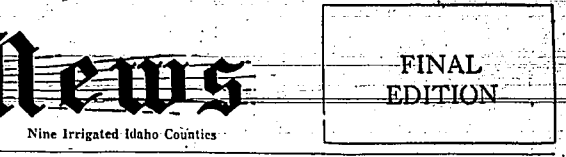

"When we first got to Spain, we tried manfully and bravely to use what little Spanish we knew, but we were not understood. We tried to lip, because they speak Castellano and a lip is a very definite part of the accent."

Water Wastes Claim Told in States Fight

FRANCISCO, June 15 (AP)—The state of Arizona is claiming billions of gallons of water into the Salton River to satisfy a gigantic rate of Colorado River water. Arizona's chief engineer, Arthur H. Hays, said today that the state's arguments against the Colorado River Compact are being heard before the U. S. supreme court regarding the right to water. The court is expected to decide the case in the next few months. Arizona claims it is entitled to 5,500,000 acre feet of water, while California claims it is entitled to 4,500,000 acre feet. The Colorado River Compact of 1922, which divides the water among seven states and Mexico, is being challenged by Arizona. The state argues that the compact is unconstitutional and that it has a right to the water. The case is expected to be a landmark decision in the history of water rights in the West.

Water Wastes Claim Told in States Fight

FRANCISCO, June 15 (AP)—The state of Arizona is claiming billions of gallons of water into the Salton River to satisfy a gigantic rate of Colorado River water. Arizona's chief engineer, Arthur H. Hays, said today that the state's arguments against the Colorado River Compact are being heard before the U. S. supreme court regarding the right to water. The court is expected to decide the case in the next few months. Arizona claims it is entitled to 5,500,000 acre feet of water, while California claims it is entitled to 4,500,000 acre feet. The Colorado River Compact of 1922, which divides the water among seven states and Mexico, is being challenged by Arizona. The state argues that the compact is unconstitutional and that it has a right to the water. The case is expected to be a landmark decision in the history of water rights in the West.
