### New, Cleaner H-Bombs Are Made in U. S.

WASHINGTON, July 31 (AP)—The atomic energy commission indicated today that new and "cleaner" H-bombs are approaching the production stage.

The indication, confirmed in official quarters, was contained in a report on "military applications" of the AEC's 20th semi-annual report to congress. The report also noted:

Rapid increases in the family of nuclear missile warheads for defense as well as offense, and new research production of nuclear explosives, fuels, and raw materials.

The new H-bombs, which design engineers had previously disclosed, would generate far less radioactivity than the super-bombs in stockpile. In fact, they would poison smaller parts of the planet with deadly fallout.

Such an H-bomb, according to President Eisenhower, would be "more of a military weapon and less an agent of 'mass destruction' than its radiologically dirtier predecessors."

In today's report the AEC said its weapons laboratories at Los Alamos, N. M., and Livermore, Calif., are working on new "mini-plans" it added that the new weapons plants are being expanded "to facilitate early production" of new weapons already "conceived in the Livermore laboratory."

"The United States family of weapons in various stages of research, development, and production engineering is," the AEC said, "increasing rapidly."

**Treatments Given To 16 Youngsters**

PORTLAND, Ore., July 31 (AP)—Sixteen youngsters who survived a 40-foot plunge into a sulphurous crevasse on Mt. Hood were undergoing treatment today for injuries ranging from contusions to broken bones.

One of the group, 16-year-old Lynn Kaufman, 16, Larchmont, N. Y., has both legs broken home yesterday. Only two escaped injury. Among the most seriously hurt were Susan Blum, 16, Bismarck, N. D., who suffered a spine fracture, and Susan Stein, 16, Baltimore, Md., who suffered a fractured skull.

Medical attendants said their condition was serious but that they were not on the critical list.

Most of the other injured youngsters suffered broken bones in the accident, which took place at the 18,000-foot level of the 11,225-foot tall mountain.

### Deaths in Soviet Prisons Charged

VIENNA, July 31 (AP)—The Austrian association of former-prisoners of war claimed yesterday that 1,300 prisoners were killed and about 1,000 injured in mass rioting in Soviet prison camps late last year.

Details of the alleged riots were given for the first time in a letter of protest delivered by the association to Andrej Gromyko, Soviet ambassador in Austria.

The letter was signed by association chairman Karl Bieyer and deputy chairman Rudolf Neumann. They said the riots took place at Norik, Siberia and Kengir in Kazakhstan.

### Gods Invoked to Guarantee Rains

COLOMBO, Ceylon, July 31 (AP)—Mayor V. A. Sugathadasa gave up on science yesterday and considered a desperate move to bring rain to dry Colombo.

Sugathadasa abandoned an Indian expert's suggestion for artificial rain, but said he had no objection to the proposal of municipal councillor Abu Hair, who volunteered to find a *Kattaiya* or soothsayer to perform a ball or devil dancing ceremony.

"Where science failed, invoking the gods may succeed," he said.

CONGRESS ADJOURNS

With congress adjourned, there are the usual claims by Republicans and Democrats over which party deserves credit for doing the most.

At the same time he may want to give the Democrats—who were in control of both houses of congress—the credit due them for their part of the record.

THE EISENHOWER ADMINISTRATION can take credit for initiating the biggest highway construction program in U. S. history.

Neither party's record looks good for 1956 but for school construction, the Eisenhower administration proposed 250 million dollars.

While previous Democratic administrations started U. S. social security, the GOP can take full credit for the 83rd congress extensions and increases in benefits.

The Eisenhower administration initiated an increase in minimum wages. But it must be remembered that the congress refused to accept the President's recommendation for a raise from 70 to 90 cents an hour, and made it a full dollar.

The administration rates an "A" for attempts to get the government out of competition with private enterprise on business-type operations. This effort was blocked, however, by the congress reserving to itself the right to reject any proposal to close down government operation which it wanted to keep going in any locality.

The administration made a sincere effort to continue its military assistance and foreign economic aid programs at a high level. This was reflected by an intense-minded congress which insisted on cutting appropriations.

On the other hand, Democratic leaders tried to force on the administration larger air force appropriations than the defense department officials had asked for.

Voters can censure or praise these records according to tastes and convictions.

Under the system of checks and balances of one branch of government by another, there are some things to be said in favor of having congress controlled by one party and the executive controlled by the other.

### U. S. Business Still Counting Steady Profits

NEW YORK, July 31 (AP)—American corporations on the whole continue to make more profits than in previous years. But weakness in some key industries pulled the average down from the steady percentage gains from the reporting some months back.

In the first six months of 1956 net profits after taxes for 448 corporations, the first to report, averaged 17.4 per cent higher than the first half of 1955. But a year ago the first half of 1955 net profit was 34.7 per cent higher than the first six months of 1954.

About three out of four corporations, however, show increases this year. These were 120 companies which fell below the earnings they reported in the first half of last year. However, companies reported in the red during the first half of this year. In the previous year 71 did.

### Admiral Hails Navy's Power To Repel Foe

WASHINGTON, July 31 (AP)—Admiral Arleigh A. Burke, chief of naval operations, today said the navy has no desire to preempt the role of the air force, but he said the navy is ready and will be able to contribute to a strategic-or long-range bombing-attack if called on to do so.

"If a general war should start with a surprise atomic attack, naval forces operating well dispersed are in the best position to retaliate," he said.

"After the first blows on the principal stations are launched, the navy alone may remain sufficiently undamaged to carry forward a continuing powerful attack."

Burke outlined the role and capabilities of naval air power in secret testimony before a senate armed services subcommittee investigating whether the United States is losing air superiority to Russia. A transcript of his testimony, censored by the defense department, was released last night.

Burke expressed confidence the navy can handle the threat posed by Russia's fleet of aircraft carriers but said it would be a "rough job."

### 2 Snake Dams Being Geared To Join Pool

WASHINGTON, July 31 (AP)—Two witnesses testified before a power commission examiner yesterday that the proposed Snake river hydroelectric development by the Pacific Northwest Power company is designed to fit into the power pool of that area.

The northwest power pool is made up of 11 operating systems including the Bonneville power administration and major private utilities which operate as an integrated system in five states.

The proposed new power units for which Pacific Northwest is seeking an FPC license are the Mountain River and Pleasant Valley dams on the Snake river, a short distance below Hells canyon on the Idaho-Oregon border.

Marshall Blair, vice president of the Washington Water Power company, one of the companies that combined to form Pacific Northwest, told FPC examiner Edward Marshall. The project was studied at its power output for many years of historical river flows as a unit of the Northwest power pool. Its design limits were established by the pool operator and then checked against the requirements of the existing companies.

### Quake Reported

VIENNA, July 31 (AP)—Radio Budapest reported an earthquake about 30 miles south of the Hungarian capital yesterday.

The radio said the tremor was strong near the earthquake in south Hungary last January when several villages were damaged. Radio Budapest said no damage had been reported.

### WHY WE CALL IT . . . Fourth of July Canyon

Capt. John Mulvan built the historic Mulvan military road from Ft. Benton, Mont., to Ft. Walla Walla, Wash., in 1839-1842.

On July 4, 1863, Mulvan and his party camped beneath a giant white pine tree in the rugged Coeur d'Alene mountains about midway between the location of the present cities of Kellogg and Coeur d'Alene. Some of the Mulvan party carried the date, July 4, 1863, on the big tree. It has been preserved to this day, although the bark of the tree has encroached upon the original carrying.

U. S. Highway 10 now follows the old Mulvan road in many places and is just a stone's throw from the old Mulvan tree.

The seven-mile stretch through the beautiful, narrow canyon has been known for many years as Fourth of July canyon in honor of Mulvan and his men.

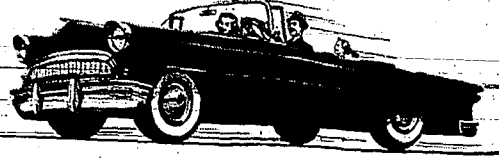
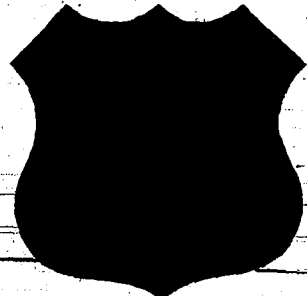
