### Hell Ship Use Is Backed by Justice Chief

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24 (AP)—The justice department yesterday defended the use of a vessel described as "hell ship" for transporting illegal "wetbacks" back to their native Mexico.

Rep. Robert H. Mollohan, D., W. Va., had asked the department why it permitted the immigration service to carry 500 Mexicans aboard the *Mercurio*, a World War II corvette, which normally carries 50 to 80 persons.

Mollohan said his house government operations subcommittee learned that the *Mercurio*, a Mexican flag vessel, had only two life boats with a combined capacity of 48. Subcommittee investigators also reported the ship apparently carried too few life jackets and lacked adequate sanitation and sleeping facilities.

They said it resembled an ancient "death ship."

Deputy Attorney General William F. Rogers said in a letter to Mollohan that the vessel was chartered from a Mexican firm by the U.S. military sea transport service with the approval of the U.S. and Mexican governments.

He also said the crew and U.S. and Mexican officials aboard eat the same food as the passengers during the 48-hour voyage in the Gulf of Mexico from Port Isabel, Tex., to Vera Cruz, Mexico. He said use of the *Mercurio* was the most efficient way of depositing wetbacks who enter the country illegally to labor on farms.

"There is no intention on the part of the department of justice to impose any punishment upon the illegal entrance," he added.

In replying to Mollohan's letter, the department refused to make public the letter from Mollohan to Attorney General Herbert Brownell, Jr., listing the alleged abuses.

Mollohan's office said he also had written and alleged violations of military sea transport service and the coast guard but had received no replies.

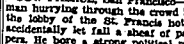

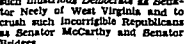

 shall claim "the state might as well fold up if the referendum passes because the grower won't make enough money to live."  
 Meanwhile, a check of four Twin Falls potato dealers and warehousemen showed three opposed to the referendum and a fourth who was in favor of the referendum was the confederate of the grower, not the dealer and refused to take a stand. The remaining dealers were unavailable for comment.  
 "It's definitely against it," said J. H. Henry, Kimberly. "I don't enjoy potatoes, and the referendum is asking for some more government control to deprive citizens of operations they like to sell themselves."  
 He added that the proposed amendments would impose hardships on both growers and shippers. "We're fully capable of handling our own business," Henry continued.  
 Rex D. Mathews, Twin Falls, said the amendments were all right with him if the growers want them, but he would rather have the state run its own business. He indicated that although he would go along with the amendments if adopted, he was personally opposed to them.  
 A spokesman for Long Valley Farm company said that although he would rather not comment for the firm, he felt "the referendum is a way away from federal control, the better off they will be."  
 A spokesman for Idaho Potatoes, Inc. said that that firm had decided not to vote on the referendum, but "it's a matter for the growers to decide themselves."  
 Dealers were generally agreed that the amendments regarding Idaho potatoes were "a good thing, but would force many small operators out of business."  
 Mathews said, in his opinion, "stamping can't be done on potatoes if it does not wait, and because of the cost of stamping machines, it will let the state make compulsory. Many growers have neither the space nor the money for the machines."  
 He predicted, however, that "the time will come when all Idaho potatoes are stamped but it will take a few years."  
 Henry said that stamping would stop potatoes grown in other states from being packed off as Idaho potatoes.  
 The Long Valley Farms spokesman said he "supposed the stamping was all right," but added that his firm had decided against using the machine.  
 "The cost of stamping will put many small operators out of business," he predicted for the Idaho Potatoes spokesman. "With the quality of last year's potatoes what it was, it was a shame to label them," he added.

### July Increase Reported for Worker Lists

Aided by the completion of the Green Giant canning company plant in Huhl and the natural gas pipeline through Magic Valley, more agricultural employment in Idaho is estimated to be 2000 higher in July than in July, 1935, according to a report issued by the Idaho employment security agency headquarters, Boise.

Completion of a number of farm row crop activities resulted in an increase of 2400 workers employed on Idaho farms from June 15 to July 15, however, their weekly earnings were higher during the period than during a similar period last year, resulting in lower work weeks.

The Green Giant plant is expected to employ about 275 local workers for a six-week period, laying off the Twin Falls gas pipeline is expected to begin soon.

With "exceptionally good" crops and favorable weather, farmers here last month to harvest early fall crops with the dry peck harvest and heavy and weekly earnings are expected to be higher.

The heavy demand for agricultural workers in and around Boise during the early part of July and again near the end of the month, according to the report. Job opportunities in non-agricultural industries continued to decline slow for the summer season, however.

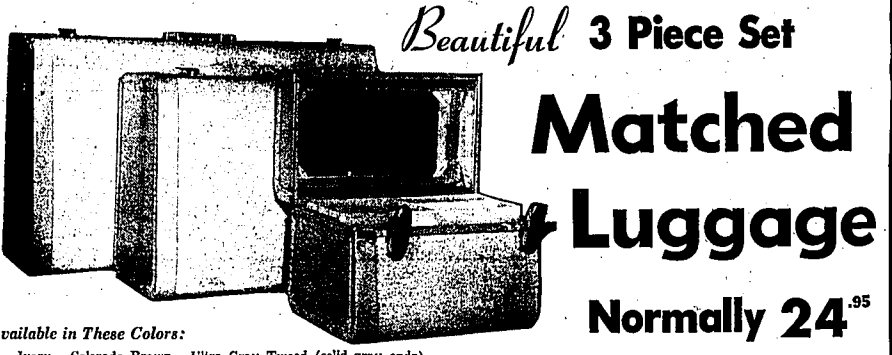
