Use of Colors Is Advocated For Industry

NEW YORK, Sept. 3 (AP)—Colors that will follow the yellow brick road may be the answer to the "color" problem of industry, according to a study conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The study, which is part of a larger program to improve industrial safety, found that many accidents occur because workers cannot distinguish between different parts of machinery or equipment.

By using a standard color code, it is believed that accidents could be reduced. For example, red could be used for stop buttons, green for start buttons, and yellow for warning signals.

Ideas Listed

Among the suggestions are that red and blue electrical switches with the "on" button colored green and the "off" button colored red, and bolts and nuts with a standard index color for each size. This idea is to use color instead of words to convey a message. It is easier and faster to read words.

Washburn has made some surprising discoveries in the application of color to industrial equipment. He thinks these and similar developments may give birth to whole new branches of industry.

Washburn and other color experts learned that a crane, tractor, or bulldozer operator should be able to see the color of the equipment he is using on his job and at the same time look at the color of his control panel.

They introduced color into such machinery and found it was given better care, needed fewer repairs, and often led the operator to do more and better work.

Washburn has used color in small mechanical and electronic parts to convey a message and at the same time produce the psychological reaction that results in better care.

Swedish Bechtel, Inc., has designed a way to convey a variety of information to the user. Washburn designed the new switch with permanent color markings. After it was put into use, the manufacturer found workers abused the part so much less in handling that there were 25 per cent fewer rejects from the ultimate consumer.

"That was an incidental bonus the manufacturer got by using color in the product," Washburn said. "We are making discoveries like that constantly."

Importance Seen

He thinks the color of a product makes for general compliance and makes the difference between its success or failure.

"People sometimes don't know exactly why they buy or don't buy a product," Washburn said. "The reason is that its design or color has a psychological effect that they don't completely understand.

"Good design and color and these things and build features appeal. One of the most effective ways to do that is with color."

"Crazy Plant" Chemical May Be Crop Help

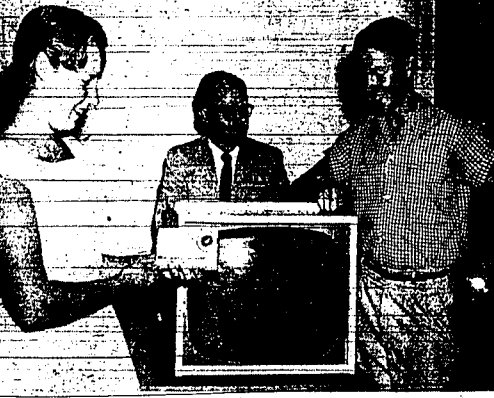
STORRS, Conn., Sept. 3 (AP)—Government and other scientists are studying a chemical which may be used to help rice plants grow better and to prevent them from being eaten by insects.

The scientists are looking to determine whether practical compounds can be made from a plant-stimulating substance called gibberellin acid. It is derived from a fungus that has long been a major pest of rice because it causes a malady the Japanese call "crazy plant" disease. The disease causes excessive elongation of the rice plant and reduced yield.

A U.S. department of agriculture report, describing dramatic results in promoting the growth of rice plants in greenhouse and field trials, says that in some cases rice has now grown in places where it had never before. The chemical may be used in the way that gibberellin acid is used in the laboratory, researchers in the United States and other countries are studying throughout the world.

The U.S. department of agriculture research service, made reports on the use of the chemical in the annual convention of Biological Sciences at the University of Connecticut, Sept. 2-3.

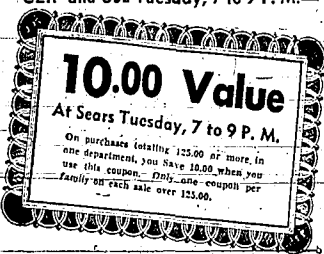





Carvings Are Uncovered in Indian Ruins

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 3 (AP)—Five carvings are being uncovered in an ancient Indian mound located west of here in what may be the latest continuously inhabited area of the world, an archeologist says.

The mound is being excavated in a ravine between the Delta Dam, across the Columbia river east of here. The dam's reservoir will flood this site in 1952.

B. Robert Butler, University of Washington archeologist, directing the excavations with funds from the National Park Service, said the City Club in a talk here that the culture of the mid-Columbia area had been traced from 18,000 years ago to the present. There are remains of cities older than that, he said, but none conclusively occupied.

The original inhabitants are believed to have been Indians, probably from Asia, and the Indians living in the area now are close to being their direct descendants, Butler believes.

The exploration by Butler is in the Wapinitum mound on the Washington side of the Columbia river some four miles upstream from the dam, 30 miles east of here.

Dr. Z. N. Kraushaar of the University of Oregon is exploring another ancient site here.

Butler said hundreds of fine carvings in stone and bone have been discovered from Wapinitum mound. In an adjacent valley, he said, other carvings have been uncovered.

"The same carvings done in marble," Butler said, "would rival that of Greece and Rome."

WASHINGTON, Sept. 3 (AP)—Senator Mansfield, D. Mont., said Saturday the time "is here or near" for another summit conference to explore prospects for peace and an end of the atomic arms race.

"If we keep up this thermo-nuclear weapons race, something is going to sit on their God help us," he said. "The people are aware of this and I sincerely hope that those who have the responsibility of governing nations act as fully aware."

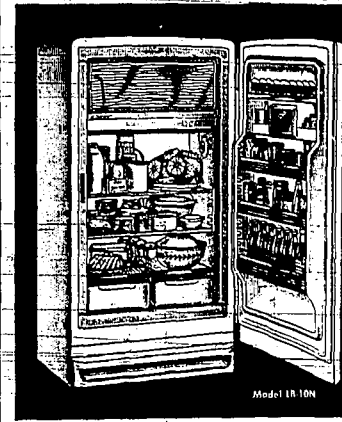

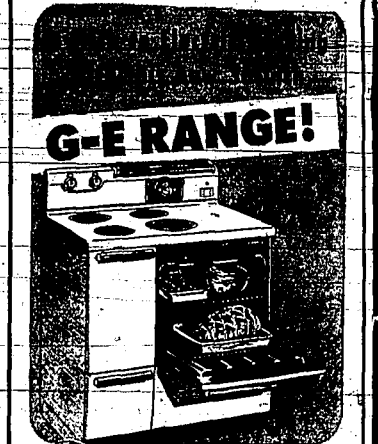

Labor Leader Sets Drive to Assist Demos

WASHINGTON, Sept. 3 (AP)—Vice President Walter Reuther said today that four million dollars for the Democratic Party will be raised through a drive to assist Democratic candidates.

Reuther said union dues will not be paid until the party has completed its political efforts to be completely financed by voluntary contributions.

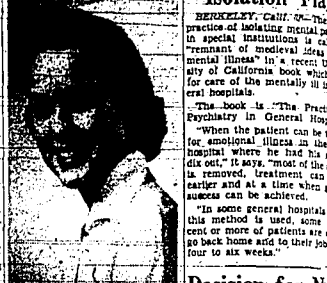

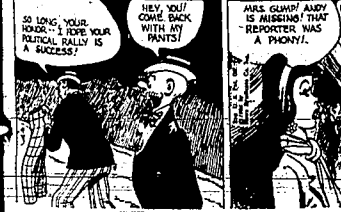

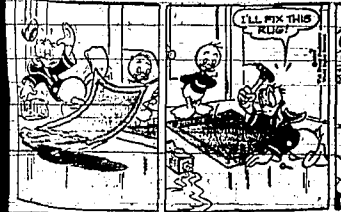
