Decline Noted in Job Counts in West Areas

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 10—West and salary employment statistics domestic and agricultural workers, in the eight mountain states declined slightly by 5,200 from June to a July total of 1,591,000, the department of labor reported today.

However, employment in the eight-state area was 47,000, or three per cent, higher than in July of last year.

The mountain states include Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming.

The effect of the "steel strike" on manufacturing and mining, the customary summer employment drop in educational institutions, and the failure of construction to show any gain over June were responsible for the over-the-month loss.

The effects of the strike were noted particularly in Colorado, where total employment declined 6,400, and in Utah, where it was down 3,000. Small seasonal losses occurred in Arizona and New Mexico.

Employment gains occurred in Montana up 1,600 and Nevada (up 1,800).

All mountain states, except Wyoming which showed no change, shared in the increase of 47,000 over July of last year.

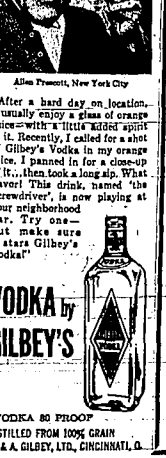

Care of Your Children

By ANGELO PATRI

Sometimes I wonder about the position taken by those who work with boys and girls who fall short of the law. When does a child cease to be a child who thinks as a child and become an adult who thinks like an adult? Considering normal-minded youth, when is a young person a responsible member of society and to be held responsible for his acts? Or when is he to be granted the rights of an adult?

Recently a social worker suggested that the age-of-responsibility be extended to 18 years. Now, really, is a young person 20 who commits murder, tries to be understood as a child, or who did not transcend the manner of his act? I say No. Long before the 20th anniversary, he truly understood, he knew the law, he had the commandment—he had the law. In my book, he should be held responsible for his act and be treated as an adult would be under the conditions.

We are keeping children too long in their childhood and thereby depriving them of growth, responsibility and sound mental and physical health. Every teaching should be given in the eighth grade of elementary school, every grade of elementary school, kindergarten through eighth grade. If a young person is held in their classes who they should be in training for work or even engaged in work.

They teacher knows that there are boys and girls who cannot progress in the classroom with their minds, their hopes, elsewhere. They are forced by the law, backed by the attendance officer, the probation officer and the other social service workers, to all, otherwise, their physical presence being accepted as a blow to education.

New Bumper Is Tested for Safety Guard

Sept. 10 (AP)—Flexible seating or hydraulically mounted bumpers to substantially reduce the danger of crash impact may be the next major safety device to be adopted on passenger automobiles.

Such bumpers already are in the experimental state. If problems of tests and production can be licked they could appear some time in the next model year. Even when these problems have been overcome they still may have to be introduced as extra-cost equipment.

Many engineers and authorities on traffic crashes have said they believe flexible bumpers that would absorb crash impact would greatly reduce fatalities. Some have described the flexible bumper as next in line to the safety lap belt as a means of saving lives.

To meet an objection of inadequate anchoring of the belts, car makers are studying the practicability of integral seats with structural built into the floor. If the seats themselves can be more firmly anchored the seat belts essentially may be fastened to the seats without requiring a connection to the car frame.

The car makers recently have been promoting the advantage of the two, four and six-way adjustable seats. These features present some of the problems being encountered in building the seat structure into the floor.

Adjustable rear seats also are being tested in the laboratories.

Auto makers sometimes are accused of being engaged in a horse-race, more recently have been accused of being engaged in a safety race, with the development of numerous extra-cost safety items.

Engineers who reply that there is no "race" to provide safer equipment for the car driver and passenger, and they point to many features that have been added to the car without extra charge to the consumer.

There is no question, however, that for competitive reasons the manufacturers are striving to keep abreast with any new device, adequately proved, that will contribute to safer driving.
