## West Plans Parity Canal as Egypt Threats War

LONDON, Sept. 15 (AP)—The western big three invited 15 nations today to attend a conference next week for establishment of a world body to run Suez canal traffic—a project branded by Egypt as a "declaration of war." British envoys delivered the invitations on behalf of this country, France and the United States. All 15 backed a proposal at last month's London conference to place the waterway under an international board linked to the United Nations. Egypt turned this down. Egypt's reaction to the new invitation was swift. President Gamal Abdel Nasser said the aim of the projected Suez canal authority "is not to permit the world to have a say in the canal, but to have a say in the canal."

In a fiery speech at "Biblos" air force camp, Nasser accused Britain, France and the United States of "imperialism" and "aggression against the Arab countries." ## Spud Diversion Plans Requested by Council

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15 (AP)—Diversion of 15 to 20 percent of lower grade Irish potatoes into starch, other by-product uses and livestock feed was recommended today by the National Potato Council as a step toward improving prices to growers. The council has been meeting here the past two days with 40 members, representing the country's major potato growing sections, present. W. E. Whitley, Oakley, Idaho, president of the council, said it was recommended unanimously that the agriculture department be asked to put in effect a diversion program similar to one used last year. The department spent a little over three million dollars in order to divert surplus potatoes from the market during the remainder of the marketing season.

LONDON, Sept. 15 (AP)—A wave of youth riots has been rolling over the radio to the pulsating beat of rock 'n' roll music from America, but police across the English channel say it is not so simple.

In Newark last night "the playing of rock 'n' roll just like everybody else but they keeping their shirts on" says an AP dispatch. Italy's only radio station is a large-scale sale of records.

Frankfurt reports it's difficult to assess the part rock 'n' roll and other jazz are playing in soldier mutinies in West Germany, but incidents in West Berlin are being held back regularly blame out American music.

Rock 'n' roll has been banned from the radio in Communist East Germany. However, word has spread throughout that East German youth is going for it and picking up everything available from radio stations in West America.

Rock 'n' roll seems to be known in Paris only because of the articles in London and elsewhere.

Two nights later a rhythm-happy group of 200 boys teenagers who dress in narrow pants and long coats) pounced up and down the aisle of a Pavilion theater and finally one of them elated the protesting manager with a razor.

Five London movie houses showing the film had to call on the police Sept. 9 when teenagers got out of hand and smashed seats and slashed the screen. Police and special guards bailed with the youths Sept. 11 in 12 houses showing the picture.

In Manchester Sept. 9 Teddy Boys ripped trousers from walls, sprayed profanity and then trashed outside. They up the city's downtown traffic for an hour.

Even movie houses, from Wellington to Bristol in Lancashire, called on police riot squads Sept. 10.

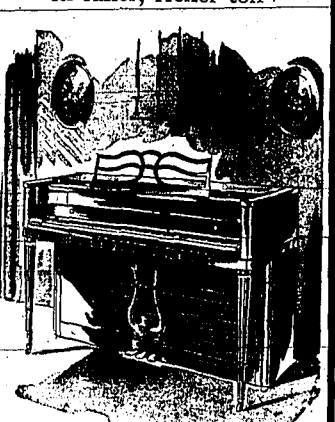
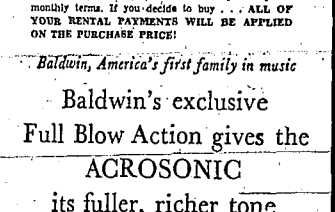

### Ancient Mystery Noted in Dark, Long Tunnels Underneath Federal Building

WASHINGTON, Sept. 15 (U)—No one knows why the mysterious dungeons and tunnels were built beneath the old patent office 120 years ago.

Age-old records in the national archives give no clue. Nor do any survive in the tunnels themselves, empty, dripping and stagnant, they echo in ghastly refrain the voices of the past.

One theory is that the brick-walled passages were constructed as a means of escape in the event a foreign enemy ever captured the nation's capital again—as the British did in 1814.

...payments into employment security insurance for employees. He cited several examples where state laws were enforced through cooperation of both groups.

"The state attorney general aims to work with and through your field representatives rather than 'go over your heads'," Smith said.

Dr. Tom Shearer, president of the College of Idaho, Caldwell, stressed the importance of employment personnel in maintaining an even economy. He spoke at the Friday night banquet which began the session.

...institutional service at the hospital. The wards were crowded and had been described as "hell."

There were 104 patients in the two and 88 of them completed the course. The male ward had 61 patients with an average age of 57. Their combined time in the hospital amounted to 866 years. The 47 women who took the drug course had a combined time of 429 years in the institution.

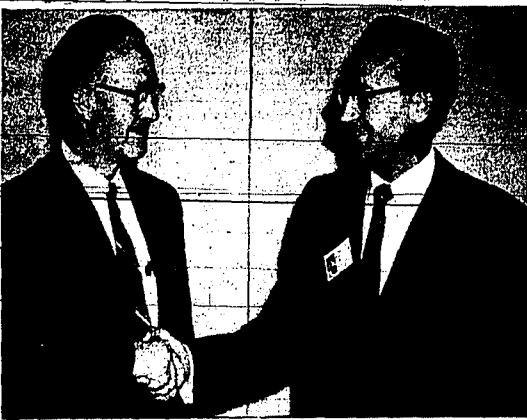
As a result of the three-month test, 41.9 per cent now have been approved for discharge as outpatients.

He pointed out the need is for places in which they can be put for care, such as nursing homes or foster homes, so the staff at the hospital can spend more time in treatment of other patients.

### Idaho's Onion Crop Infested With Maggots

BOISE, Sept. 15 (AP)—Idaho's onion growers continued to be plagued with an outbreak of maggots during August which further reduced the 1934 crop output expectations to 120,000 bags of 50-pounds each.

The U. S. department of agriculture said growers even halted irrigation during the month in an effort to control the worms, which will further reduce the yield.

**Expected Yield Low**

The expected 1934 crop is about 75 per cent of the 1933 output and 1949-51 average for the state.

The combined Idaho-Eastern Oregon onion crop for the year now is estimated at 1,805,000 bags in comparison to last year's production of 5,207,000 bags, the USDA said.

**Good News Told**

On the good side, the department said carrot harvesting is in progress and some very good yields have been reported on the acreage plucked so far. Production has been estimated at 18,000 bushels compared to last year's crop of 21,000 bushels.

The amount of sweet corn for processing is expected to total 48,500 tons compared to last year's crop of 33,700 tons.

Production of alkali clover seed is estimated at 2,250,000 pounds for the year which is about ten-thirds of the 1933 crop of 3,600,000 pounds.

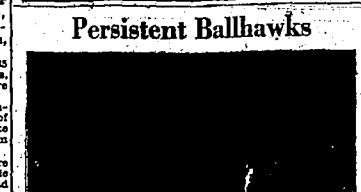

Donald Hamular, 26, Novato, O., last night said in an exclusive interview that the non-commissioned officer, who has not been identified, "hit me in the ribs, just above the stomach."

"He raised it above his head and told me to do all of it. I have never seen a pack so heavy. I don't know that he had any pack so I said, 'I don't have one.'"

"He came up to me and said 'don't you have sense enough to say 'sir' when you're talking to a non-commissioned officer?'

"He said 'yes sir' and he hit me in the ribs, just above the stomach."

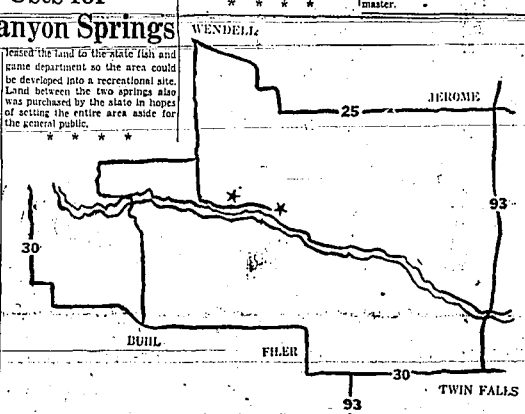
George Hays owned the land around Crystal springs in 1906 and started an orchard there. A few apple and peach trees still remain as evidence of his enterprise. Water from the spring was bottled in the early days of Filer and sold for five cents a gallon to residents of the community for drinking water.

Niagara springs is located on what was the Mays ranch. A number of years ago a fish hatchery was operated there. The hatchery was not a financial success but some of the grandchildren of the early hatchery trout still lurk around the springs to give fishermen nightmares.

In 1931 the Idaho Power company purchased the land around the springs, intending to impound the water for the generation of power. There was considerable discussion over this proposal and the plan was abandoned. In 1933 the company

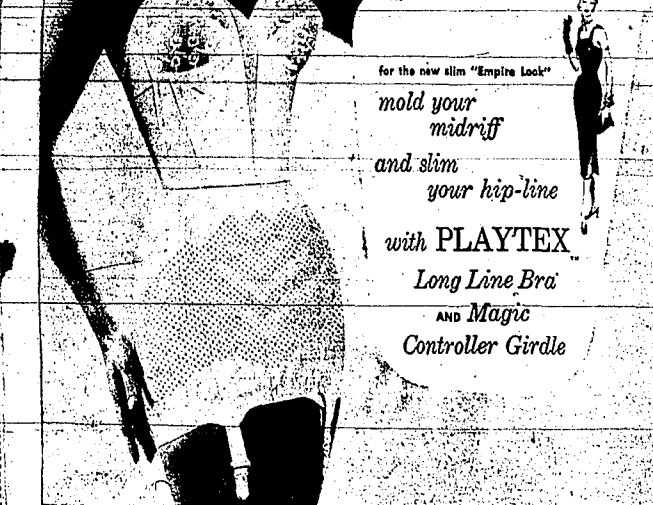
