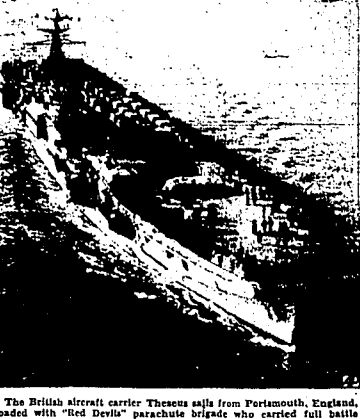

### Budge Is Hit For Votes on School Issue

BURLEY, Aug. 8—John W. Reynolds, Democratic candidate for second district U. S. representative, Wednesday charged Republican Rep. Hamer Budge with "a cross political maneuver" in joining with 96 other GOP congressmen in detaching a school construction bill during the last session of congress.

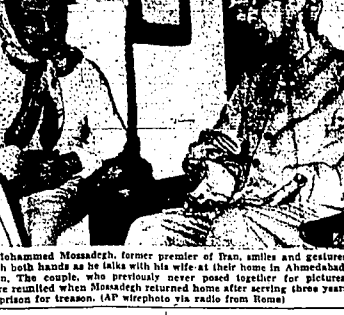
Reynolds charged Budge "detached the specific voting of President Eisenhower by voting for the so-called Powell amendment which would deny funds to any school district failing to comply with the supreme court's desegregation . . . In this, Reynolds asserted, "he knew that he was sharply reducing the chances of passing any school aid bill."

Reynolds also charged Budge "then proceeded to vote against the entire school aid bill, largely on the grounds that it was not in record with the Democratic Eisenhower's wishes."

The Democratic candidate said he "thought that both the problem of educating our children in decent schools, and the great moral question of affording equal educational opportunities for all citizens, regardless of race, were above such cross political maneuvering."

Budge didn't see it that way and chose, instead, to play politics with both of these vital issues.

### Price Tag for Autos Is High In Yugoslavia

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, Aug. 8 (AP)—Price tags on automobiles in Communist Yugoslavia are hard to believe.

A little German Volkswagen costs \$12,000. A Yugoslav-assembled Italian Fiat 600, just about the smallest of Europe's tiny automobiles, goes for \$2,500.

A standard-size Italian-made taxpayer costing \$100 in Italy sells for \$150 here.

And those prices are, figures at 400 dinars to the dollar—a rate only foreign tourists get. Yugoslavs pay a third more.

"There is no official explanation of the markup. The most common unofficial story is that the government keeps prices high to hold down purchases and conserve scarce foreign currency."

One result: "Traffic and parking are no problem. You can drive for miles in the countryside without seeing a car. In the cities, parking space is available almost anywhere you want it."

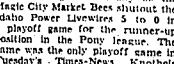

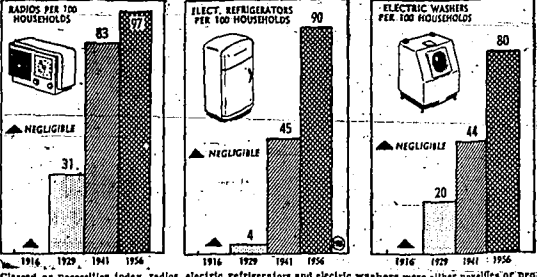

(Second in a Series)

CHICAGO, Aug. 5—John Drost said today that his sons are "real American boys."

He said it with pride in his voice and a quiet smile in his eyes. It was plain he thought it was the best any dad could say about his sons.

"They like hamburgers and hot dogs and all those things just like every American boy," he said. "Rudolph is a Boy Scout and George is a Cub Scout, and they have lots of friends. Neither has a sign of an accent."

"I think they'll make good American citizens," he dreamed about that.

Before Drost, 47, and his wife, Doris, 36, began to dream about a new life in America for their children, there were years of nightmare living under the Nazi and then the communists in their native Czechoslovakia.

When Hitler's troops marched into Czechoslovakia in 1939, Drost was a practicing lawyer in Brno and his wife was a kindergarten teacher. His associations with liberal Czechs led to his arrest by the Gestapo in 1943, a short prison term and forced labor in a factory.

With the liberation of Czechoslovakia in 1945, Drost reopened his law office. Three years later his communists took over the government. They confiscated all Drost's assets, some \$40,000.

Friends urged Drost that the communists were preparing to arrest.

### Alloy of Steel Important for Modern Uses

NEW YORK, Aug. 8 (AP)—Some of the most important uses of stainless steel today are in the heat barrier at airports, in the heat shields up an airplane miles an hour, in the alloy used for the bright alloy pipes to mark off as its own the space it came out of the kitchen. 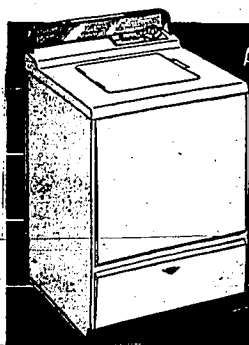

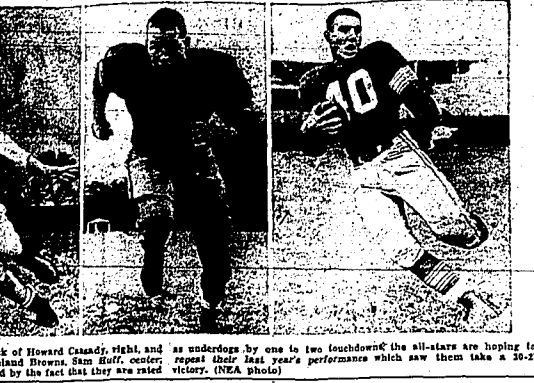

The public also must share the blame, Dodd said, because of making excessive demands on coaches to produce great teams and by paying "big money" to subsidize athletes.

The cure for recruiting troubles, Dodd said, must start at the high school level. High school players, he said, must be given the moral backing to make them immune from "under the table" subsidy offers.

Dodd will continue his discussion of the philosophy of coaching at Wednesday's session of the clinic. It will be headed by Jerry DeLoach, clinic director.
