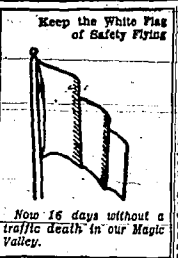

Columnist Cites Authority for His Fear of Suburban Living

By HAL BOYLE

NEW YORK, Sept. 13 (AP)—Early in life I was frightened by a suburb, and I can't quite get over it.

"You ought to conquer this child," he said, "but you a place in the suburbs," my friends tell me. "Man, then you're really start living."

Now and then, when worried momentarily of the city, I do consider taking such a step. But always at the last moment something stops me. I don't know what it is—yet.

But this time was a sociologist who came to my rescue, just when I was about to join my old friend Ronald Halface, and buy a shiny new house in a new development called Missus Heights.

The sociologist was Dr. Ernest R. Mowser of Northwestern university, who has just completed a clinical study of suburban living. In fact, at least, his survey destroyed several myths about the joys of dwelling in the suburbs.

One of the myths is how "neighborly" everybody is. That may be true at the start, when the suburbs are new and everyone has the same problems—how to fight crabs, how to pay for the new school, and how to keep the cellar from flooding.

But Dr. Mowser found that as the suburbs are they get social harder, the friendships of the neighbors. They break up into cliques and groups, neighbors greet no more to you than they do in the big city—except they can't see your car more. You can't call the husband and make them believe as you can when you are an apartment dweller in town. You either have to put up with them or call the cops, and if you do that you have a Hattiesville-versus-the-Mrs. Coxy situation.

Children deserve the best break you can give them in life, of course, but in the suburbs Papa is often a father, too. He's not only a father, but he's a little douché, covered by the kind make their long-veggie hours by the allowed timetable, if they don't stick to the city, where a man's a man, a woman's a woman—and the good old grocery store isn't across the street.

What is a suburbanite anyway, except a fellow who lacks the courage to become a real hermit and the strength of character to put up with the happy pitfalls of city living?

Court Orders Family to Quit Mansion and Pay Back Rent

CLEVELAND, Sept. 13 (AP)—The Alexander J. Brady family has been paying the government \$18-a-year for a 17-room mansion for the past seven years, but a federal judge says no more. Judge Paul Jones ordered Brady to move out and pay the government \$1,800 back rent—\$100 a month for the last 18 months. How did Brady ever get a deal like that?

He sold the house to the government for \$21,250 in 1949. The government planned to build a veterans hospital near Brady's property and 10 adjacent lots. The people who lived in the 10 other houses also sold to the government and moved out. But Brady wanted to stay on. So he got a government man to sign an agreement, renting him the house at \$1 a year "until such time as the streets are actually needed for the purpose for which purchased." That day never came. Immediate plans for the hospital were cancelled. Eighteen months ago, the government ordered Brady to move. He refused and displayed his resentment by paying the government \$18-a-year. He argued in court that the agreement was invalid because the government officer who signed it had no such authority. Jones agreed. "I don't think there is any rhyme or reason to his position," he said. "What if the hospital were never built?"

Radioactive Test Devices Received

BOISE, Sept. 12 (AP)—Hear William C. Specht, state director of civil defense and disaster relief, says his office has received about 600 devices for use in detecting radiological hazards.

The retired navy officer said the devices were received on a permanent loan from the U.S. civil defense administration.

Specht said the ground observer devices were "penetration" affairs which can be clipped to a pocket and used to tell the amount of radioactive material in the air. About 75 per cent of the instruments are so simple that more complicated and can detect the radioactive count from the tail of a hurricane which, the director said.

Specht said the ground observer device is the state board of health and the Idaho national guard would cooperate in a program of education to teach use of the detection devices to persons in local civil defense organizations.

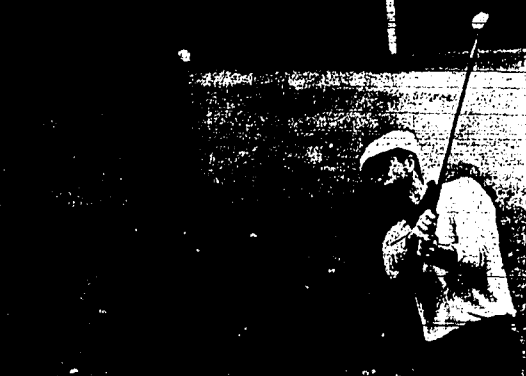

LONDON, Sept. 13 (AP)—One of Sir Winston Churchill's oldest friends has debunked the legend of Churchill as the impetuous in World War II.

Lord Brabazon of Thrapston says Churchill was temperate, broad-minded and calm. He tells the story in a new book, "The Brabazon Autobiography."

Brabazon, aviation pioneer and sportsman, was minister of air for a period of a time in one of Churchill's cabinets.

Writing of the stormy meetings of the battle of the Atlantic committee, Brabazon says:

"They were the most unpleasant meetings I have ever attended. The atmosphere was grave, but the way Churchill created a storm was almost unbearable."

He usually appeared after his 11:30 p.m. dinner in the vest of a general.

"He behaved as if he were a bully," says Brabazon. "Everyone, in his opinion, was a half-wit. And if anyone said anything he was jumped on and smothered."

Even accounting for the strain under which the prime minister labored, Brabazon says, "the general way of inspiring incentive and indignation."

Brabazon emphasizes, however, that he bore no malice toward his wartime friend and colleague.

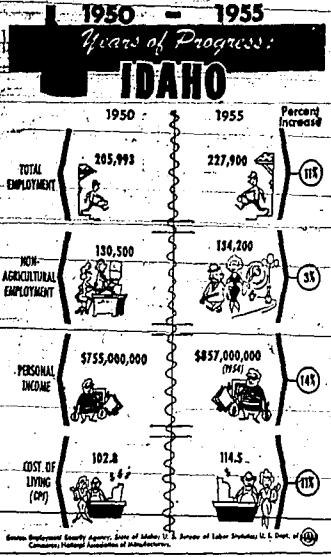

"Feeder" Case On Airlines Is Lessened Now

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13 (AP)—The civil aeronautics board has restricted the scope of the Pacific northwest "feeder" air line case.

CAB in a recent order dismissed some of the 25 applications which airlines had filed for local service route changes and divided the remainder into two separate groups.

Applications for routes east of Spokane, Wash., will be considered and those for change west of Spokane in the "Montana local service case" and those for change west of Spokane are grouped in the "Pacific northwest local service case."

CAB said hearings in the two cases will be scheduled "at a time and place hereafter to be designated." Examiners assigned to the hearing are Walter Bryan for the Montana case and W. M. Ruhlten in the Pacific northwest case.

Ruhlten held a preliminary conference in the Pacific northwest feeder case last May 8. Discussed were about 25 applications of Boeing, Frontier, Northwest, Southwest, United, Western, West Coast and other airlines.

CAB said "the proposals for local air service from Spokane to the east have no substantial relationship to proposals for air service from Spokane to the west."

Division of the proceedings into two cases at a line drawn between Spokane, Boise and Salt Lake City will "minimize each proceeding, expedite its final disposition and reduce the burden of time, labor and expense," the CAB said.

To be excluded from the hearings are proposed new service to Canada and to southern California points.

Applications for service between Reno, Nev., Salt Lake City and Sacramento, Calif., will be heard in the Pacific northwest case, CAB said.

Air Reservation Plan Is Studied

A plan to eliminate cancellation of airline reservations will be put in effect Sunday by the United, airlines and West Coast airlines.

The plan is aimed at reducing the number of "no shows," who are persons that make reservations and then fail to "show up" at flight time.

Beginning Sunday persons throughout the country making advance reservations must pick up their confirmed ticket before a deadline set by the airline. Failure to get the ticket before the deadline will result in cancellation of the reservation.

A second phase of the program, which will be studied by the airlines, would involve collecting service charges in event of failure to appear either with the deadline or canceling reservations within six hours of departure time. This plan will not go into effect at this time and is subject to approval of the civil aeronautics board.

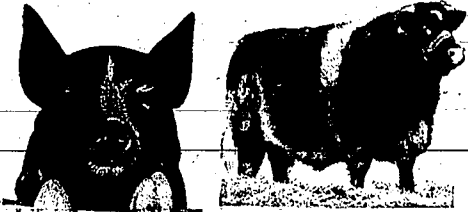

Fried Meats Get for Food Bargain List

A wide variety of meats — especially beef — will be featured on the menu of many of the Twin Falls restaurants.

The large national chain reported that sales were up from two to three times virtually anywhere, with ground up from two to six cents per pound.
