LONDON, June 11—(AP)—Communist Party boss Winston S. Churchill today said that the United States is the richest country in the world but tomorrow we shall be richer, Moscow radio reported today.

Moscow radio quoted excerpts of the communist leaders' speech in a meeting where he and other foreign leaders received a thunderous welcome with Marshal Tito of Yugoslavia.

"The speech was made at the site of the city's hydroelectric station to a group of workers."
"Abroad there are still people who think—and some of them are say—that things in the USSR will develop so that it will be possible to replace Soviet power by capitalism," Churchill said. "Can this happen, comrades?"
Moscow radio said there were about 100, they are far too weak to be feared where he and other foreign leaders run their own countries."
"We tell them 'You can whine for it, but you can't win it.'"
There was laughter and applause as he said how naive people in the United States are, he said. "The capitalists only want the workers and peasants to have their freedom and the land, when the workers and peasants want their freedom, the capitalists and their lackeys did not like it."
"It will never happen, but we shall follow our road—the great Leninist road."
There were shouts of "hear, hear!" Churchill promised that Russia would become the world's richest nation by building hydroelectric stations and atomic power stations.

WASHINGTON, June 11—President Eisenhower's hurry-off dash to Walter Reed hospital and the emergency surgery he had in the small hours haven't changed things much, after the political situation is about the same, Republican-wise. Not so among the Democrats.
Mr. Eisenhower remains the Republican choice for president in the coming election, an active candidate, Mr. Eisenhower said today. He will be back on the job in a fortnight or so, fit to campaign and to continue in office.
—Vice President Richard M. Nixon is the party organization's choice for No. 2 place and he's ready to run. But, for a time there, before returning in on the President's victory, Republicans could have spoken truly the immortal words of some John Birch "we was shook." They were shaken badly when in the prospect of a love-feast convention and the renunciation of the President were clouded by what the President called a bellyache.

The Republicans are whistling blain, sure, despite certainty that the Democratic campaign will hit all the harder, the argument that Mr. Eisenhower's health does not warrant a second term. They will hit hard, too, at the position in which Nixon would find himself in the first full week of June fit into their proper perspective, however, it seems quite likelier that the President, news of Mr. Eisenhower's close brush with death will take second place to events among the Democrats.
Adlai E. Stevenson climbed Gene E. Keifer's a stunning blow in last Tuesday's California presidential primary. A great many sound political observers definitely count Keifer's win today. Their question is: What will take off? A likely answer would be that the senator would gang up with Gov. Averell Harriman in next August's Democratic national convention. That could be a tough combination.
Harriman evidently believes the contest between Keifer and Stevenson is over, with the man from Illinois winner by a mile. He told a cheering union list and cap maker over the weekend his hat was in the ring for an active candidate. President David Dubinsky of the 400,000-member International Ladies Garment Workers union previously addressed the same group with an endorsement of Stevenson and a recommendation that Harriman not oppose his nomination.

The governor brushed Dubinsky and pledged himself to the principles of a liberal Democratic party and to the ideals of FDR and Harry S. Truman. He will be the only 100 per cent Roosevelt-Truman man in the Democratic convention contest.
Stevenson now must go after the uncommitted delegates and those loosely tied to so-called favorite sons. He has 37 first ballot delegate votes so far and needs 68 1/2 to win. Stevenson is the front runner, which sometimes is a dangerous spot. But, he has the advantage of a com-
