditions and confined in the same way."

Asked if Zhukov, Russia's defense minister and an old wartime friend of the President's would be invited to the United States, Mr. Eisenhower repeated that the United States will not "on a completely reciprocal basis."

"If our defense secretary were asked," he said, "I would ask their defense secretary and the same kind of visit would be arranged for them as would be arranged for our people."

So far, the Soviets have made no Russian military leaders to visit the United States or that they want other U. S. military brass coming to Russia and they have limited broadly in public statements that they would like the United States to invite Marshal Bulganin and Khrushchev to the United States.

The United States has steered clear of getting into such exchanges in the past for fear of giving the rest of the world a false sense of security when Soviet-East-West issues still remain unsolved. But apparently this U. S. position is being modified.
