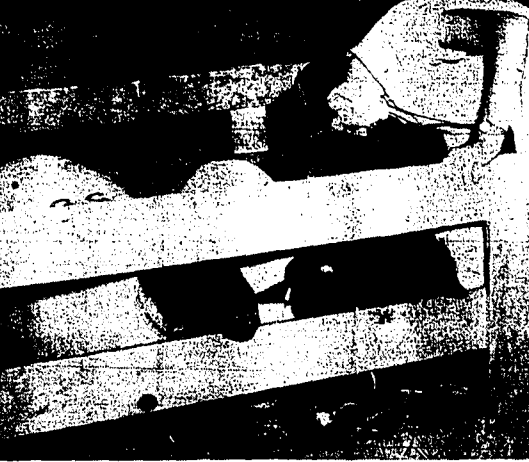

Quiet Drive Going on Toward Higher Cost of Living in-U.S.; Causes Cited

NEW YORK, Aug. 1—A push for aluminum are awaited as inflation to operate profit margins shows up in the mid-west earnings of many companies. And on the Paris market the price of gold jumped to a two-year high, apparently out of general uncertainty over the world situation.

The price rises on consumer goods being announced now are the result of past increases in the costs of materials and labor. Those being announced or awaited on metals and other commodities reflect fears over future supplies of raw materials and higher production costs.

It is a slow form of inflation—one that Americans have become used to since the war and one that apparently they rather like. They may grumble about the higher cost of living but they like the added income that accompanies or precedes it. Most of them apparently fear and dislike the alternative—inflation.

What rising operating costs are in the case of crude oil, where pro-

duction is being held below capacity but operating costs are rising. The operation of a few of the biggest companies to a price rise has prevented one so far. But this could change if the supply of mid-east oil should be cut off at the Suez canal.

Most of the mid-west earnings reports will follow the wage hike this year, which in turn is to be followed by a similar wage increase next year and a third one in the year after that.

As this trend toward lower wage contracts, with steady pay increases each year, spreads through industry in general, management can figure on constantly rising labor costs as part of their pricing problem.

They will also seek to update their machinery to cut labor costs and search for substitutes for expensive materials.

The ones to suffer most from the slow trend toward higher costs of living will be, as usual, those on fixed incomes—pensions, annuities, life insurance payments.

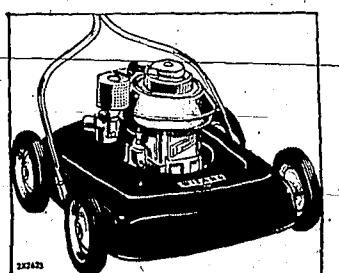

Flood Waters Still Covering State's Farms

BONNERS FERRY, Aug. 1 (AP)—The Kootenai river flood ended officially about two months ago, but still covered thousands of acres of rich farm land today. It was just a rough guess, but I'd say 2,000 acres of farm land still are under water or still are very wet, said Charles F. Howard, assistant county flood coordinator.

"It's been dropping more rapidly in recent days. Maybe by the first week of September, it will be back to its banks everywhere between Bonners Ferry and the Canadian border."

Some families have been unable to get back to their farm homes and others have returned only during the last few days, Howard said.

"There'll be no crops at all planted in the lands that were flooded this year," he said. Most of the farmers who have been able to get back on their flooded land have been clearing away silt and debris and repairing their homes, outbuildings and fences. Dike repair work is expected to start in September.

About 19,000 acres were flooded last spring when the snow-melted Kootenai crested at a record height of about 27 feet and actually lapped at the tops of the dike-dike projects in the town of Bonners Ferry, and the lying farm land.

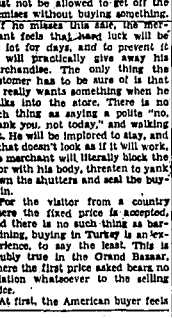

Allocation for Western Dams Is Announced

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1 (U.S. News)—The Federal Power Commission today announced that "equitable" allocations of power from 130 projected dams in South Dakota and Wyoming will be reserved for both "preference" and "non-preference" customers in those states.

The directive was written into the bill authorizing these and other water projects, which was passed by Congress last Friday and is now on President Eisenhower's desk.

The provision directs the secretary of the interior to determine and set aside a share of power from Big Bend dam in South Dakota and the two Sully dams in Idaho for the "preference" of the two states.

By law, preference in the allocation of power from federal dams is given to public bodies, such as municipalities, public power districts and rural electric cooperatives.

But the special provision in this year's bill calls for allocation of "preference" of power from "equitable" dams for all people in the two states, preference and non-preference, before power is sold to preference customers in other nearby states.

Boiseans Favor School Program

BOISE, Aug. 1 (U.S. News)—Boise school board, after years of reversals, have won approval of a plan to expand the city's high school system.

Boiseans voted 6,641 to 1,228 yesterday in favor of a \$2,118,000 bond issue to construct a new building, buy two other new sites and modernize the present high school.

The 22 per cent majority was far more than the two-thirds margin needed for approval.

In recent years the voters have turned down two proposed bond issues for building one new school.

The current plan was proposed by a standing university research team.

Shortages of Power Noted In Northwest

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—An increasing power capacity shortage in the Pacific Northwest was forecast today as a federal power commission hearing.

Arthur J. Porter, general manager of the Portland (Ore.) General Electric company, said the deficiency will occur even if Pacific Northwest power company is licensed to build two new power dams on the Snake river at the Idaho-Oregon border.

Porter said that even with the proposed Mountain Sheep and Snake Valley dams, which would add 1,000 megawatts to the Snake just below the canyon, there is expected to be a power deficiency of 1,500,000 kilowatts capacity by 1960 and 1,250,000 by 1962.

Without the two dams the deficiency would amount to more than one million kilowatts by 1960 and more than two million by 1962, he said.

Pacific Northwest power company was formed by Portland General Electric company, Washington Water Power company, Montana Power company and Pacific Power and Light company.

Alvin Smith, Pacific Northwest attorney, asked Porter whether there was any possibility of meeting the projected deficiency in the organization of company operations from some other source, such as the Bonneville power administration.

"No substantial amount of our deficiency could be so covered," Porter replied.

The Pacific Northwest application is opposed by the National Electric association which claims federal dams on the Snake river would produce greater benefits.

Senator Danforth of Oregon returned the hearing—until this afternoon to permit Mrs. Evelyn Cooper, chief justice attorney, to appear before the commission.

The commission is to hold a public hearing on the proposed Snake river dams at Boise, Idaho, on August 15.

Supply of Oil For Allies Is Termed Vital

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—Sen. Mike Mansfield said today that the United States should pressure the Western European countries to supply oil in the event Egypt closes the Suez Canal.

The Montana Democrat, a member of the senate foreign relations committee, urged a calm approach to the canal problem. But he said oil is vital for maintaining the economy of Western Europe, and if Western Europe slumps, the western alliance becomes a cardboard commitment.

He said 50 per cent of Western Europe's oil comes from the Middle East, most of it through the Suez canal. Another means of getting the oil—the pipeline which runs across Jordan to the Mediterranean—might also be shut down if Egypt closed the canal, he said.

Mansfield said the United States should be prepared to ship oil to Western Europe from this country and from Venezuela if Egypt should shut down the canal. He said it should also be shut down if Egypt closed the canal, he said.

Mansfield said the United States should take these steps to bypass the canal rather than trying to keep it open by force.

"The western powers should bring the dispute before the international court of justice because of the international status of the canal zone and the lease granted to the Suez Canal company until 1968," Mansfield added.
