It was the same with the late Franklin D. Roosevelt at Philadelphia in 1936. He was the greatest Democratic figure to appear since Woodrow Wilson. His party showed how it valued him by renominating him by acclamation.

In some quarters there has been sarcastic comment about Republican claims that the conclave at San Francisco was an "open" convention. If the comment was intended to have any application to the open choice of Mr. Eisenhower, it is plainly foolish.

Does anyone have any doubt that the President was the overwhelming choice of that convention? That being so, there could have been no other result but to name him by acclamation, just as happened in Mr. Roosevelt's case at Philadelphia.

Even if the Republicans had a stable full of men of presidential stature, Mr. Eisenhower would have won the nomination on the basis of his evident high standing with the American people.

Much has been said to the effect that Republican leaders "forced" the President to run again because they feared they'd lose in 1940 without him. There is a good deal of evidence, however, that he wanted to make the race, both to advance his programs and to try to reshape the GOP in his image.

Once he resolved the question of his physical fitness to his own satisfaction, he did not hesitate to jump into the fray. It is abundantly clear that millions of Americans—Republicans, Democrats and independents—wanted Mr. Eisenhower to seek reelection. Therefore, though some Republican leaders may have been serving their selfish ends when they urged him to run, they also were serving the wishes of many voters.

At Chicago the Democrats chose in Adlai Stevenson a man who fits the temperate mood of the nation. When they renamed Mr. Eisenhower at San Francisco, the GOP selected a man who for nearly four years has been giving expression to that mood.

Unquestionably these are the choices that best suit the people. Now 50 to 60 million Americans must decide which of the two men is best qualified—by all measures—to handle their affairs in the coming four years.

MEMORIES. There were only two really sincere expressions of longing for return of the good old days from conservative Republicans of importance at this GOP convention.

One came from President Herbert Hoover, who got into his third farewell speech another plea for return to the protective tariff of the Republican Old Guard. President Hoover noted with satisfaction that the Democrats were returning to this principle "after 100 years of Republican instruction."

Two Leaders To Be Given Main Awards

NEW YORK, Aug. 27 (AP)—President Ramon Magasayay of the Philippines and Gov. Luis Munoz Marin of Puerto Rico are the winners of the 1956 Freedom House awards, it was announced today.

The announcement of the awards was made by Whitney North Seymour, Freedom House chairman of the board, and Dr. Harry D. Clodius, president.

This year, for the first time, Freedom House canvassed 25,000 representative Americans with a mailing of nominating petitions, and their announcements... From the board named five candidates who were voted upon in a confidential ballot by previous American recipients of awards.

Previous winners who voted for Magasayay and Munoz Marin are Walter Lippman, Sumner Welles, Ben, George C. Marshall, Bernard M. Baruch, Gen. Lucius D. Clay, David E. Lilienthal, Dean Acheson, Paul G. Hoffman, James B. Conant, Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway and Edward R. Murrow.

President Magasayay will receive the freedom award for "teaching his people how to use their newly gained freedom to develop their great potentialities and demonstrating the advantages of the democratic way of life in an area of the world beset by the forces of dictatorship, according to the citation.

Gov. Munoz will be given a Freedom House 1956 anniversary plaque because "under his guidance the people of a free commonwealth have demonstrated the effectiveness of democracy in an under-developed country." The Puerto Rican governor was cited for his "dynamic leadership and the creative techniques (which) are in a great measure responsible for the striking progress of the Puerto Rican people toward a better life."

The awards will be made at the 15th annual dinner of Freedom House on Oct. 7. President Magasayay will be represented by U.S. Ambassador Carlos P. Romulo of the Philippines.

Freedom House was founded in 1941 "to serve as a center advancing the goals of a free society and opposed to all forms of totalitarianism."
