Mike Noted in Survival Rate From Cancer

June 8 (AP)—One-third of cancer patients now are surviving each year. A while ago it was only one in four.

Heartening news of more and longer lives was announced by Dr. E. Cuyler Hamman, director of statistical research at the American Cancer Society, at the close of the 11th national cancer conference sponsored by the ACS and National Cancer Institute.

Some 20,000 more patients each year passing the survival point, Dr. Hamman said. Five-year survivors after cancer sometimes means other patients are still quite young.

Others are faring better than in this improved outlook. In 1948 it should be possible to expect survival after 20 to 30 per cent even without "discovery" of new methods of treatment.

Dr. Hamman said the rate has been rising since 1948.

Some of the gains include: stomach, lung, esophagus, ovary and testis.

Dr. Hamman said the gains had been accomplished mainly by better medical care, little improvement in diagnosis and earlier diagnosis.

Can Be Aided

He said the survival rate could be improved still further by learning what is really the best treatment for each type of cancer, by generalizing medical care, and by emphasizing methods of prevention.

Dr. Hamman said research already under way is laid in line to point to new drugs, vitamins or other methods of cancer.

Vertically Flying Plane Announced

SAN DIEGO, Calif., June 8 (AP)—The Ryan Aeronautical company announced yesterday that it will build a conventional appearing airplane that will rise vertically, fly horizontally and land vertically.

The announcement was made when the craft to be built for the army as a liaison plane, will rise by diverting the slipstream by a full 90-degree angle. This is done with double retractable wing flaps that extend far below and to the rear of the wing's normal trailing edge.

With the "flaps" extended, the thrust of the two propellers powered with a gasoline turbine engine will push the airplane straight up, the announcement said.

By retracting the flaps, the company said, the plane, known as the "VertiJet," can change from vertical to horizontal flight as a conventional airplane.

Mrs. Biddle was the former wife of wealthy Philadelphia, Anthony J. Biddle, a steel and engineering magnate. She was born April 7, 1896, near the site of her father's mining camp at Helena, Mont.

Biddle was U. S. ambassador to Norway and Poland before World War II and Mrs. Biddle accompanied him on his tour of duty.

Closed Season Is Sought for 'Fossil' Fishes

LONDON, June 8 (AP)—A British scientist says the collection of "fossil" fish (all once thought to be long extinct) may really disappear soon.

The first specimen of the ugly fish, whose specimens looked much the same millions of years ago, was caught in 1952 in the Comoros islands off Madagascar.

J. L. B. Smith, professor of ichthyology at Oxford university in South Africa, said the French have obtained a total of 10 specimens in the past three years "more than enough for full scientific investigation." He declared in a letter to the Times a permanent closed season should now be imposed.

"Believe me and the world," said Smith, "are no longer crying for dead coelacanths."

"If a herd of dinosaurs were discovered in some remote jungle, the world would rightly recoil in horror from a policy of retaining animals to slaughter as many as possible."

The situation of the Comoran coelacanths is in reality no better, and the present policy is deserving a once important scientific question: the level of scientific progress of one of our most primitive heritages in biology.

The professor said the entire coelacanth population may consist of "only a few hundred." Instead of rewarding natives for catching and delivering specimens, he added, the French, who own the Comoros, should immediately declare a severe punishment for killing one.

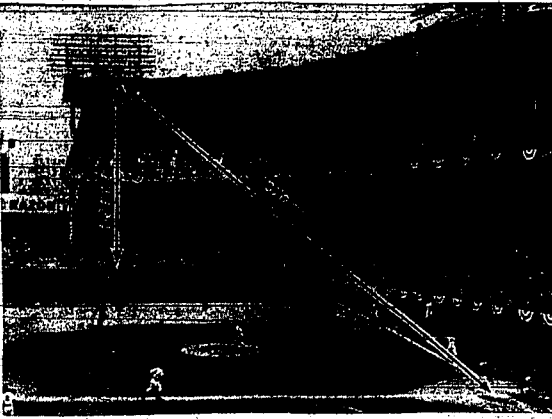

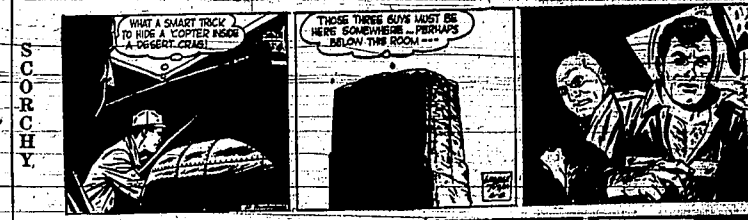

Russians Aid Egypt to Woe Libya Nation

TRIPOLI, Libya, June 8—Western observers here say the Soviet Union is helping Egypt woe strategic Libya from its Western military alliances. They said that this two combination may in the long run lead Premier Mustafa Kemal Ataturk or a future government to cast Britain and U. S. forces from Libya and hold on to alliances with the West.

This would eliminate a westerner hold in the Arab world close to Russia's exposed underbelly.

The Libyan government currently follows a different foreign policy, trying to maintain a necessary friendship with Egypt and at the same time hold on to alliances with the West.

Libya needs western money to pay for the military bases and in return receive aid to balance its growing budget and finance development plans.

At the same time the young kingdom cannot afford to alienate Egypt, which on Western observers described as "Libya's inescapable big brother."

Even So Far

The struggle is about even so far despite tremendous Egyptian influence in Libya, particularly in the educational and judicial systems.

But the Russians now are in the picture.

The Russo-Libyan agreement to establish diplomatic relations was signed in Cairo.

Western diplomats said Egypt strongly urged Libya to accept Russia's recent aid offer. Libya turned it down when the United States boosted its grant by 12 million dollars over the next two years.

Egyptian propaganda is telling the Libyans that the Soviets are pro-Arab and helping only in helping them.
