Nasser Seizes Suez Canal; New Crisis Develops as Result

Egypt's revolutionary regime Friday took over operation of the Suez canal, seized by the western financial powers. Nasser declared the nationalization of the vital 101-mile canal as a result of a stirring anti-western speech to cheering thousands in Alexandria Thursday. Meanwhile, in London, Britain and France issued a joint statement they refused to recognize Egypt's seizure of the strategic waterway. Government officials in both countries met in emergency sessions to map counter-action against the sudden Egyptian move.

3-Year Pact Okayed; Has Wage Boost

NEW YORK, July 27 (U.P.)—The United Steelworkers of America and the steel industry today signed a three-year strike agreement calling for a total increase of 45.6 cents an hour in wages and other benefits over the life of the contract. The agreement provides for a package increase the first year of 20.1 cents an hour; 12.2 cents in the second year and 13.1 cents in the third year. The new contract will add \$1,332,000 to the industry's total labor costs. 750,000 nation's 650,000 steel workers will receive a direct wage increase of 10.5 cents the first year, 9.1 cents the second year and another 9.1 cents in the third year—the total of 28.7 cents in wages.

South Korea Still Showing Scars of War

SEOUL, July 27 (AP)—South Korea still suffers from the scars of war that ended in an armistice agreement three years ago today but it has come far toward independence, recovery and prosperity.

There is a sharp contrast in the Korean people themselves during the three years since U. S. Army Gen. William K. Harrison of the United Nations command and North Korean Gen. Nam Il of the communists signed the agreement which ended three years of war.

The average South Korean is better dressed, better fed and more confident.

But there is austerly a strong danger of inflation, and the price of rice, to which the nation's economy is pegged, is high.

The presence of a powerful communist military force in the north puts a heavy strain on the South Korean economy which is forced to support a 700,000 man military force.

Despite that strain, recovery has been evident and progress has been steady with the help of one billion dollars in economic aid received during the last three years.

White Bird hill, a descent of 2,200 feet in 12 miles of U. S. highway 20, was named for the grim Indian Chief White Bird, principal non-treaty chief who often disputed with Chief Joseph regarding the command of the united forces.

It was in central Idaho's White Bird canyon that the first battle in the Nez Perce Indian war was fought in 1877, with a complete victory for the red men. Chief White Bird is said to have led the war whoops and to have taunted the ex-captain soldiers while he waved a bunch of scalp ties to a pole.

White Bird hill may be termed part of Mt. Idaho, linked with the earliest gold rush days in the 1860s.

From the summit at an altitude of 5,340 feet, the view to the south is breath-taking. Planking out are canyon and ridge which stretch to the Seven Devils peaks on the west and into Idaho's primitive area on the east.

A granite shaft monument was erected in 1923 by Idaho county near the foot of White Bird hill to mark the start of the Nez Perce war.

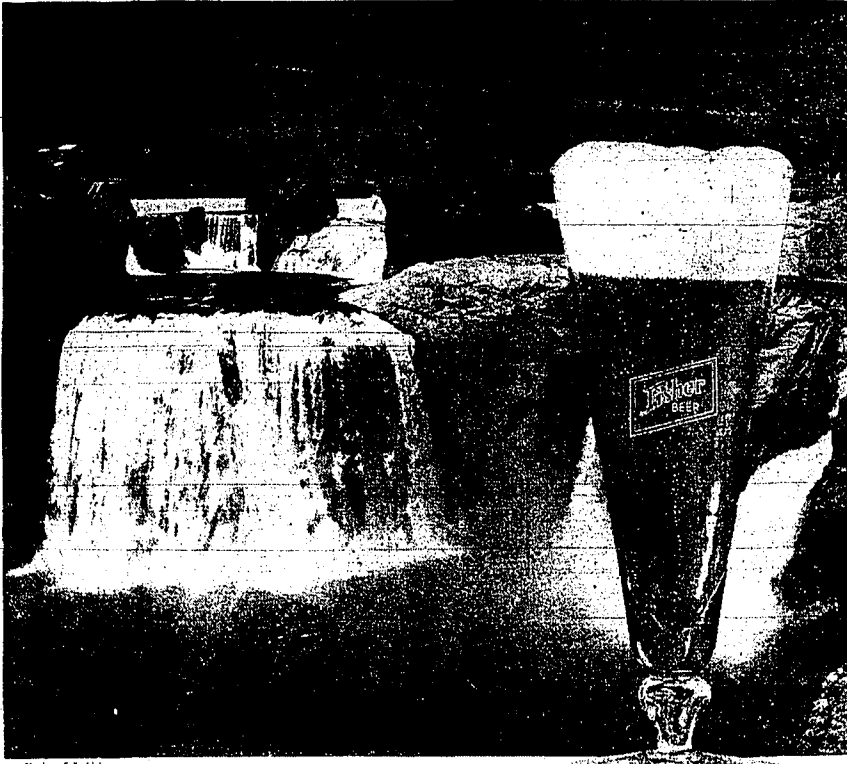
