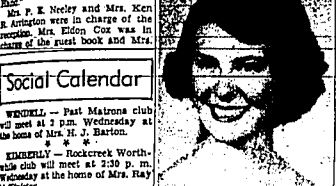

Indians Slate Fight to Keep Tribal Lands

BALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 25.—Members of the National Congress of American Indians were told they must fight to hold their rapidly disappearing reservations.

Organization president Joseph R. Gandy, a Cowart Apache Indian from Plummer, Ida., made the statement as he opened the organization's 13th annual convention. He pleaded for inter-tribal unity in what he termed the "struggle to preserve the homeland of the American Indian."

"Only one-third of the lands set aside for us by treaties still are in Indian hands," Gandy said. He declared that most of the loss is due to "careless mismanagement by those entrusted with the responsibility for Indian affairs."

He urged the tribes to "band together to convince the government that health, economic, and welfare programs are subordinate to land preservation."

"It is plain," he said, "that the American Indian is the poorest educated, has the poorest living standard, and has the highest mortality rate of any group in the United States."

Another speaker, Francis McKinley, Ft. Duchesne, Utah, told the 200 delegates that the government should not give away the land to the Indians. "They are helped to develop their resources."

He said that economic conditions are "deplorable" on many reservations, but he added that Indians "can contribute much to America if they are helped to develop their resources."

McKinley is director of community services for the Ute tribe.

Atty. John S. Boyden, Salt Lake City, told the group he is sure Utah Indians will soon have the right to vote. Boyden has filed a suit in behalf of a Duchesne county Indian to establish Indian voting rights.

But Boyden predicted that regardless of how the courts rule, the legislature will repeat a provision which prevents residents of federal reservations in Utah from voting.

Huge Bush Fires Desolate Regions

MELBOURNE, Australia, Sept. 25.—Huge bush fires ravaged about a 400-mile front in a vast uninhabited area of Australia's northern territory today.

After pilots said a dense cloud of smoke had climbed to a height of 1,000 feet.

Local officials said the only loss would probably be hundreds of wild birds, birds and other animals. Although the scorched area was expected to cover thousands of square miles.

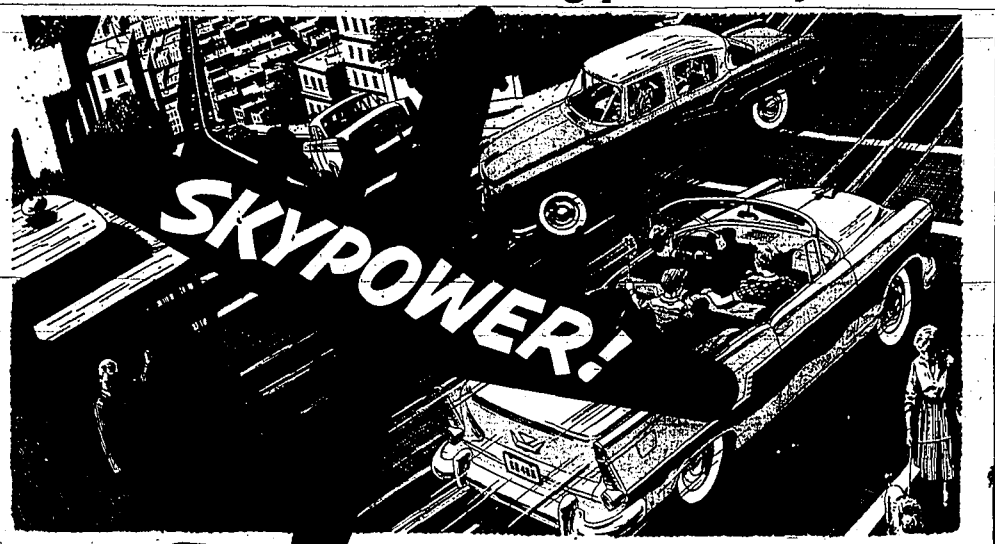
