Man Is Dead As Car rolls Across Lava House Committee Zoned Compromises Okays High Dam Close Controversy On Lynwood Tract

SHOSHONE, June 26—C. M. Dill, Jr., 50, Lincoln county representative in the 30's and Shoshone area farmer, died at 3 a. m. Tuesday in St. Benedict's hospital, Jerome, a result of injuries received in an automobile accident on one-half mile south of Shoshone on highway 20 at 1:30 a. m. His death is the 20th traffic fatality for Lincoln county this year. The driver of the car, which was only 14, Mr. Dill was killed at the time of the accident at the time the automobile was rolling across lava. The one person involved, Sheriff James Conner, who investigated, reported.

Mr. Conner said Mr. Dill was driving a 1955 Buick Wildcat. The car rolled over the lava rock at the top of a 100-foot drop. The car was found 165 feet beyond the lava rock.

The smashed automobile C. W. Dill, Jr., Shoshone, was driving when he was injured fatally at 1:30 a. m. Tuesday, still stood in the desert off the highway Tuesday morning. 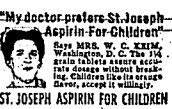

6 People Test Firm's Steaks In Ideal Work

CHICAGO, June 23 (AP)—One of the nicest jobs you can find anywhere belongs to Phyllis Tamor, a trim brunette who gets paid for eating prime steaks.
Mrs. Tamor, an employee of Swift and company, is a member of a "panel of steak tasters" who test the firm's steaks for quality. She is joined by Roy Martin, Alfred Savich, Mrs. Mitchell Harvey, Mrs. Helen Kargin and Gene Schollier. All have other duties in Swift's research department, but the best part of their working day is the "steak break."
All told, about 30 Swift employees are trained "steak tasters," and when the panel of six grows weary of the job (that's possible?) another takes over.
There are some restrictions. You're not supposed to smoke, eat or drink anything but water before the daily taste test. Might dull the "taste buds."
Each day Roy Martin selects six nicely looking sides of beef from a job. Swift intends to cut up into packaged frozen steaks. From each of these, Martin slices a "top strip" steaks.
There are taken to the test kitchen—and broiled while the "panel members sit around with their mouths watering.
The steaks are then sliced and distributed to that each of the six panelists get a slice from each steak. The slices are numbered.
Before the tasters the next tasters go about their delightful little task with knife, fork, pencil and paper. They rate each slice for appearance, aroma, tenderness, juiciness, texture, flavor and acceptability.
The tasters are allowed no salt, pepper or other flavorings. But who needs it?

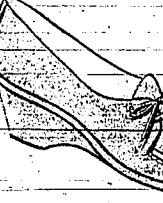
