## Moose, Bighorn Sheep, Mountain Goat Permits Are Reported for Magic Valley

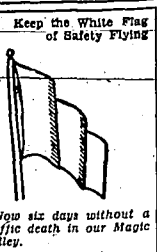

### Disease Rate Reported for Magic Valley

Magic Valley's counties reported 1,019 cases of notifiable diseases during 1935, according to the annual report of the state bureau of vital statistics.

In Owyhee county there were four cases of polio, one typhoid fever, three whooping cough, one measles, three influenza, two tuberculosis, 27 cancer and 23 others.

Blaine county reported six cases of polio, three cases of measles, two tuberculosis, 25 cancer, one undulant fever, 46 gonorrhea, three syphilis and 11 others.

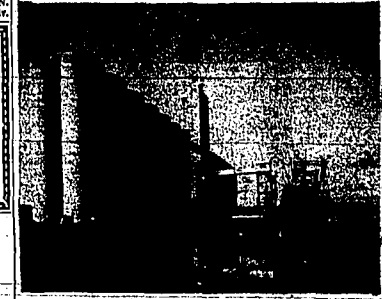

### 3,000,000 Bushel Capacity At New Stockton Grain Terminal

At Stockton, California, the West Coast's newest and most modern grain terminal is ending its first year of operation. Jack Harley, General Manager, states they are busily preparing to meet the heavy storage demand by wheat farmers in the Magic Valley of Idaho.

Terminal loan at Stockton, under the Government's Price Support Program, figures \$2.29 per bushel on Number 1 white wheat.
