County Tax Levy For 1956 to Drop By 2 Cents Total

The Twin Falls county tax levies have been reduced two cents for 1956, making the total \$1.34 as compared to \$1.36 in 1955 and bringing the state levy to \$2.24. In 1955 the state levy was \$2.26. The county tax levies are based on each \$100 assessed valuation of real and personal property. The slight decrease was made by the county commissioner's committee. 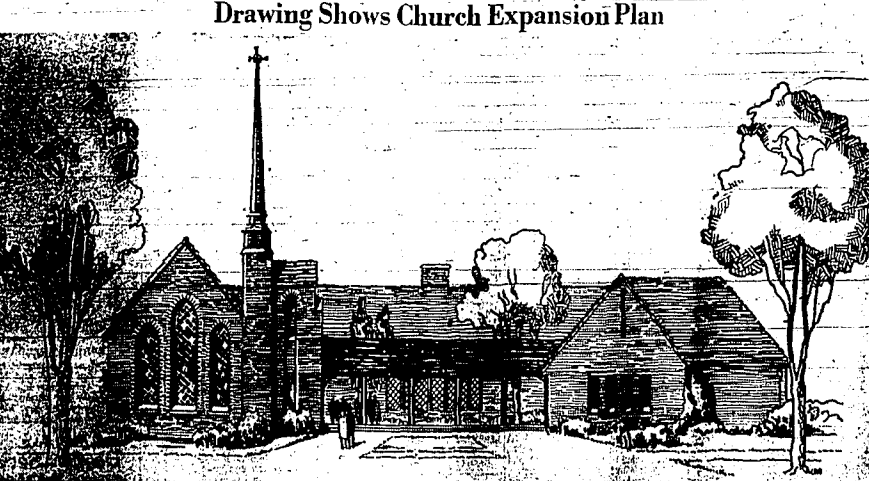
