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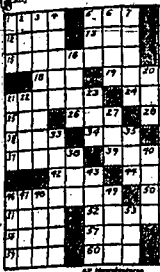

The conference is scheduled for next Wednesday. It has been suggested that the best way to unravel last week's mystery of Richard M. Nixon's attack on Vice President Richard M. Nixon would be for Mr. Eisenhower to begin the conference with his own explanation of what was what.

If the unraveling comes in the ordinary question and answer conference routine, there is likely to be more, rather than less, mystery before the show is over. A lot of Republicans would like to end the dispute about a vice presidential nominee and forget it. The major gain was in rural areas. Forty-two per cent of these households had sets last year and 49 per cent have them. Metropolitan areas had only from 81 to 84 per cent.
