## Article in Paper Dashes Hope for Canal Settlement

CAIRO, Sept. 4 (AP)—The government newspaper Al Gharbia today dashed hopes that Egypt might accept the Dulles plan for the Suez canal. The paper attacked the Dulles plan as a "miserable plan" and called for a nationalization of the canal.

Members of the ruling military junta, blasted the Dulles mission with a five-point rejection of the Dulles plan.

Publication of the attack in the government organ gave it more than a semi-official stamp. The blast against the Dulles plan came a few hours before President Gamal Abdel Nasser was to meet with the five-nation Suez committee. Informed sources said Nasser would reply, then to the Dulles plan.

Austrian Prime Minister Robert Schusner, head of the five-nation Suez committee, was optimistic. But new war threats, increased military preparations and a sudden news report that the British had increased tension in this area.

The Gharbia commentary was addressed to Nasser himself. "You could have an idea of our settlement," it declared. "You were to propose a similar situation in your own country—your own country—your own country."

The article also condemned the Anglo-French military preparations in the Mediterranean and hinted they would be linked with the Suez mission.

## "Mystery Object" Is Noted Over Montana

KALISPELL, Mont., Sept. 4 (AP)—An unexplained "mystery object," described by separate witnesses as a "shining triangle" and an "orange ball," hovered in the sky near here late last night.

Five Starline jet interceptors from Missoula military force base were "scrambled" in an attempt to sight the object but were thwarted by low clouds. The planes were equipped with radar. Air force and civilian officials viewed the object and were unable to identify it as a natural phenomenon.

The object was seen by a group of five men and a woman at 10:30 p.m. at Kalispell. The object was reported to be about 4,000 feet in the air and was located about 100 yards from the observer.

BOISE, Sept. 4.—Pacific Northwest "rockhounds" ended their annual convention yesterday after putting on a show which drew some 1,000 spectators to look at exhibits ranging from a petted palm tree to the fossilized tooth of an immense mammoth.

## Bumper Crop of White Clover Is Grown on Farm

M. G. Lauterbach refused to gamble on a new product to his farm, White Dutch clover, and retained his decision somewhat after the yield ran 33 bushels per acre. To be safe, he had split a 30 acre field, planting the white type in one half and the other half in red clover. He is not too disappointed as the red clover also showed an above average yield.

Raised on his farm east of Hamman, Lauterbach reports this is the second year the field has been planted. He adds the seed is "very clean." From the 15 acres planted, he harvested 123 bags of seed. Although exact price was not immediately known, he said it ran about 90 cents a pound.

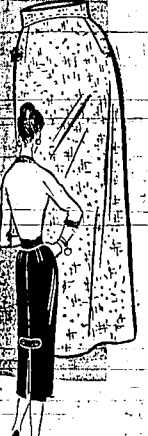

A host of little children will be starting their school days this month. This is a great experience for them. Many of them will be a little afraid. All of them will be excited. They will be nervous, but that is the way it is. This is their mother's responsibility.

Sound health, which means bodily comfort, is highly important. All the regulations required by the school laws should be completed before time and the certificates placed in an envelope together with the birth certificate in a place of safety and ready convenience. 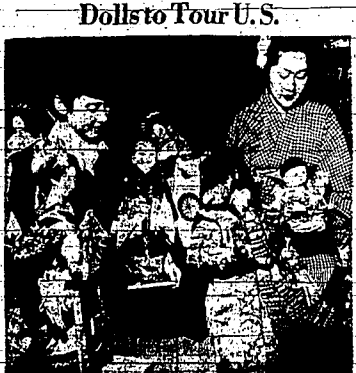

### Yankee Girls Are Seen on Viet Beaches

BAIGON, Sept. 4 (AP)—American girls in one-piece bathing suits show themselves to the French men and women at the exclusive French Athletic club, Cercle Sportif Saigonais, in the South Vietnamese capital.

Along the blue-tiled swimming pool, the English language is as common as French. But club directors, seeing the French membership dwindle, complain that the American members rarely have the swimming pool to spend leisure in the dining room or bar of the gambling clubhouse.

The Americans come here to swim with their own groups, one French member said, "then they go home. They don't seem to take any real part in our club."

But American boys and girls have come to South Vietnam, carried out of the old French Indochina—a land with few foreigners knew until the battle for Dien Bien Phu.

About 1,000 Americans now live in South Vietnam. The vast majority are government people. A handful are businessmen exploring new trade opportunities, newspapermen and missionaries.

Because Saigon offers little public entertainment, Americans live close to their homes, visiting each other for cocktails, bridge or dancing or walking with hi-fi or calling on the city.

American schools, private and public, are established by U. S. government employees. Americans in Vietnam seem to mingle less with the Vietnamese than Americans do with the Japanese in Japan or the Chinese in Formosa. The native population has no love for French rule but they still respect French culture.

VIETNAMESE waiters raise their eyebrows when an American diner asks for ice water instead of wine. But the French owner of one downtown restaurant admitted that the "little" of Americans forced him to change his rules.

"In the old days," he said, "I never permitted a French soldier to sit in my place. We served only officers. But now, the American presence has more money in his pocket than the French colonel. So I serve all Americans."

American businessmen hope they can open up new trade between the French colony and the United States.

"This country has some of the finest undeveloped timber, Alaska. I have seen it in Asia," one businessman said. "We should like to move in and develop them if the government will let us."
