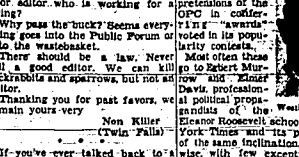

### Emergency Is Declared for Toll in Traffic

SANTA FE, N. M., June 14 (AP)—John Simms declared a state of emergency yesterday and prepared to order the national guard to patrol highways in an attempt to prevent New Mexico's Transcaspian death toll.

Simms declared the emergency only a few hours after a traffic jam on the state's 1970 traffic fatality toll. Only 124 persons had been killed by this time a year ago.

Last week-end, 18 persons were killed in traffic mishaps in this state where total fatalities amounts to approximately 550,000.

Simms said he would order out 250 New Mexico guardsmen each week-end and holiday, beginning Friday, and the peak summer tourists traffic in the state. He said 50 radio-controlled guard units would be pressed into service in addition to the usual state police units.

New Mexico will establish 18 road blocks at the highway entry points to the state to drive safely and explain the seriousness of the situation.

The governor pointed out that a traffic jam in Santa Fe which killed one child resulted in immediate action by the people, but that the people seem less conscious of the dangers of carelessness on the highway.

The latest victim of New Mexico traffic was William Sanders, 42, San Antonio, Tex. He was a passenger in a truck driven by Cecil Davis, San Antonio, which was involved in a two-car pileup near Lordsburg Tuesday night during a blind dust storm.

Davis was not injured.

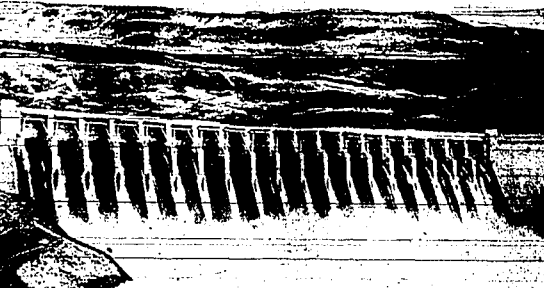

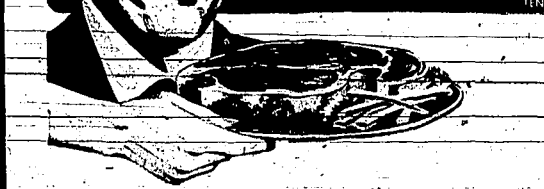

### Female Seals Locate Mate By His Smell

NEW YORK, June 14 (AP)—An obscure scientist in an obscure place made the observation that among seals is the mate who gives with the perfume and it is the female who is lured thereby.

Presumably here, mind you. Furthermore, the female knows her man among a million by his characteristic perfume, can pick up the bouquet of scents for considerable distances, and is guided by it to his loving side.

This observation by J. E. Hamilton, a scientist stationed in the Falkland islands in the south Atlantic of Argentina, promises to clear up the age-old mystery of how the females of fur seals and the southern sea lions unaidedly find their true mates.

The depth of the mystery is in the fact that males always arrive on the shores of south Atlantic islands, which are the breeding grounds of seals, at least a month in advance of females.

They wallow ashore, take up territories from which they exclude all other males by fierce battles if necessary—and soon the beach is alive with them, each one in his allotted space.

When the females start arriving, (all heavy with child as the result of the previous breeding season) and wading up onto the crowded beach, you'd think confusion and carnage would reign. But there is no confusion nor carnage at all.

Each female finds her mate. Quickly each male is surrounded by his harem. That is what always happens, year after year. The question is, how in the world do the seals and sea lions manage it?

Hamilton came to the scientific, conservative conclusion that the "pleasant perfume" of the males is of vital value to the species as a direction indicator. The male's life example indicates the distance at which the odor could be observed by the animal—its range may be greater than we think.

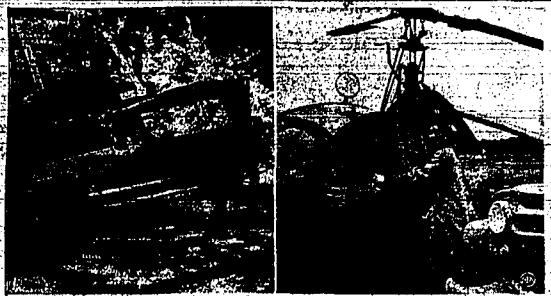

**Truman Noted As Main Block For Stevenson**

WASHINGTON, June 14 (AP)—One of the shrewdest politicians in the senate appraised the Democratic political situation today and observed: "Adlai Stevenson's biggest hurdle now is Truman."

The speaker was a southern Democrat who has not endorsed Stevenson, would prefer Sen. Lyndon Johnson of Texas for the presidential nomination but would be dismayed if it went to Sen. Estes Kefauver or Gov. Averell Harriman.

In one sentence, he gave a capsule summary of what many Democrats are thinking two months before their nominating convention convenes at Chicago Aug. 15.

By crushing Kefauver in the California primary last week, Stevenson moved far out in front in the race for the presidential nomination. But he is still far from sure of victory.

Former President Truman, now touring Europe, claimed credit for throwing the 1952 nomination to the reluctant Stevenson, then governor of Illinois. Now publicly neutral, he is regarded as a Harriman supporter who may throw his weight behind the New York governor at convention time.

Few Democrats doubt that Mr. Truman, who is considered cool toward Stevenson, is making a great deal of money. If he wishes, he is viewed by many Democrats as a possible draftee for the nomination in case of a convention deadlock.

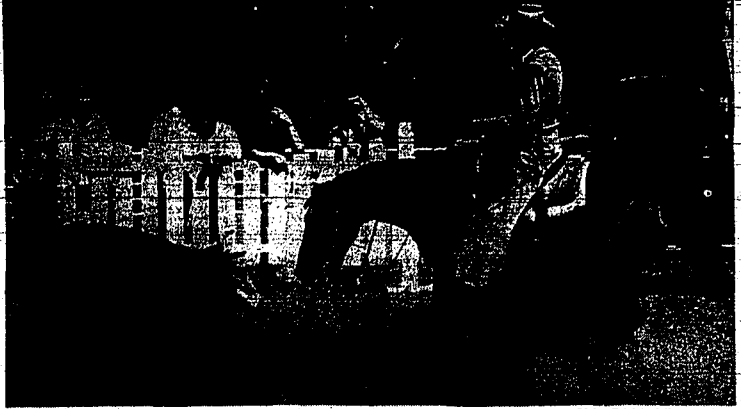

### Veterans Advised No Time Limit on Disability Claims

There is no time limit to file for service-connected disability compensation, reports Arnold Heuring, chief veterans administrator. Veterans may apply at any time during their lives, he said.

"The compensation is paid monthly at a rate of 10 per cent of the wartime rate. If the disability was incurred during extra-duty service, the wartime payment is allowed, Heuring added.

In addition, payments may be made retroactively for one of three different dates.

"If the veteran files his claim within a year from the date of discharge and the VA finds the disability was sufficiently severe at that time, payments may be made from the day of discharge.

Should the veteran file the claim within a year after his discharge, but the disability is not severe enough to be compensable, compensation may be made from the
