Honors Given To Truman by Famed School

OXFORD, England, June 21 (AP)—Oxford University presented its highest graduate honor yesterday to Harry S. Truman over the objections of a human professor who protested a decision to drop the atomic bomb from World War II.

Dr. Fred H. C. Crayke, wearing the scarlet robe of an Oxford scholar and a white "doctor's hat," became an Oxford doctor of civil laws in the century-old pomp of an Oxford ceremony.

The presentation completed Oxford's "thank you" for U. S. forces who won the war. It already had given the same honorary degree to Sir Truman's secretary of state, Dean Marshall (1947) and Dean Nelson (1952).

Marshall and Nelson were nominated for the honor without opposition. But Gladys Elizabeth Anderson, a philosophy professor at the college of women's colleges, opposed awarding the honor to the former President.

Protests "If you do give this honor," she protested at a faculty meeting, "what does it mean? Stalin, what Hitler, or what Stalin will not be known as the dictator."

It was the first time in the history of Oxford officials that a protest had been raised against the granting of an honorary degree. But she was overruled after a lively vote and today Mr. Truman got his degree.

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—Managers of the three Democratic presidential candidates are campaigning for each other as they begin to campaign about how the GOP next fall.

NEW YORK (NEA)—The American family car is more than just a means of transportation. It's gotten to be a storage room, bank, closet and a handy place to breed young mice.

This is the verdict among the men who install seat covers. One nationwide chain of seat cover stores polled 146 outlets to see what objects its installers had fished out from under and behind seats. And they found enough junk to stock a medium-size museum.

Among the memorabilia forgotten by auto owners were a 3400 German camera, 40 Belgian gold pieces, a flock of insurance policies, a zipper, a framed, old painting, and one set of false teeth.

Far and away the largest single category was money. Virtually every car has some hang-on legal tender hidden under the back seat. The seat cover boys have uncovered everything from a penny to a hundred dollar bill, and the driver of the latter car made a goodly profit from his "new covers."

One dealer in Syracuse unearthed



likely-to-be-lost hat is jewelry. Diamond rings, wedding bands, bracelets and watches turn up by the dozens. Sometimes, an item has been lost as long as five years and frequently insurance had already been collected.

REIDELBERG, Germany, June 21 (AP)—The midnight curfew of early occupation days was back in force for 10,000 soldiers in Heidelberg today because city officials complained about the conduct of American troops.

The order followed a emergency conference between Lieut. Gen. Harry W. Harkness, ninth infantry division commander, and Heidelberg Mayor Paul Meyer.

Meyer earlier had refused an army ultimatum because "the ultimatum would not be understood if I accepted it after the incidents here."

An army spokesman said no punishment was planned for any of the soldiers. In fact, an official spokesman would not admit there even was any incident.

He said only that the curfew was imposed "in order that closer supervision of the off-duty activities of the soldiers could be exercised."

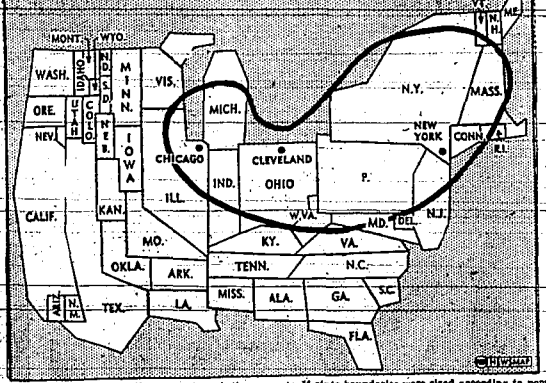

New Russian Policy of Criticism May Lead Into Splits, Troubles and Breaks

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—World communists will now follow a line outlined in Stalin's day. They will criticize one another without causing splits or damage. This was clearly explained—but in communist double talk—by the American Communist party leader in its central committee two months ago. That was two months after Khrushchev made his speech. "That same self-criticism is the new line for Communist parties everywhere," he said plain yesterday in a declaration signed in Moscow by Khrushchev and Marshal Tito of Yugoslavia. "We must cooperate," he said. "The two sides have agreed that the forcible cooperation should be based on complete freedom of will and equality, on friendly criticism and on comradeship character of exchange of views on disputes between their parties."

Given some years in the practice of criticism, it is possible that Communist parties will develop normal antagonisms and break off into areas and factions. But what happens when all this self-criticism is done by the Communist Party in its own country? Stalin had maintained control of Communist parties everywhere until they were "lost" in 1955. Two years later, when the Red prevented it—so it may have been—the Kremlin was to make Russia want them not to bolt.

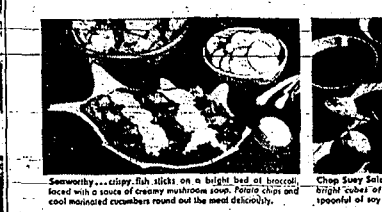

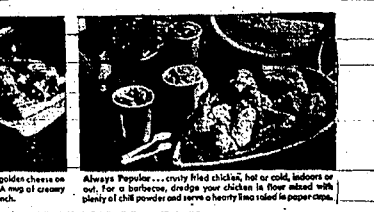

### Old Freedom Respected in Church Unity

OMAHA, Neb., June 21 (AP)—Congregational Christians were assured today that their traditional "freedom of faith and manner of worship" would be respected in a proposed historic merger with another group.

An executive committee, headed by the Rev. Dr. Raymond Walker, of the First Congregational Church, declared that the relationship of individual congregations to the new United Church of Christ will hinge on their "voluntary and free assent."

The policy statement, designed to clarify controversial aspects of the projected merger with the Evangelical and Reformed church, was adopted at the biennial meeting of the Congregational "Day of Prayer" which closed today.

The committee sought to assure church members that the merger would not mean a loss of their separate origins and organizational customs—the first such union in American history since a gap in the multiple families of Protestantism.

Dr. Albert B. Cline, Boston moderator of the Congregational Christian churches, told the meeting that the vitality of the church has always derived from its ability to progress and adapt to new needs.

He urged the church to change without losing our faith or our freedom," he said.

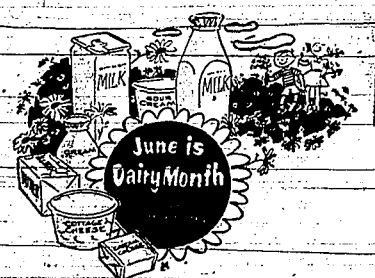

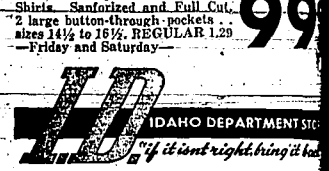

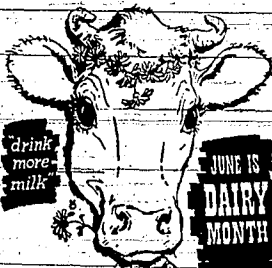

CHICAGO, June 21—With the nation facing record traffic deaths this year, two leading traffic safety organizations today called for a crack-down enforcement policy during the Fourth of July holiday. The National Safety Council and the International Association of Chiefs of Police said that appeals to driver responsibility must be supplemented by strict enforcement of the law to curb the heedless and reckless minority. Such action is the only effective way to hold down the death toll on an immediate and short-term basis, the two traffic safety groups agreed. The joint enforcement recommendations for the Fourth of July period were: 1. Cancel all days off for police and put every available officer on duty. Assign as many personnel as possible in plain clothes and unmarked cars to traffic patrol, especially from 6 p. m. to midnight on Tuesday and Wednesday. 2. Concentrate manpower on high volume or high speed streets and highways where serious accidents are most likely to occur. 3. Concentrate on hazardous moving violations, especially speeding the alert for erratic driving and other evidence of evening-hour driving after drinking. 4. Coordinate the effort with other enforcement agencies. 5. Use whatever other enforcement units are available locally, such as radar. 6. Publicize the program in advance so motorists will understand and cooperate with the objective. The council estimates that there will be 60 million vehicles on the move during the holiday. 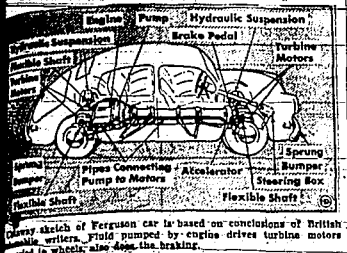

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—The agriculture department today said the 1954 spring pig crop totaled 63,063,000 head, a decline of eight per cent from the spring of 1953.

This decline in pig production is expected to mean higher prices for good breeding stock this fall. A spring pig crop of 61,500,000 head in 1953 caused hog prices to drop about 40 per cent last fall.

The department predicted a fall pig crop of 53 million head, a high-eight-per-cent drop from the fall crop last year.

The department said the number of sows farrowing this spring would be 86,085,000 head, down eight per cent from the 92,564,000 head produced in the spring and fall crops last year.

The department said the number of sows farrowing this spring would be less than the 8,500,000 number of pigs saved per litter was 694, establishing a new record for spring farrowing and compares with 680 pigs per litter in 1953.

Reports on breeding intentions indicate a total of 27.5 million head to be saved this fall. This would be seven per cent less than the number farrowing last fall. It shows a decline in the number of pigs saved per litter equals the 10-year average, with an average for upward-trend, the fall pig crop would be about 25 million head.

One of the subjects the two will discuss when Shepilov comes to Athens will be the Cyprus situation.

### Steamship Firms Join Race to Get-Liners for Pacific Trade

SAN FRANCISCO, June 21 (AP)—An "unholy alliance" of interest in travel to Pacific "rain" countries has touched off a race among shipping companies to provide luxury liners to cash in on the tourist boom.

The Pacific Area Travel Association predicted that 10,000,000 Americans would book passage on steamships in 1954—equal to the best years of the 1940's.

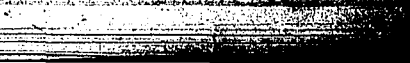

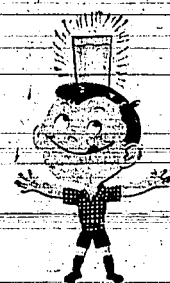

### Persistent Cockroaches Fight To Stay on This Earth Longer

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—Alarming news has come from the cockroach world.

The persistent little creatures, which have been on this earth 30 million years or so, apparently are to stick around for another 50 million.

"The roaches at the Washington National airport have spurred man's finest scientific soldiers... in the words of exterminator Simon H. Ratner."

"They simply haven't been dying from their accustomed regularity," Ratner says the story really begins around 10 years ago, when a fine new poison was assembled. It not only knocked off resistant roaches, but also took care of the roaches that might come visiting during the next month or two.

Everything went well until fairly recently.

"When the airport people called Ratner to say their roaches appeared apathetic about ending it all, he figured he had the trouble diagnosed instantly."

It looks like the same thing is happening that always happens in the pest control business," he said. "Get a good poison, and the first thing you know the rats or the bugs are resistant to it."

Since cockroaches appear so determined to remain with us, let's find out a little more about them.

"They don't eat enough to both serve all," Ratner said. "The worst part of it is they may walk over the floor and then onto a table and spread germs that way. But the main problem is aesthetic. Mention roaches to most people and they cringe."

"Another thing Cleanliness has nothing to do with it. They're brought in from somewhere. Maybe they get behind a cardboard, and lay their eggs. Pretty soon, roaches are everywhere."

"Most husbands blame their wives. If you keep the damn place clean," they say, "we wouldn't have them. Nothing to it. I have been called out for roaches—in some of the very cleanest and cleanest homes in Washington."

"Another thing. Roaches are nocturnal characters. Since they come out only at night, they may be in the place six months before you see them."

"Then some night mother gets up to give the baby its two o'clock bottle and there they are."

"Mothers with small babies," Ratner said, "are my very best customers."

### Idaho Taking No Stand Yet On New Plans

BOISE, June 21 (AP)—Mark Kulp, state reclamation engineer, said Wednesday that Idaho delegates have taken no position yet on proposed changes in the structure of the Columbia interstate compact commission.

Details of the proposal were outlined earlier in the day in Spokane by Calvert Anderson, Oregon secretary, who said it would be taken up at a meeting in Spokane next Monday.

The compact, designed for "orderly and comprehensive development" of the resources of the Coeur d'Alene basin, now provides for two commissioners from Idaho, Washington, Oregon and Montana, and one each from Wyoming, Utah and Nevada.

The proposal calls for three each from Idaho, Washington, Oregon and Montana, each having two votes; one commissioner from Wyoming with two votes, and one from Utah and Nevada with one vote each.

Kulp said he'd decline to comment publicly on the proposal until Idaho's five negotiators on the commission can meet in Spokane and report back.

"They are Kulp, R. P. Farr of Twin Falls, Alexander H. Campbell of St. Anthony, E. B. Campbell of Bonanza Ferry, and George Crookham of Caldwell."

The present setup has been criticized by the Idaho legislature but will be approved by Montana before it becomes effective.

### Last Obstacle Is Cleared in Plan for Dam

SEPERATA, Wash., June 21 (AP)—A final financial hurdle was cleared Wednesday for start of the first major Pacific Northwest Columbia river water project dam not federally financed.

Steps to market to the public the first bonds under the agreement reached by the Grant county public utility district and four New York and Chicago brokerage firms got under way.

Shortly before Tuesday midnight, representatives of the firms and the Grant-EPUD initiated an agreement under which the firms will buy \$10 million dollars in bonds to pay for the long-planned Priest Rapids dam. The signers said the bonds would go on sale through 16 firms over the next two or three days.

The dam, an 812-foot concrete and earth-faced structure, will be a site about 30 miles east of Yacoma. Initial construction work by Merrill-Chapman and Scott, of New York, was bid of \$112,653 had been accepted previously, should get under way shortly, a PUD spokesman said.

The big bond issue was described by the principals as the largest ever authorized in the Pacific northwest. It will also pay the preliminary expenses for the completion Wanapum dam, to be built later, a short distance up the Columbia.

Mrs. Ferguson reared six children of her own and had a big hand in the upbringing of three stepchildren besides. For most of the 44 years of her married life she took care of a 10-room home with little outside help.

"What's more, she thrived on it. No 80-year-old woman could do that. I don't know how, nor would I question her proud boast of 'gentle' handling."

"Her husband Alexander has done all right too. Here's a sunny pink-checked, eye-twinkling 91."

On the subject of what she calls men's rights, Mrs. Murdoch said: "I think a husband deserves a chance to relax when he gets home after working all day. And I believe, wives are pushing their husbands into heart attacks by demanding too much of them."

As Mrs. Murdoch sees it, too many modern women fall victim of selfishly and self-pity to general flabbiness of mind and spirit.

"I managed fine," she said, "even if I didn't have the benefit of all other labor-saving gadgets, to say nothing of synthetic fabrics and goods you don't even have to iron."

"We mothers didn't have kaffe klatches as I believe the daily habit now is called. Yes, I didn't have time. But I did have an hour each day to rest and to be alone to think."

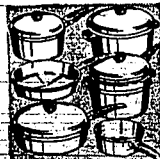
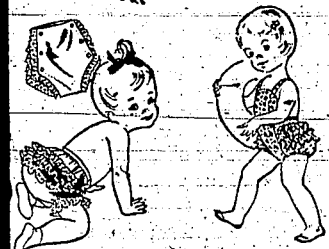

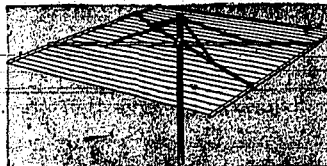

# Scientists Note Means to "Slow Down" Time, Contend Men Could Experience It

PARADISE, Calif., June 11.—Scientists believe there is a way to slow down time and that man himself could experience it.

It would require that a ship travel fantastically fast in space to do it, but theoretically space men could return from a 10-year round trip to another world and find that a century had passed on earth.

The United Press asked Dr. Robert H. Feynman, professor of theoretical physics at California Institute of Technology, for an explanation.

Dr. Feynman says the phenomenon, expressed in Einstein's theory of relativity, appears to be borne out in the laboratory. Experiments show that atomic particles pushed

speed of light, but it compares with only seven miles per second which is the speed necessary for a space ship of the "atomic" type to be launched, says Feynman.

One fast particle is traveling such velocity in space is that the mass of a body increases and keeps increasing with speed. Well before a space ship reached light speed, its mass would become so great its power plant would have no more effect upon it.

It would be like starting over with a slower plane capable of reaching a power plant able to pump a battleship.

Meanwhile, anyone wishing to catch up on time right here on earth can seek out a low valley in which to live. Feynman figures that due to the effect of gravity on the speed of light, 100 years at sea level would be 1-1/2,000th of a second less.

"I'm so glad I've been drinking too much and that's why I'm here," Mrs. Boyd told a reporter at the jail.

"I don't know what I'll do with so much money," she said. "I guess I will build a home on some land which my brother and I own on the reservation."
