Dry Storage Eye Bank Is Told at Meet

CHICAGO, June 13 (AP)—A revolutionary new kind of dry storage eye bank is getting ready to be tested by a physician and his assistants.

They are acting the world's acid through borrowed corneas or "wind-down" corneas. But these corneas were first dehydrated and stored very simply for weeks or months.

Present eye banks keep corneas in good shape under refrigeration for only a few days before they are grafted into patients sometimes after a corneal transplant stays until the donor is dead.

Thousands of persons in this country and over the world are blind because their own corneas have been clouded, scarred or damaged by accident. Other thousands appear willing to donate their own corneas after death to help blind people.

The new method takes the water out of the cornea tissue, permitting storage in a dry tube, under vacuum, for months. Corneas presumably could be shipped anywhere needed.

The new technique, still in research stage, was described to the American Medical Association by Dr. John H. Kistler, Jr., associate professor of ophthalmology at Georgetown University Medical Center in Washington, D. C.

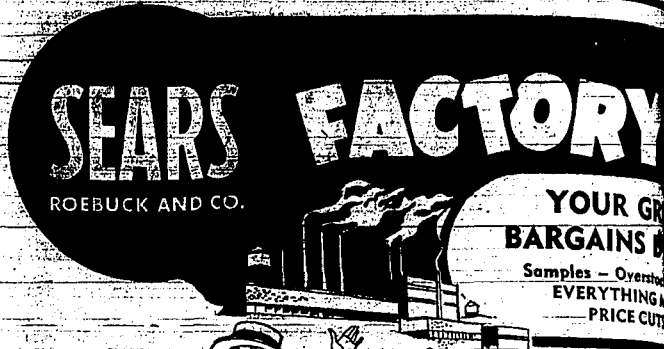

WASHINGTON, June 18—Ben Kefauver said today he still would be the strongest candidate to challenge the Democratic pick despite his defeat in the primary by last week.

Kefauver expressed the belief that his primary campaign rivalry with Stevenson has benefited the party by generating a discussion of more active among Democrats. Now that the primaries are over, he said, the campaign has entered a new phase in which candidates must concentrate on uncommitted delegates and those still to be chosen by state conventions.

Emotional Patterns of Young Males May Lead to Bad Time

NEW YORK, June 18—Today's male adolescents are setting up emotional patterns within themselves which will give them rough old age, according to the chief psychiatrist of the navy, who, because of his job, can be taken as an outstanding authority on male adolescents.

Furthermore, these patterns will give the nation a rough time when today's very young men become old men, continued Dr. (and Captain) George N. Raines in a recent periodical on the subject. He based his remarks on experiences with adolescents who make up the bulk of the navy's forces.

It is a widely accepted theory, among more and more, is becoming widely accepted, indicating a attitude—established in adolescence—individuals the rest of their lives. For that reason, it alarmed Dr. Raines that these is distinctly less of a sense of duty among 18 to 20-year-olds.

The sense of duty is being replaced by the question, "What's in it for me?" he cited the navy's experience with its "and conduct" discipline which is a form of punishment based upon the idea that "each of us has a period of duty that we must admit that he cannot perform the duties required of him, and that a man's conscience punishes more effectively than all the prisons in the world."

The navy's use of this punishment regime is 300-per-cent better than 1940 and 1950 although during the same period the program for rehabilitation offenders has been greatly improved. Dr. Raines added that this type of discipline made up only a "minor part of total naval discipline but nonetheless, this subtle increase in duty, so-called, is indicating a trend."

This increasing group of adolescents "include their problems largely by aggressive-passivity," he said, meaning that they do nothing in an aggressive way. He gave as examples people who sit before television sets and a baseball game, critically demanding that they be entertained, rather than finding means of entertaining themselves.

When aggressively passive persons grow old, "many will sit back aggressively and demand that they be entertained." He saw the addition of disability benefits to social security laws as something that would "cripple bankrupt the country" if aging aggressively passive persons in the population.

"Any inducement to increase the amount of support for those beginning, as disability benefits will do, will be acted upon immediately," he said. "But the emotional processes involved are largely outside the awareness of the individual, this behavior, or most human behavior, will not be regulated by legislation."

Dr. Raines is head of the neuro-psychiatric branch of the navy's bureau of medicine and surgery. He also is professor and head of the department of psychiatry, Georgetown university medical center, Washington.

New Housing Bill Has Okay By Committee

WASHINGTON, June 18 (AP)—The house banking committee yesterday approved an omnibus housing bill providing for 180,000 new public housing units and billions of dollars in credit and insurance to boost new home construction.

The vote was reported unofficially as 348-1 in favor of the bill which works far beyond President Eisenhower's request and seemed certain to set off a fight on the house floor.

Representative Wolcott, R. Mich., the ranking committee Republican and a foe of the federally-assisted public housing program, said the bill's provisions were so disastertous to him he would oppose the measure—whenever.

Housing is on the White House agenda, but the Eisenhower wants passed before congress adjourns.

The house committee voted for 180,000 public housing units a year for a three-year period starting Aug. 1. In addition, it voted for 10,000 units in the course of three years, and public housing specifically designed for elderly persons.

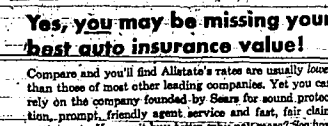

Activity Eyed For Men With Heart Attacks

CHICAGO, June 13 (AP)—At least 100,000 men today that men who have completely recovered from heart attacks should be allowed to return to active duty.

Heart-attack victim Dr. Philip O. Keel said such men should even be allowed to serve as co-pilots.

Keel and Dr. Leon V. McVay, of the air force hospital at Maxwell field, reported that 107 heart-attack patients between 1931 and 1933. They reported their findings today at the 10th annual meeting of the American Medical Association.

Many of the heart attack patients were "highly qualified and motivated" commissioned and non-commissioned officers, the two doctors said.

If they have no subsequent symptoms and if they have normal electrocardiograms and normal activity after recovery, they should not be relieved from duty, the doctors said.

Another paper, Dr. Bernard Brozman, director of cardiovascular research at Menck hospital in Cleveland, said a delicate operation designed to ward off heart attack by improving the heart's blood supply can be considered safe and useful for a majority of coronary disease patients.

Safety Limit is Believed Near For Radiation

WASHINGTON, June 13 (AP)—Science warned the American public today that it is using up about one-third of its atomic radiation safety limit in medical and dental X-rays.

The findings of leading U. S. scientists are reported in a new book, "The Medical Use of Atomic Radiation."

The medical profession was called upon to reduce X-rays to the lowest frequency of use consistent with medical necessity.

Keep Dose Low

"Keep the dose as low as you can," the potential danger is great," the scientists warn.

That advice comes from leading U. S. scientists who participated in a year-long study sponsored by the national academy of sciences of biological effects of atomic radiation.

But their "initial report," published today, recognizes that atomic energy is here to stay. It recognizes that if the world escapes nuclear war, with its threat of possible extinction of the race, it is headed irreversibly into an era of mushrooming atomic power.

So man must learn to live with and control radioactivity of his own making. Balancing the great prospect of benefits against the "known dangers, the scientists came up with some proposals they believe will give humanity the best of both worlds: a new energy source and at the same time survery its hazards and prevent.

As of now medical and dental X-rays are piling up more troubles for generations yet unborn than are either nuclear weapons tests or nuclear power plants. Genetic scientists particularly deplore use of X-rays for fitting shoes and taking pictures of yet-to-be-born children. They said such applications were dangerous and medically indefensible.

Measures suggested

Any "prospective" future of atomic power, with its vast accumulations of radioactive waste, make it urgently necessary for this generation to put control measures into effect now.

Any addition, however small, to the natural background of radiation causes genetic changes which can inflict tragic injury on children born generations hence. This is because man's inheritance mechanism is by far the most susceptible of all his organs to radiation harm.

Russian Millionaires Are Treated Well By Government in Regard to Taxation

MOSCOW, June 13 (AP)—For income tax purposes, millionaires are better off in proletarian Russia than in the capitalist United States.

Corporation presidents and Wall Street financiers who are treated with sympathy and understanding by the Soviet government, officials like the U. S. treasury department, is responsible for collecting taxes.

First of all, the Russian tax rates in Russia. For a Russian to make the equivalent of, say, Harlow Curtis, president of General Motors, still would leave him outside the millionaire category. His income after taxes would be about \$625,000 at the official exchange rate of four rubles to the dollar.

(General Motors last year paid Curtis \$201,400 salary plus \$75,000 bonus which he will receive in five annual installments. GM estimated that after taxes, Curtis was able to keep \$121,528 out of the total of \$779,400.)

Probably no Soviet citizen receives much more money than the chief executive officer of a large corporation. But virtually the same system is used in Russia as in the United States to collect taxes.

A Soviet worker's tax is deducted monthly from his pay at his place of employment. The big difference is that in the Russian pay as you go system, there is no steeply graduated levy as salaries get larger.

The maximum tax is 13 per cent on incomes above 1,000 rubles (\$250) per month. Taxes start on salaries of 181 rubles per month, on which

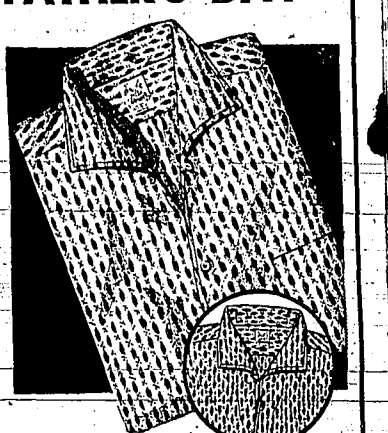

Dr. H. H. Shillip is getting off to a fast start as Boris Ruzin's new foreign minister. Less than two weeks after his appointment, Shillip has lined himself up on an important diplomatic tour. It is one on which he may be able to do the Kremlin a lot of good and the United States, Great Britain and France a lot of harm.

Shillip is going to Egypt, then on to Syria, Lebanon and Greece.

This will give him the opportunity to meddle in several situations which closely concern the big three western allies.

The situations include the Baghdad defense pact, which Egypt and most of the other Arab countries oppose, the Palestine dispute between the Arabs and Jews, the revolt against France in Algeria and the Cyprus dispute between Britain and Greece.

In Cairo, Shillip will join in the whooping-and-hollering celebration by Egyptians of the final evacuation of British troops from the Suez canal zone.

He also will be able to talk, openly or secretly, to the Arab leaders who from their Cairo headquarters are directing the revolt against France in Algeria and fomenting new revolts in Tunisia and Morocco. He will be able to talk with Egyptian Premier Gamal Abdel Nasser, the supply of arms by the communist countries to Egypt, and possibly to Saudi Arabia, for use against Israel.

In Syria and Lebanon, Shillip is expected to concentrate on Palestine.

In Greece, Shillip's job will be to try to restore good Russian relations with that country and to do as much harm as possible to Britain in view of Greek anger over Britain's refusal to give up Cyprus.

Power Fails, Death Claims Polio Patient

CHICAGO, June 13 (AP)—An arctic power failure tonight left a polio patient for death yesterday. The chest respirator which kept the breathing went dead and he died with it.

Friends and neighbors worked frantically to save Marcel Bucher, a 35-year-old ex-professional wrestler, pronounced dead last night as he was pronounced dead last night an hour after the power went out.

Bucher, a bulbar polio victim, had been in the neck down since he was only one of 125,000 Chicago and suburban residents whose electricity was cut off by a 207-minute power outage.

For most of the 125,000, the power breakdown meant they had to unplug their air conditioning units, heat pumps, fans or air conditioners. For Bucher it meant death.

Bucher's wife, Jeanine, 35, said she heard "the power went off twice before, but he never seemed to suffer from it."

The family wife tried to call the Commonwealth Edison company for help. But the line was busy. Company officials said they were flooded at the time with calls from complaining customers.

The next day help went to the hospital department. An inhalator was used over Bucher for half an hour. Then he was pronounced dead.

The power failure was felt through the city and six suburbs in Waukegan, north of Chicago, as many people picked up their telephones to find them dead. Telephone company officials explained that their system was not able to handle a situation in which nearly all subscribers use their telephones at once.

The sheer 25-foot wall of earth slipped with little warning, sending a whirling sound as the children tumbled at its base. They were buried under three feet of sand.

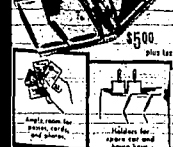

Maybe so, but I doubt it. You can't run a railroad or any other business without a boss—and I suspect the same thing is true of a family.

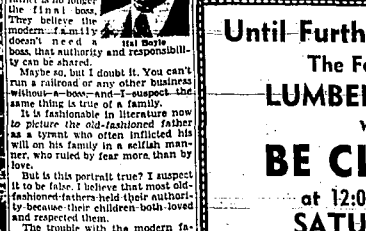
It is fashionable in literature now to picture the old-fashioned father as a tyrant who often inflicted his will on his family in a selfish manner, who ruled by fear more than by love.
