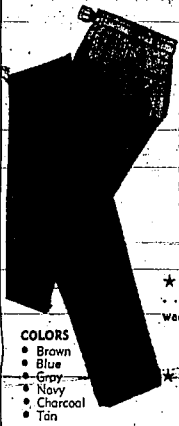

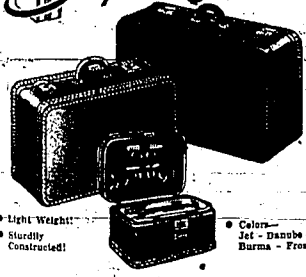

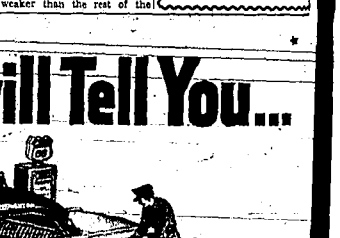

The report was an indication of what the legion program would be for the coming year.

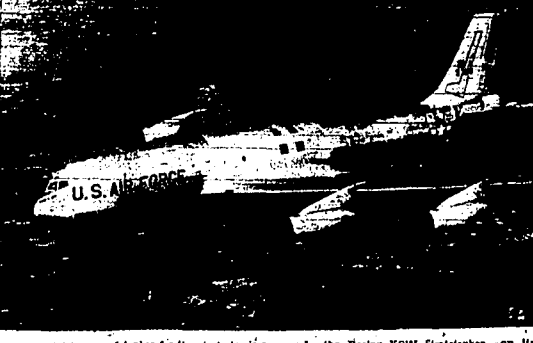
Wagner told the convention that the Legion was the only organization to cross the danger to America represented by the Fund for the Republic—has become a tool of the Communists.

The bill proposed to declare all war veterans over 65 "totally disabled" if their income was less than \$1,400 annually and they have no dependents or \$2,700 if they have dependents. Those falling in the category would be entitled to \$100 monthly pension.

Wagner said in regard to the voluntary reserve training program that the Legion had failed to enlist the limited quota of trainees set by the department of defense.

Ike's Aide Is Asked to Sign Political Code

WASHINGTON, Sept. 5 (U. S. Press) — While House News Secretary James C. Hagerty today faced a barbed Democratic suggestion that he sign a fair campaign practices code, Democratic National Chairman Paul McClellan's suggestion that Hagerty "be invited" to sign the code sponsored by the fair campaign practices committee followed a cross-country flight over a statement by Adlai Stevenson.

Hagerty charged yesterday that the Democratic presidential nominee seems to welcome unemployment as an opportunity to win a few votes. He based the charge on a statement attributed to Stevenson in a story in the New York Times.

McClellan issued Hagerty said last night Hagerty "didn't say anything about the facts." And at Chicago, Clayton Frutcher, Stevenson's news aide, accused Hagerty of taking "two wholly unrelated comments and telescoping them."

McClellan said in a statement the report of Stevenson's remarks was "unfair to Mr. Stevenson." He said it was due to an unfortunate inversion of his remarks, the Times said. "The Times regrets any misinterpretation that may have resulted. The Times is printing the full Stevenson statement."

When the corrected version of Stevenson's statement was called to Hagerty's attention, he declined to make any additional comment on the subject.

Hagerty and Hagerty "must have known that he was taking Mr. Stevenson's remarks out of context. He accused Hagerty of brazen distortion."

"I sincerely hope that today's performance by the President's close personal assistant is a lesson for the Republican tactics in the campaign of 1968," the Democratic National chairman said.

"If Mr. Hagerty is going to become a political spokesman for the 1968 campaign, as he seems to have indicated today, he should be subjected to the same ground rules on accuracy, fair play and veracity which have been accepted by candidates and the chairman of the two major political parties."
