### Suez Income Is Secret but May Be Loss

CAIRO, Egypt, Aug. 28 (UP)—Egyptian authorities refuse to disclose how much money they are collecting in running the red.

Informal sources estimate that approximately \$200,000 of the tolls are passing through the canal are still paying their tolls to the old Suez Canal company and into accounts blocked by the western powers.

On the basis of the Suez Canal company's 1933 balance sheet, this would leave approximately 10 1/2 million Egyptian pounds (\$27,750,000) yearly for Egypt.

In 1933, canal tolls totaled \$22,000,000 Egyptian pounds (\$55,500,000) out of gross receipts of \$42,000,000 Egyptian pounds (\$105,000,000). The balance of receipts was made up of monies brought forward from the previous year and the interest thereon.

In 1933, expenses totaled \$22,120,000 Egyptian pounds (\$55,300,000) which means that Egypt probably is running in the red at present by about half a million Egyptian pounds monthly. It must be borne in mind, however, that this sum covers only the operating expenses of the canal. It does not include long term capital improvements.

In addition, Egypt has asked the old Suez Canal company's considerable cash holdings in this country as a means of using them for running expenses.

This position, however, contrasts with last year when Egypt had a surplus of \$22,228,000 Egyptian pounds (\$55,571,000) from canal operations, including an agrarian service per cent of the profit—amounting to 1,075,918 Egyptian pounds (\$2,697,795). The surplus million toll was made up of profits, taxes, income taxes and the agrarian service.

The informed sources pointed out, however, that the old Suez Canal company set aside last year large sums for its works programs and reserve contingency funds, which would be impossible for Egypt to match under present circumstances.

The new Suez Canal company (which was set up after Egypt nationalized the old firm) is meeting its payroll fully and no reports have been received of any troubles in that direction.

Company employees outside Egypt presumably are being paid by the old Suez Canal company, which has its headquarters in Paris.

How long Egypt will continue to accept this situation is anybody's guess. But there is little doubt that the country can do about as paying tolls to the old company short of retreating from its use of the canal. This is something which Egypt is most anxious to avoid.

Additionally, Egypt could refuse these ships watering and supply facilities and possibly give them the lowest priority in canal convoys, but there is no sign of this at present.

### Kimberly Christian Church's New Pastor Is Due Sept. 16

KIMBERLY, Aug. 28.—The Rev. Paul Edward Kenny will be installed as pastor of the Kimberly Christian church, Sept. 16 by Lloyd Balfour, state secretary of Christian churches.

The Rev. Mr. Kenny comes to Kimberly from Stamford, Neb., where he was called pastor of Stamford Christian church.

The Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Kenny have four children, one of whom will attend Phillips University, And, Okla., this fall and was who will enroll in Twin Falls Business college.

He fills the vacancy left by the Rev. Raymond Helseth, who moved to Oregon earlier this summer.

### Russ Citizens Study Roster, Ignore Yanks

(Editor's note: The following dispatch from Moscow was delayed in transmission from Moscow.)

SPERDLOVSK, Siberia, Aug. 28 (UP)—Citizens of this mid-Ural industrial boom town crowded Sunday afternoon into billboards denouncing some of their fellow citizens.

The posters showed drawings of alleged adulterers, deserters, other domestic malefactors and pickpockets with their names, addresses and jobs. Notations said they were put up by the city committee of the Communist league.

The signs were in the center of the city on one of the main streets of Lenin boulevard. The viewers were so interested they ignored the presence of three touring American correspondents who were the first of their kind ever to venture into Sperdlovsk.

The correspondents got into Sperdlovsk after their plane was grounded for eight hours.

After being told they could not enter the city the correspondents decided to leave and made the one-hour journey from the airport.

The city is beautiful, observing standards much higher than Moscow's. The architecture is modern, fresh and clean. There are no slums such as are found in the Soviet capital.

OMSK, Siberia, Aug. 28 (UP)—Commercial air traffic was grounded here Sunday without explanation.

Soviet twin-engine jet bombers took off one after another, while touring correspondents for the New York Times, Columbia Broadcasting Corporation, and the Associated Press watched.

A four-hour delay, the correspondents were permitted to proceed to Sperdlovsk, where they were grounded again for eight hours without explanation.
