Constitutional Violations Are Charged in Brief on Natural Gas Cooperative

BOISE, Sept. 18 (UPI)—Attorney J. N. Legatz contended today the 1917 legislature violated the federal Constitution when it excluded cooperative utilities from regulation under state public powers. The constitutional question was one of four posed by the attorney in a brief filed with the state supreme court in a case testing the constitutionality of the Idaho Falls Cooperative Gas association, Inc. The court has set Monday for hearing oral arguments here.
