Cook's claim about the north pole was disputed by Adm. Robert Peary, who said his arrival there April 6, 1909, was the first. Peary also challenged Cook's claim about Mt. McKinley.

Mrs. Vetter contends that if she can prove her father was the first to conquer Mt. McKinley, she also can prove Peary's other accusation that he had with her a picture of the look of McKinley's summit in Alaska, she will compare this picture with one to be taken by explorer William L. Cook.

"If the pictures match, I'll have enough to make a good case with the fact I have already accumulated," she said.

Little-Publicized Portion of Twin Falls Recreation Program Coming to Close

A city's recreation program usually thought of as consisting primarily of sports and games to occupy boys and girls' spare time during the summer months, but Thursday marked the end of this summer of an unusual and little-publicized phase of the Twin Falls recreation program.

About 75 junior and high school students met at one time or another at the junior high school for the last of its band and orchestra lessons offered over an eight-week period by the department of parks and recreation.

Classes were divided into three groups, each with a total enrollment of about 60 students. Instructors for the lessons were Charles L. Riedelbeck, junior high band; Richard R. Smith, junior high orchestra, and Del Staughter, senior high band. All are teachers in the Twin Falls public school system, and although Although enrollment ran relatively high for all three classes, Riedelbeck estimates the average attendance for the lessons was under 30 because of vacations and the general lure of being outside during the warm weather.

Ernest C. Graner, superintendent of parks and recreation, said this year marks the first time for the high school band class and orchestra class. "We hope to have an even larger program in music next summer," he added.

SIMULATED DEVASTATION

Seventy-five out of America's 100 prime target areas will be theoretically hit by over 150 A and H-bombs beginning at 10 a. m. Friday.

This is the first time a military-civil defense maneuver will be played with this new, cost mass destruction weapon in the game. It is believed that Russian submarines may have the capability to deliver this form of attack.

All other bombs will be assumed to have been dropped from aircraft. Fifty-two target areas will be assumed hit by single bombs and 23 by from two to five bombs. San Francisco will theoretically get the most.

President Eisenhower will take part in the simulated Eisenhower evacuation exercise the first day. Then he will be in Panama for the remainder of the week-end with Latin-American presidents. It hasn't been decided how fully he'll participate in Operation Alert after he gets back. There are no plans to have Vice President Nixon fill the President's role while he's away.

Members of the White House staff will be theoretically evacuated for the full week. There will be a small pool of reporters with the President at all times. But the main White House press headquarters and news center for the entire government will be moved to the Army information headquarters at a secret location far removed from Washington.

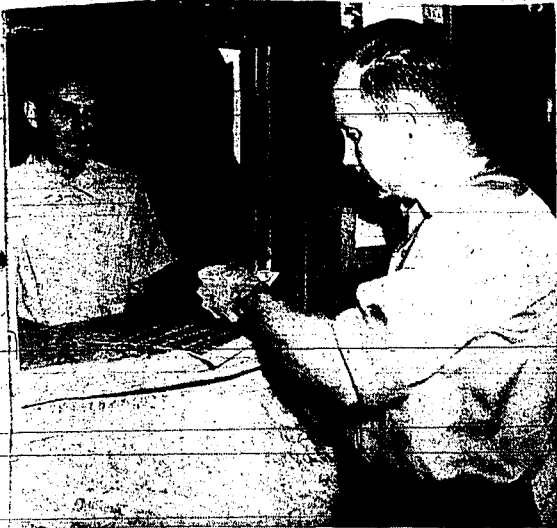
Over 100 reporters, photographers and broadcasters will move beyond baggage to this HQ, through which all government and executive agency news will flow for the full week.

Congress will stick to its knitting in Washington and will not participate in the exercise. If congress evacuates the capital, it will be because it adjourns, and not because of any simulated H-bomb attack.

In their closing announcement at Geneva, Eisenhower and Russian Premier Nikhail Bulganin laid down three main goals: German reunification, disarmament, increased trade and elimination of barriers between the United States and Russia. The committee convened yesterday to consider changes in Poland's five-year plan, as proposed by the workers' vote in Poznan. The sources said the major decisions taken would be aimed at raising the standard of living.

Polish authorities have admitted that the workers' protest against working and living conditions were justifiable in large measure.

The committee discussed the political and economic situation and they key tasks of the party at yesterday's opening session, Radio Warsaw reported.

While no agenda was released in Warsaw, information about these other topics also were discussed:

1. The guiding principles of the five-year plan.
2. Organizational matters aimed at reconstructing the lower echelons of the party to bring them in close contact with the people.
3. Party Secretary Edward Ochab, who succeeded to that position on the death a few months ago of Stanislaw Buruz, gave the committee support on the political and economic condition of the country, and the effect of the Poznan riots on the nation.
4. Premier Josef Cyrankiewicz reported on the guiding principles of the five-year-plan at the opening session, according to the international press.

The question of liberalization of the regime following the condemnation of the "cult of the personality" by Boris Gromyko, Soviet foreign minister, was discussed yesterday. Sources said it would be one of the main topics of the committee. It was not known how long the committee would remain in session.

No Danger Is Seen on Polio Through U.S.

WASHINGTON, July 19 (AP)—The public health service indicated today that it sees no danger for the rest of the nation in the major polio outbreak which has hit Chicago.

"The sharp increase in the number of polio cases reported in Illinois," it reported, "is almost entirely due to localized outbreaks in certain sections of Chicago, mainly among persons of low economic status."

For the nation as a whole, 435 new cases of polio were reported last week—131 fewer cases than were reported in the same week of 1935. So far this year, there have been 2,295 cases compared to 4,676 last year. The paralytic figures are less encouraging, however. There were 215 paralytic cases last week compared to 264 the same week last year. And the paralytic total so far this year is "nearly only slightly below last year—1,740 compared to 1,856."

Authorities said they don't know the reason for the relatively high paralytic rate. A partial explanation, they said, may be the fact that more cases this year have occurred among very young children who are more susceptible to paralysis.

But polio vaccinations are designed to prevent paralysis. Authorities emphasized, however, that it is too early to tell what effect inoculations may be having this year.

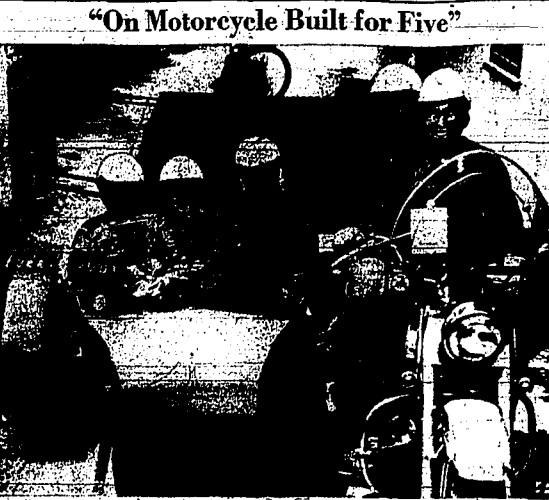
'Little Stalin' Is Ousted for Red Hungary

VIENNA, July 19 (AP)—Iron curtain experts expressed doubt today that the downfall of Hungary's "little Stalin" Mayor Rakosi, would improve the lot of the common man in the Soviet satellite despite promises of a "new look" policy by his successor.

Rakosi's resignation as first secretary of the Hungarian Communist party and from the all-powerful politburo was announced yesterday. He was replaced in the "ironman" post of party secretary by Moscow-trained Ernő Gerő, first deputy premier and the country's economic czar.

The official Hungarian communist newspaper Szabad Nep said Rakosi's resignation had "aided" both party and people. Budapest radio said telegram of congratulations for the central committee's actions were piling up at party headquarters.

In his speech, broadcast by Radio Budapest, Gerő said party leaders were at fault because they drew "the conclusions of the (Soviet Communist party) 20th congress only in a general sense." It was at this congress, in Moscow last February, that the attack on Stalin's one-man rule was launched.

Aurora Borealis Explanation Told

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The "northern lights" and the "air glow" after sunset may be caused by simple chemical reactions in the high altitude.

Charles A. Barth, graduate research physicist at UCLA here, recently discovered in laboratory experiments one of these reactions: the combination of atomic nitrogen with oxygen.

The puzzling phenomenon of air-glow or aurora borealis, which mostly consists of invisible light, Barth suggests, may be caused by simple chemical reactions.

Synthetic Fungi Research Noted

DAVIS, Calif. (AP)—University of California agriculture scientists are doing research on a project which may produce a synthetic new "sunbroom-type" food.

The studies are aimed at producing edible fungi in fermentation tanks, similar to the process used in large-scale penicillin production.

Study Stations Are Proposed For Scientists

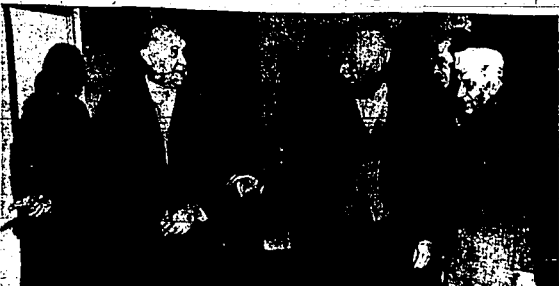

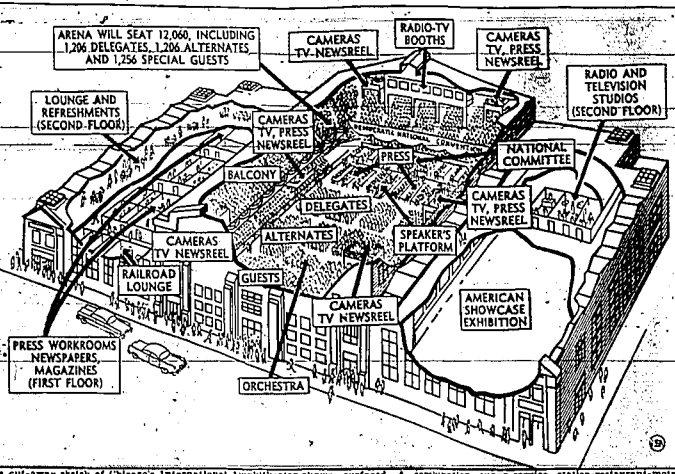

ALGERIA, July 19—French forces opened a sweeping air-ground search in southwest Algeria today for a rebel group which killed four French soldiers and wounded six others in a raid on a military convoy.
