Aerial Spraying Project Will Kill Sagebrush on Dry Creek

An aerial spraying project to eradicate sagebrush on 2,500 acres of land in the Dry Creek drainage area was reported Friday by Wesley Carlson, Sawtooth forest staff assistant for the U. S. Forest Service. "We are trying to eliminate sagebrush which is in competition with range grasses for the small supply of water," he explained. "We only spray areas in which there is a good under stand of grass. Where there is no grass we leave the sage alone to protect the watershed."

He added that "The forest service considers water to be the most valuable resource from our national forest land. Through range improvement projects we try to give brush to watershed lands and promote grazing on the flatter ground which is in competition with range grasses for the small supply of water."

He also is planning a great deal of the land," he reported, "and we will plant it this fall with crested wheatgrass, smooth and mountain fescue, and other grasses depending on what will grow best in the particular area. We mix alfalfa seed with most of our areas, too."

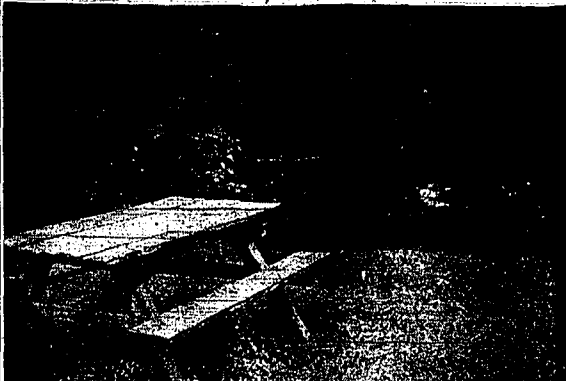

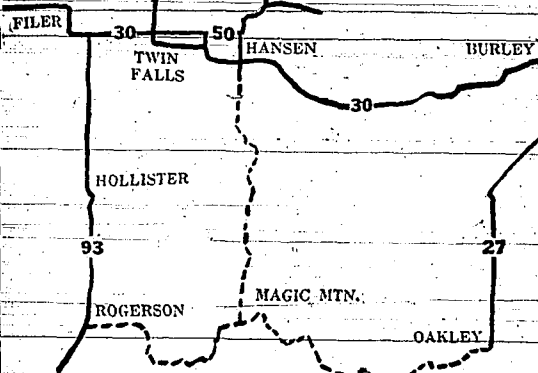

Trip Through South Hills Provides Study in Contrasts



Along Rock creek, leading into the south hills from Hansen, are innumerable picnic spots. The stream also has a picnic in the summer months by combined with a fishing trip. Back at Magic mountain, the road to the left, or east, eventually comes out at Oakley. From the Rock creek ranger station to the Bostetter ranger station is a matter of 13 miles. Bostetter is 21 miles from Oakley.

Another side trip is possible from Magic mountain. One may explore the road runs almost due south from Magic mountain to Monument peak and into Badger gulch and Trout creek. Continuing generally south five road drops down from the top into the wide, dusty valley of Nevada. At Badger gulch, however, a road cuts back sharply along Trout creek and comes out along the lower G-O-a-a-creek reservoir and passes the Oakley dam.

When reasonably well kept, this road is not on a par with the main road along Hudson ridge from Magic mountain to Oakley.

The Bostetter ranger station, 13 miles from the Rock creek station, is the oldest ranger station in the division and one of the oldest in the national forest service. It was established approximately 1890 and the Kildok forest was created and once was kept open throughout the year. However, the station is open only during the summer months.

In the vicinity of the station is one of the largest and best recreation areas in the entire division. There are stoves, tables, piped spring water rest rooms and playgrounds. The area will accommodate approximately 50 automobiles and 250 persons at one time.

Another popular camp and picnic site is the Father and Son camp often used by Boy Scouts, Bee Five girls and Camp Fire Girls and for family reunions.

From Bostetter, the road goes down the ridge through stands of juniper and into G-O-A-L-Y valley. Coming off the hill into Oakley, the Oakley reservoir and the Trapper creek road, had you still have to turn that way, it is a few miles to the south.

Almost anywhere along the route pairs of sharp eyes will locate deer and other forms of wildlife, especially in the morning and evening. Beaver have built at both Penstemon and Bostetter. Turcomans are becoming pests in the hills by their abundance and the deer herd, because of their numbers, has been placed in a game department. It is one of the most prolific in the United States.

Magic Valley Tours Accessible South Hills Contain Much In Way of Natural Beauty, Interest

Prizing the south side of the Snake-river-plain through Magic Valley is a range of low mountains (collectively) and sometimes affectionately known as the south hills. They are a series of large, conical hills, often are overlooked, as a place to visit.

Skiers, of course, and deer hunters know the south hills for the sport they provide in season, but the hills contain much more than a winter ski area and one of the best managed deer herds in the United States.

As any sportsman, especially the deer hunter who has tramped the back reaches of the hills, and he will tell you nature works overtime to produce rugged, clear, cold running streams, canyon, coniferous woods, fresh water mountains, forest and an abundance of wildlife.

The south hills comprise an indefinite area, but one of the main portions is what technically is known as the Casia division of the Sawtooth national forest.

Three years ago the Casia division was part of the Minidoka national forest. However, was abolished in 1963 and the five separate areas in the division became parts of the Sawtooth national forest.

The Minidoka forest was created on July 2, 1906, by President Theodore Roosevelt. In addition to the Casia division, there are the Aldon mountain, Black Pine and Rutland divisions in Idaho and the Platt River division in Northern Utah.

The three main entrances to the Casia division—Oakley, Hansen and Rogerson—roughly form the three points on a "7" making it impossible to visit "the hills" completely without some backtracking.

There are other entrances to the hills and many side trips within but most of them are not recommended for modern, law-abiding, vehicles. For those who do not object to driving over bumpy roads or to scratching the paint on their cars, these side trips could provide some of the most picturesque sites of the entire hills. The road from Oakley, Hansen or Rogerson to either of the two other entrances are well-kept, gravel highways and may be driven over with no difficulty.

Using Hansen as a starting point, the road follows Rock creek up into the forest and passes through one of the best examples of multiple use to which a national forest may be put. The area is under heavy protection from March or April through-

through June. Because of heavy use, this area could easily become an eyesore were it not for the constant surveillance by forest service personnel.

Some people seem to forget the picnic tables and sanitary facilities are public property and that to deface them, they are destroying their own property as well as making future enjoyment, both for themselves and for others, next to impossible.

Country to what seems to be the opinion of a few, the fish in Rock creek do not like beer and aluminum cans are avoided for target practice.

The recreation area at Harrington forks is one of the largest along Rock creek. It is only a mile to Castle Rock, one of the scenic spots on the trip, along a well marked trail.

The south hills, small but picturesque elk herd usually winters on the ridge southeast of Harrington fork and the largest wild animal in the Casia division sometimes can be seen there in early spring and late fall.

From Harrington fork to the third fork of Rock creek, the road passes through—

through—two—canyons providing three miles of rugged splendor. The third and fourth forks of Rock creek come together three miles above Harrington fork and the road continues up the third fork. Between the third fork and the Penstemon picnic area, the road passes over hanging ledges and the character of the country changes from aspen growth to timber.

The distance to the Rock creek ranger station is 26 miles. One mile beyond the station, in Pike mountain, one of the Magic mountain ridges, from the top of Pike, an unsurpassed view of Magic Valley may be obtained.

The ridge to the west of Pike mountain is the famous "Deadline" ridge of early days in Magic Valley. Sheep cutter grazes no farther west than the ridge and cattle no farther east. Because sheep crossed into "forbidden" territory to the west around the turn of the century, two shepherds were murdered and the famous Diamondfield Jack Davis case still is being tried in the minds of men.

Also, from Pike mountain can be seen the two summer homes areas in the Casia division of the national forest—one stretching towards Rogerson, the other near the head of country in the hills.

Southeast of Pike mountain Monument peak, whose 5,200-foot height gives it the honor of being the highest mountain in the Casia division.

On a straight line between the two peaks is an area which looks as though it is being farmed. It isn't a rearing project carried on by the forest service in cooperation with the Pickett ranch and Shesha company of Oakley.

Magic Mountain is a place of decoration. It is the place where the aten of the "7" joins the head. Going west from the fifth fork of the road, across—Bostetter-ridge—and drop down into the fifth fork of Rock creek and then into Shoshone basin. On the way is the old Shoshone ranger station, no longer used as such but with the buildings still intact.

The road into Shoshone basin is dotted with side roads, one of which, while not the best in the world, can be driven in modern cars and comes down from the hills along Indian Spring into Kimberly.

To the west of the Indian Spring road, above Crooked Springs, lies the Shoshone basin, considered by some as being some of the most rugged country in the hills.

Hagerty said the order "should be optional, and particularly on junior officers, to avoid an excessive outlay of money for civilian clothes."

Hagerty said the Wilson order had been discussed by the White House staff, and was taken up with President Eisenhower this morning.

Following the White House announcement, the defense department issued the following:

Wilson announced today that there remained details to be worked out in connection with the instructions to be issued by the secretary of the army, navy and air force in regard to the wearing of civilian clothes by military and naval officers who are attached to headquarters in the Washington, D. C. area. In the meantime, he has asked the secretaries to issue instructions to make the practice of wearing civilian clothes after July 1, 1956 optional or non-optional.

State's Refusal of Mediation Panel Rapped by Labor Chief

Charges that refusal of state labor mediator to arrive at a satisfactory labor dispute involving two Twin Falls restaurants has encouraged employers to intensify their union-busting activities" was made Thursday by a field representative of the AFL-CIO's region 20.

In a letter to Robison, Len Loring, labor representative, charged that Robison had not made his position clear regarding his refusal to appoint the panel. He further asserted "the basis of your full determination that the public interest is not involved in this case is not clear unless you are of the opinion that the public interest is not involved in avoiding strikes and other aspects of serious labor unrest in the case of restaurant workers."

The union charges that owners of Wray's cafe and Scott's cafe have refused to recognize or bargain with the Hotel and Restaurant Employees and Bartenders union.

On June 18 Robison said he would recommend at least for the present, appointment of a mediation panel in the dispute. He said he believed the owners in question should meet with the representative of the union in a house-

Loring asserted in his letter "The June 18 was formally requested that you lend your good offices to resolve this dispute by either or both of two mediation procedures." He went on to say "while you say in your reply you will continue to be of all possible assistance to both parties... in attempting to secure a solution of the problem, your letter gives no indication that assistance... by mediation or otherwise is expected."

In a June 18 letter to Loring, Robison recalled that unions had opposed two previous requests for appointment of a mediation panel. He said these were in connection with a laundry dispute in 1951 and a grocery store dispute in 1953. He further pointed out that the Twin Falls dispute was similar to the previous two and the department did not feel justified in favoring the mediation request.

Loring's letter says "the withholding of governmental mediation to date has had the effect of encouraging the employers to make mockery of the state election-certification machinery and to ignore workers' legal rights to collective bargaining, as well as to intensify

Drought Area Has Break in Grazing Plans

WASHINGTON, June 23 (AP)—The agriculture department said today farmers in drought-designated counties will be permitted to graze livestock on soil bank acreage and still collect benefits.

Under the new farm law, the governor of each state containing drought-designated counties must ask the department for permission to graze the lands. Department officials said such permission would be granted.

There are 146 counties in nine states that have been designated as drought-disaster areas. Under such designation, eligible farmers and ranchers can participate in the emergency feed grain program.

Under this program they may obtain certain feed grains at a reduction in price of 45 per hundred. The program is designed to help stockmen in stricken areas maintain beef herds.

The drought-designated areas are: Arizona, five counties; Colorado, 10; Kansas, 12; Nevada, one; New Mexico, 21; Oklahoma, six; Texas, 78; Washington, four; and Utah, one.

This is the second time soil bank regulations have been softened since June 8. On June 21, the department offered to accept in the soil bank acreage which had been grazed by livestock during 1956. Such land was held to be eligible if the grazing was halted by June 21.

Officials said the grazing ban was lifted because it was considered unfair to farmers who used their fields for pasture before knowing the soil bank would be in effect this year.

Uranium Offices Are Consolidated

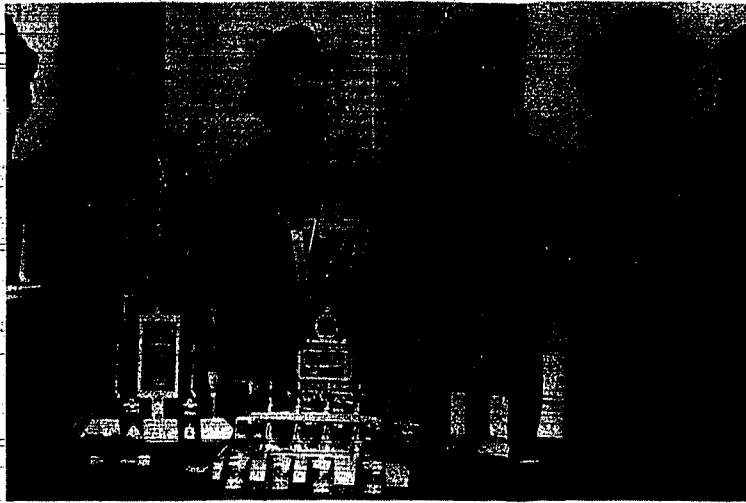

Troops Used To Stop Riot In Arab Area

ALGIERS, Algeria, June 23 (AP)—Fifteen hundred Europeans today attempted to storm the Casbah, the old Arab quarter used as a hideout for rebel hit-and-run attacks. They were dispersed by police and troops armed with tommyguns.

The outbreak, followed by rebel violence and police countermeasures left six persons dead and 40 wounded in Algeria. Military patrols with tommyguns guarded the streets tonight.

Dead were two Europeans, three pro-French Arabs and one national. Eleven Europeans, four pro-French Arabs and one national were wounded.

The riot followed attacks by a four-man rebel commando group from the Casbah in which two persons were slain. The commandos killed a European merchant in the lower Casbah district, then shot and wounded three Europeans on a plaza near the Algiers cathedral. In addition the rebels wounded severely a 72-year-old European cafe owner. This rebel also killed a Moslem described as friendly to the French.

After molesting several Moslems, the demonstrators today reached the market place of the Bab-el-Oued district, which borders on the Casbah. They overturned Moslem market stands, trampling boxes of fruit and vegetables.

Police reinforcements finally dispersed the rioters. The district, which has many residents of Spanish and Italian origin, was reported in state of high excitement.

Winds, Rains Postpone New H-Bomb Tests

HONOLULU, June 23 (AP)—Eruptive winds and rainstorms have apparently postponed commencement of the H-bomb series at the Pacific proving grounds. The Honolulu Advertiser said today it learned that winds in the H-bomb area had been blowing from the "wrong direction" since the arrival of "Hiroshima" type B-29 Superfortresses. Lewis L. Strauss and Central Intelligence Boss Allen Dulles.

The newspaper sent a series of questions to Strauss and Dulles through joint atomic task force staff, but the task force commander, Rear Adm. B. H. Hannon, replied "Chairman Strauss will not be able to consider your questions until after he returns to Washington. The questions dealt with security leaks which occurred since the May 31 H-bomb explosion. No Answers Received

Although the advertiser did not get answers to its questions, it said it feared that weather conditions "make it highly improbable" that Strauss and Dulles will witness any new H-bomb tests. The advertiser said winds both at the surface and at higher elevations have been from the east and north-east during the week. Skies have been overcast with intermittent light rains—and there was no immediate sign of a change in weather conditions.

Tests Announced On Federal Work

Examinations for civil service positions in the Washington, D. C. area have been announced by Agency Director Edwin G. Hoover. The tests will be held at the Federal Office of Personnel Management in Washington, D. C. The positions are: tabulating machine operator and labeling machine operator, \$2,800 and \$3,015 a year; supervisor in charge of equipment operation and tabulating machine operation, \$3,410 to \$4,530 a year; tabulating project planner, \$3,670 and \$4,525 a year; and tabulating planner, \$3,415 to \$4,080 a year. Applicants must pass a written test. Applications will be accepted until further notice, he reported, and must be filed with the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C.

Potato Committee Will Offer Shipping Regulation Decision

CALDWELL, June 23 (AP)—The Idaho Eastern Oregon Potato Commission today will submit to the U. S. department of agriculture concerning the 1958 potato shipping regulations to the area to market. The committee, currently composed of eight growers and shippers, made its recommendations to the department under a marketing agreement. Except in very unusual circumstances, the recommendations are put into the form of agricultural "dear-sir" requests. The recommendations prepared today were: 1. Grade—All potatoes shipped from the Idaho-eastern Oregon area must be U. S. No. 2 or better. 2. Principles Eyed

NEW YORK, June 23 (AP)—The presidents of seven privately supported universities from Massachusetts to California made public today a set of eight principles to guide their institutions in seeking and accepting financial support from business and industry. The presidents agreed that their schools' names not be used in advertising their equipment, which may be given to them, that gifts which place a future burden on the university should be refused and that scholarship programs can better be administered by the university than by a corporation.

Deal Is Made

LONDON, June 23 (AP)—Soviet Russia and Yenan signed a joint communiqué in Moscow today but Moscow radio did not disclose its contents immediately. The broadcast also did not mention reports that Russia has negotiated for uranium mining and oil rights in the tiny Arabian kingdom.

Quake Reported

BERKELEY, Calif., June 23 (AP)—The University of California seismograph station reported today its instruments recorded a "profound" earthquake believed centered in the remote Kamchatka peninsula in Siberia. Seismologist Don Tocher said the quake hit 4.5 on the Richter scale of 10, it was recorded last night at 11:27 p. m. PDT and lasted nearly two hours.

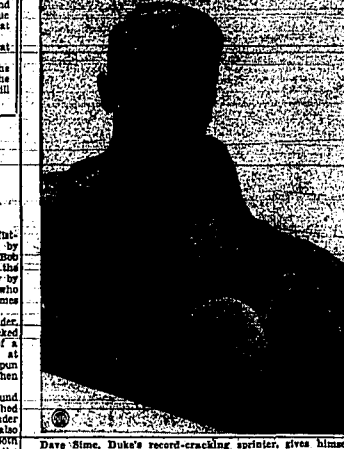
