Detail Given On New Plan In Red China

TOKYO, Sept. 17 (AP)—Chinese Communist Premier Chou En-lai today said that his government's ambitious five-year plan for the next five years will be based on the double industrial production in China, triple in agriculture and quadruple in transportation. Most of the plan would depend on Soviet bloc.

Chou's speech to the eighth congress of the Chinese Communist party in Peking was broadcast by radio in a summary. It was the first Chinese speech in 11 years and was being attended by world communist leaders.

Chou announced five fundamental goals of the nation's second five-year plan, which begins in 1957 with top priority given to heavy industry. He listed the fundamentals as follows:

- 1. To continue economic construction with heavy industry as its core.
- 2. To carry through the socialist transformation and to consolidate the superior of collective ownership.
- 3. To further increase the production of industry, agriculture and handicrafts and develop transport and commerce on the basis of socialist construction and socialist transformation.
- 4. To make vigorous efforts to train personnel for construction work.
- 5. To reinforce natural defenses and to raise the level of the people's material and cultural life.

Chou gave a rosy picture of the first five-year plan and said that the new plan will "invariably succeed and that the majority of its goals or results."

End Is Viewed to Long Steel Strike

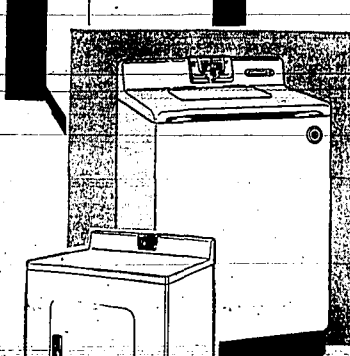

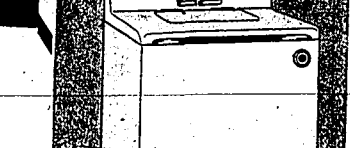

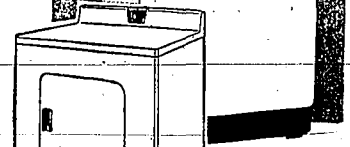

TRUTH ON OUR SIDE

President Eisenhower understands well that if a system of government is truly strong it need not be urged that American schools teach the facts about communism, democracy's most vigorous rival.

He believes, obviously, that truth is on our side, that a full, fair look at both sides of the communist line will lead young Americans unflinchingly to the choice of democracy.

More important, he clearly appreciates that their devotion to democracy will be deeply enhanced by their having had communion and other political systems.

This is one of the big points missed by those few among us who feel there is peril in teaching the facts of communism.

The way to win dedicated adherents to democracy is not to behave as if you feared its ability to stand up to other systems in a test of truth. The wise teaching of democracy does not consist of declaring falsely that it is wonderful and the rest, questioning American youngsters wants better treatment than that. He has no wish to be a rubber stamp for anybody's views. He likes to believe that he can come to his own sound conclusions after hearing the facts.

As the President says: "Competition for men's minds begins when they are students. This is when they must be taught to discriminate between truth and falsehood."

Surely the average American student is willing to be taught how to make that distinction. But having been taught, he desires to make the actual choices himself, not to accept hand-me-down beliefs fashioned by others.

His right thus to decide for himself, even to reach conclusions which are wrong, is as the very heart of democracy's meaning. Anyone who would deny him that privilege seeks to employ undemocratic methods to enforce a false notion of what democracy really is.

Says Mr. Eisenhower: "Our teachers are presented with a matchless opportunity to teach the truth."

Indeed they are. And by lending his moral leadership to a reaffirmation of that opportunity, the President has helped to diminish what resistance still remains in this country to the teaching of democracy in the free, competitive market of political ideas.

CONTROL OF CONGRESS

Obviously in this campaign a good deal is going to be said about why it is wise for a winning president to have a congress under control of his own party.

The chief argument for it is that it enables a clear line of party responsibility to be established. When both the White House and congress are in the same political hands, the controlling party cannot be held blame or deprived of credit for the government's record.

The assumption is, of course, that voters are keenly interested in fixing such responsibility, and that a party division between White House and congress only confuses them.

The trouble with these contentions, however, is that congress too often does not behave according to party form.

Right now, Senator Stoen and other Democrats are busy pointing out that President Eisenhower did not get from the Republican 83rd congress a lot of the things in his program.

They don't bother to remind the voters that former President Truman had exactly the same problem with the Democratic 81st and 82nd congresses. Relatively little of his fair deal program was ever translated from paper into law. With a congress of his own party, he could not in four years redeem his pledge to repeal the Taft-Hartley labor act.

"There is usually a simple reason why congress does not follow a president all the way, even when it is controlled by his party."

Most of the presidents we have seen electing tend to be moderate in outlook, reflecting the nation's mood. This does not mean they are liberal, but they are more progressive than many congresses have been.

It happens that, whether Democrats or Republicans are in control on capitol hill, the most powerful congressional committees chairmanships normally fall to conservatives who do not see fully eye to eye with the White House occupant.

Add to this the fact that the senators and representatives are subject to tremendous pressures from sources both local and national, and that they are highly jealous of their independence as a branch of government apart from the executive branch.

Together these factors provide the makings of a course of action almost inevitably at odds with that of a president, no matter what his party.

That has been the history of White House-congress relations in recent times. Consequently it is foolish to either party to pretend that its congress will do anything through its own president's program, while the opposition follows will not.

There isn't any guarantee in either case.

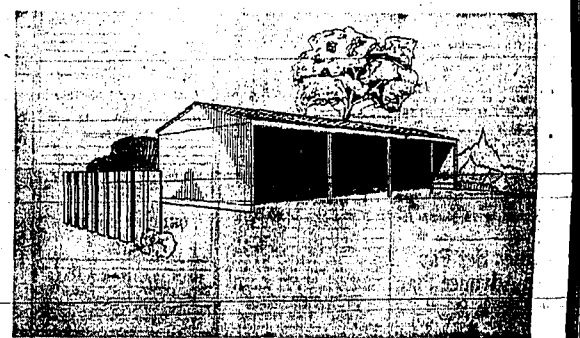
