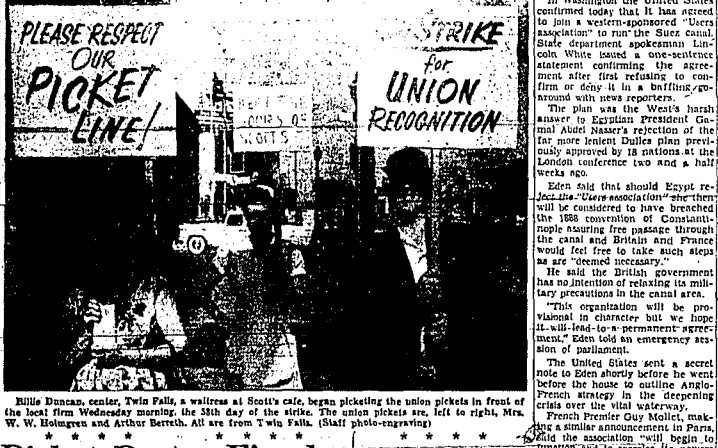

### Taxes Levy in Blaine County Is Announced

**HAILEY, Sept. 12**—Blaine county commissioners today announced a regular meeting Monday at 40 cents per \$100 valuation for the most part remained the same. The sheep commission fund is \$20 per \$100 valuation, state bond inspection 30 cents, bee tax, per colony, three cents, and honey, per pound, five cents. Livestock disease control is raised from 50 cents to 60 cents. The utility levy remains the same at \$2.01, with the current expense levied from 41 cents to 40 cents and the charity and hospital fund raised from 25 cents to 30 cents. ### Bylaw Is Changed in Sheep Council

**DENVER, Sept. 12**—Bylaws of the American Sheep Producers Council were changed to permit greater representation of sheepmen throughout the country on the board of directors and delegate body.

The ASPC's directors and delegates voted 21-11 for the amendment, which will be effective March 1, 1957.

The reorganization plan calls for 15 delegates representing various sheep and wool associations, plus an additional 15 delegates at-large, making a total of 30. The board of directors will be enlarged from 18 to 40 members, including 15 delegates-at-large.

Plans for the coming year were being reviewed at a session today. The ASPC is supported by deductions from incentive payments on wool to sheep growers.

"If the courts do call upon me, I will assist in every possible way," he said.

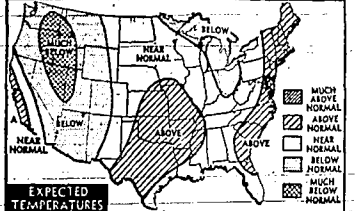

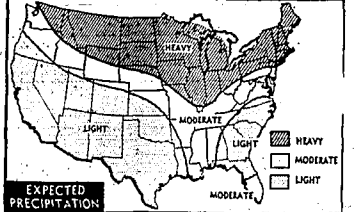

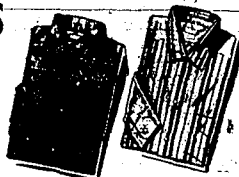
