WASHINGTON, July 23 (Special)—Terry Lattelle Crapo, Idaho Falls, and John L. Peterson, Boise, are two of the 100 Idaho youths attending the 23rd annual convention of the American Legion's Boys' Nation. They are among 90 high school boys who are spending eight days here on their own cabinet and staff. The group will hold their own senate session and elect their own president and vice president. They will conduct party conventions, make nominations, and elect their own President and Vice President. In the senate they will consider bills to amend the electoral college and turn over to the vice president duties of the chief executive in the event of his physical disability. The boys will receive a briefing from the country's military leaders and will make side trips to Washington, D.C., to see the Supreme Court, national archives, and other government buildings. The program was launched by the American Legion in 1946. Each year two outstanding boys from each state who have participated in their own state's Boys' Nation are selected to attend Boys' Nation Camp. This year the governor of the 48th Idaho state, Conrad L. Benson, is chairman.

### 26 Injured in Derailed of Speedy Train

CARROLLTON, Mo., July 23 (AP)—All 13 cars of the Santa Fe railroad's crack San Francisco-Chief train derailed last night, injuring 26 of the 122 passengers aboard. There were no fatalities. Many of the passengers were treated at hospitals and released to continue on their journey. Others were hospitalized. The Missouri highway patrol reported 20 of the 26 were listed cases. Many of the 122 passengers and 27 crew members probably owe their lives to the fact the train was slowing down in the Santa Fe station. 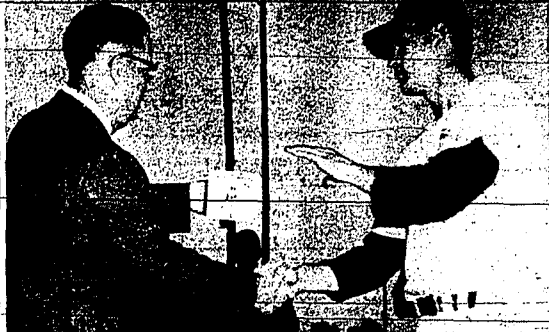

### Water Project Help for West Okayed in Bill

WASHINGTON, July 22 (Special)—The senate passed a bill today providing for federal financial aid to locally planned and executed reclamation projects.

The house also has passed the bill and it will go to the President to be signed.

The bill applies to the 17 western reclamation states.

It permits the states, their agencies, and interstate agencies to construct reclamation enterprises up to a cost of five million dollars with the federal government giving up to 75 per cent of the total.

There are 40 existing projects for this program; the bureau of reclamation discovered in a survey that the survey "could" 20,000 acres of potential new land and 65,000 acres of supplementary land.

Federal aid will be in the form of loans to be paid back within 30 years and grants for flood control and navigation.

All projects must be approved by the secretary of interior and approved by the senate under \$500,000, which do not need congressional approval.

Proponents of the bill believe that it will eliminate high federal overhead in the construction of local projects.

The contention is that planning and work can be done more cheaply on the local level.

### Paint Blamed By Envoy for Her Ailments

WASHINGTON, July 22 (AP)—Ambassador Clare Booth Luce said today "very, very old paint" falling from beams in her embassy residence bedroom in Rome made her ill about 18 months ago.

Over a period of a year, she said, she must have breathed and eaten small flakes of the arsenic-bearing paint. This may have weakened her for her recent illness, she said.

Her first public statement on the point poisoning was given by Mrs. Luce to reporters as she left by air for Lisbon, Portugal, and a three-week Mediterranean cruise. After the cruise she will return to her duties in Rome.

"The story of arsenic from roses painted on Mrs. Luce's bedroom ceiling poisoning her appeared early this week in Time magazine, published by her husband, Henry Luce. The Time article said a "deadly fallout" of arsenic had caused the long series of illnesses which have beset Mrs. Luce since she became ambassador to Italy over three years ago.

"The poisoned paint cause of the illness has been questioned both in the United States and in Italy.

The government built an Indian agency—called the second Fort Hall—near the old site in 1879. Today's only concrete reminder of Henry Hall is the tiny town of Fort Hall and its nearby Indian school.

But in the desert west of U. S. Highway 101, there still can be seen the weed-covered relics of old Fort Hall: A crumbled frame of an old well and several triangular depressions that once were sun pits.
