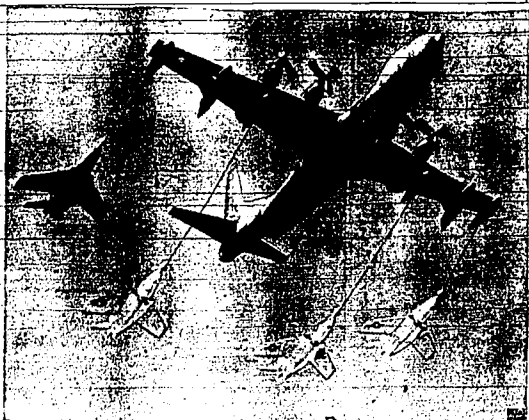

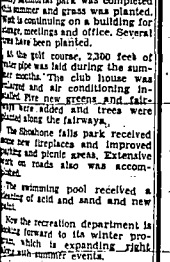

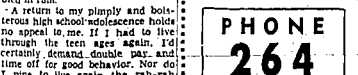

TEL AVIV, Israel, Sept. 14 (AP)—Israeli seventh major oil strike within the past year, has given rise to this oil-hungry nation's hope that every Israeli hopes his own pocket will produce the news.

The outlook is dim, many experts believe today. Only one in 10 drilling operations produce a drop of precious crude oil.

The seventh major strike erupted today at the Hilda oil field located on the Jewish New Years day a week ago. Some experts hoped it would be the end of the strike, but the new strike failed to change the pessimistic outlook of many.

The reason for pessimism was obvious: Israel will need a minimum of about 1,200,000 barrels of oil each year; so far, all seven wells at Hilda, the nation's only oil field, have produced only 100 barrels a day.

In simple arithmetic, Israel is producing only one-fiftieth of the amount of oil it needs. The deficit must be imported; the major portion from the United States.

But our Arab neighbors are fighting their rich oil proceeds in their fight against us, an government "White" declares.

"We have to fight back in like manner when we need every drop of oil," said our Arab neighbors.

Early this week, Saudi Arabia consented \$700,000 from its oil proceeds to the Jordanian government, one of the Arab military armaments at war with Israel.

New Eye May Allow Science

Infinity Scope

TREBURN, Sept. 14 (AP)—A new electronic eye unveiled yesterday may let the 200-inch Palomar telescope see three times farther into space than the edge of the universe.

It might also capture reality, detailed pictures of Mars to solve the mystery of the "canals."

This amazing but tiny tube can make faint light-end images thousands of times brighter. That's the hope for seeing stars so far away they are invisible now.

It will be used on the great Mt. Palomar telescope which will be in operation next month, said Dr. J. W. Colman of Westinghouse Electric corporation. The Palomar telescope in effect would become equal to a telescope with a mirror 2,000 inches wide, or half the length of a football field.

Theoretically it might see objects three times farther out in space than now is possible, Dr. Colman said. Palomar now takes pictures of stars one to two billion miles away. The new distance light travels in that time at 186,000 miles per second.

The electronic eye might help it see out three to six billion light years. If, as some astronomers think, the universe began only a few billion years old, and still expanding, that would mean visibility out to the edge of the universe.

There is no official name yet, the new tube was shown to science writers touring the new Westinghouse research laboratories by Dr. Colman, manager of the electronics and nuclear physics department, and Dr. J. A. Hitchcock, vice president of engineering and research.

Britain Is Aloof

From Isles Fight

LONDON, Sept. 14 (AP)—The foreign office said today Britain has not taken sides in the territorial dispute which has prevented Russia and Japan from agreeing on a World War II peace treaty.

The dispute involves the islands of Kurushiri and Etorofu, in the southern Kurile chain, which were handed over to Russia at Yalta. The United States urged Russia this week to give the islands to Japan, and reports circulating here said Britain had followed suit.

"Her majesty's government has never been asked to give their views on the sovereignty of the Etorofu and Kurushiri islands," a foreign office spokesman said.

"Nor would it be appropriate to give our views in view of the fact that negotiations have been in progress between Japan and the Soviet Union for a year."

United States, Great Britain and France
 are preoccupied by the Suez canal dispute from reaching the fighting stage.

There is nothing Soviet Russia
 would be better than to see the Western allies get themselves drawn into a war over Suez.

In fact, there is good reason to believe
 that Russia is eyeing the Suez Canal to expert, the moves of Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser in the Suez situation.

Aim is Cited
 Russia's aim, while pretending to help Nasser, is to incite trouble which in the end, of course, would ruin him.

President Sukarno of Indonesia
 has just ended a visit to the Soviet Union which tended to strengthen the western viewpoint that East Asian neutralism is somewhat warmer toward Russia and Red China than toward the western bloc.

During an extensive tour,
 Sukarno made speech after speech praising Russia in the highest terms.

"We work for peace, prosperity and equality,"
 Sukarno said in one speech. "We Indonesians aim simply, let us work together." He emphasized several times that Indonesia, in fighting against "western imperialism."

Sukarno left Moscow yesterday
 for Yugoslavia. On his way home he intends to visit Red China.

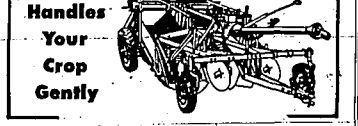

Demo Starts Fast Stumps In 15 States

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14 (AP)—Sen. Ted Kefauver headed toward Florida today on the first leg of his 15-state "truth-telling" tour.

The Democratic vice presidential nominee was scheduled to arrive at Jacksonville today from Harrisburg, Pa., with his running mate, Adlai Stevenson. In less than two hours Kefauver planned to be on the Tennessee senator's 16-day tour will take him through 15 states from Florida to Oregon. His busy schedule will include more than 50 towns and cities.

Warning up for the tour in a Harrisburg speech last night, Kefauver charged the Republican administration with running a government of "privilege, preference and personal profit."

"What the Republicans have given us is the bad track, the weighted law, the stacked government and the opposition, the inside track which runs the distance from Wall street to the White House," he said.

Kefauver said that when Vice President Richard W. Nixon first took office, he drove the "high road" but after Democrats won elections in 1932 and 1934 Nixon "changed his tune."

"During the past few months he has tried again to pass himself off as a new Nixon—again traveling what appeared to be the 'high road'."

"But the elections have apparently flushed out the old Nixon. He is again playing fast and loose with the facts."

Kefauver said that as the campaign progresses, "we can expect to see the real Nixon."

World Shipping Starting Haul Around Africa, Bypassing Suez; Problems Seen

LONDON, Sept. 14 (AP)—World shipping this week-end begins to earn the long haul around Africa's Cape of Good Hope.

It coincides with the mass exodus of European pilots on the Suez Canal, a move almost certain to curtail drastically the number of ships hard-pressed Egyptian authorities will be able to put through the disputed waterway.

Some shipping, notably liners bound for Australia, was diverted weeks ago. In these few cases shipowners felt the additional two to three days journey around the cape more than compensated for the risk of a tie-up at Suez due to a pilot shortage.

Shipowners and governments are now meeting to plan feverishly for the flood of shipping expected to direct to the round-the-cape route which nearly doubles the journey to and from the Persian gulf. A British ministry of transport official is already in Capetown discussing with South African authorities how facilities at the half-way ports of Durban, Port Elizabeth and Capetown can be expanded to handle the tremendous new burden.

Ship owners are meeting in London to plan rescheduling and possible new supplementary routes. The cape route is believed capable of handling an additional 20 ships besides their normal traffic.

World, more than half the canal's total cargo going around the cape would cut in half the number of round trips each tanker could make every year, and shipping circles say another 3,500,000 tons of tankage would be needed.

The 200,000 tons of tankage in the U. S. reserve fleet is a drop in the bucket compared to the need. It is 11,000 miles from London to Bahrein via the cape. By the Suez route, it's only 6,000 miles.

Some 2,500 miles would be added to the route of ships traveling from New York to Bahrein around the Cape of Good Hope instead of through the Suez canal. The New York-Bahrein distance through the canal is 9,267 miles, while the long route totals 12,000 miles.

The shipping distance from London to Singapore by the canal is 8,200 miles; via the cape it is 11,713.

A total of 115,750,000 net tons of shipping transited the canal last year. Major ownership broke down like this: British 28 per cent, Norway 14 per cent, Liberia 12 per cent, France nine per cent, Italy eight per cent, and Panama registered ships 17 per cent.

The 41st jump-off on the BAUMHOLDER, GERMANY — I tuck just after dawn in weather once spent successive Sundays in Glasgow and Paris, and was sure I had achieved the ultimate in contrast.

But I hadn't. Yesterday I was in Vienna and today I'm in Baumholder, thanks to the M. G. I express, an automobile, and an army L-20 plane.

Vienna and Baumholder are about as far apart as Back Bay Boston and Butte, Jack Gleason and Willie Shoemaker, in Vienna everybody plays around the clock. Here they work around it.

Baumholder is the site of the principal training ground for the second (Hell on Wheels) armored division, and I was asked here to watch the 41st armored infantry battalion go through its paces in a last. Here I knew it was in combat clothes and right in the middle of the exercise, which is just as much like warfare as I can be made with having to work in earnest.

Let me say right here that the combination of an 11-year infantry patrol work in Vienna, is not the proper training for a workout with the armored division.

One day in the field with the infantry will convince the most ardent advocate of punishment warfare that while the punishment may be just around the corner, the corner is a long way off.

Enemy ground is taken and enemy ground is held by men. It's just as simple as that, and infantry, armored or otherwise, are the men. The tank is a big, mean-weaponed, thick-skinned thing, but it counts on the doctrine for protection. When it sleeps men stand guard.

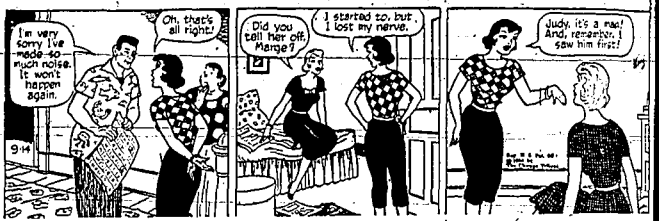
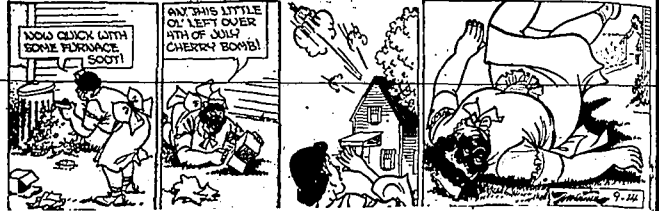

This is the year for the big style changes for most companies. Only a scattering of makes are in for just the so-called "face-lifting"—Packard, Hudson, Nash, Studebaker and Rambler. Even so, Studebaker bills the new cars as incorporating a number of styling and engineering advances.

The biggest changes for '57 will show up on models turned out by the highly competitive "big three"—General Motors, Ford and Chrysler. Chrysler President L. L. Colbert says the new Plymouth, Dodge, De Soto, Chrysler and Imperial cars have been restyled "from wheels to roof."

This includes new suspension and other engineering and styling changes exceeding anything we have accomplished in any one year," Colbert says.

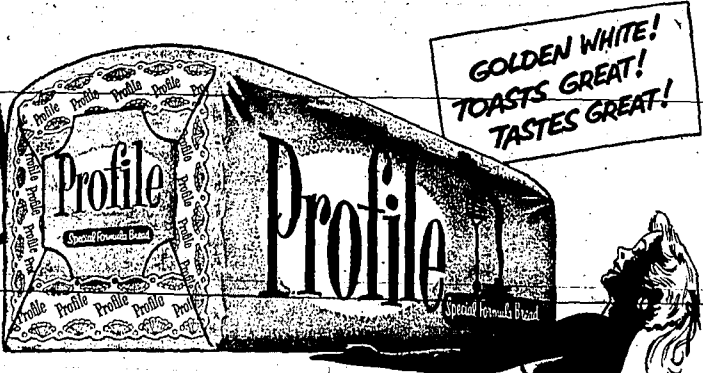
