The French-British stand was strengthened after a conference here headed by Premier Guy Mollet and Prime Minister Eden and their foreign ministers.

They expressed full agreement on the line to be followed in the U.N. security council's pending decision on the Suez issue even as President Eisenhower indicated in Washington that he would be willing to compromise on the kind of international operation which would be worked out.

The British and French have insisted the canal must be run internationally and they have depicted annoyance at what they feel is U.S. reluctance on this point.

Eisenhower expressed hope that a peace conference that provides a method of canal operation could be worked out, perhaps along the lines of the 16-nation majority proposal at the first London Suez conference for international supervision.

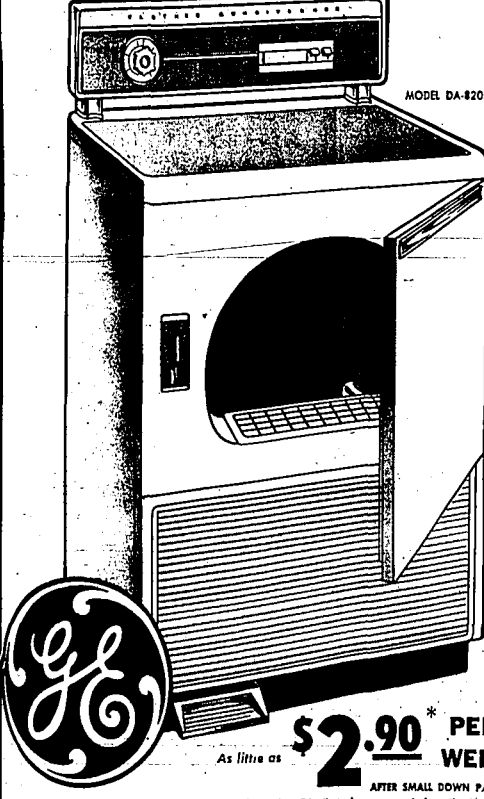

Bucky Harris Resigns As Detroit Manager

DETROIT, Sept. 22 (AP)—Stanley B. (Bucky) Harris resigned Thursday as manager of the Detroit Tigers, saying he cannot be the "fiery aggressive" skipper the club's new owners say they want for 1937.

Harris wrote his letter of resignation Sept. 5 while the fifth-place Tigers were in Kansas City. Accepted by President Spike Briggs, the resignation becomes effective at the end of the season.

It ends his second tour as manager of the Tigers and brings to an end months of speculation since the Detroit club changes hands in mid-season in baseball's biggest financial transaction.

Pre-Knorr, Michigan radio executive, heads the 11-man syndicate that takes official control Monday of the \$5,500,000 deal. He indicated that there would be a change in managers.

Briggs, who had returned Harris to the Detroit team in 1933 despite two second-division finishes with the club from 1929 through 1932, had severely criticized Harris' handling of the Tigers during a 10-game losing streak earlier in the season.

Briggs spoke after a "ack of hustle" but later apologized publicly for his criticism. He said he had at least until the end of the current season.

Harris himself asked that his resignation be announced Thursday. The new owners say his successor will be named following the World Series. Speculation is that Harris may accept a job as general manager of the Boston Red Sox.

Just a week before Harris wrote his letter of resignation, Knorr, the new president, said the Tigers' 1937 manager "will be a fiery, active guy who will inspire the players and get them out there on the field and fight for them."

At the time, Knorr insisted that Harris had not been eliminated from consideration. But the manager quoted the story in his resignation to Briggs and said, "obviously that eliminates me. As you know, I prefer to try and get winning results by exerting my best judgment, percentage-wise."

Babe Will Be Remembered as Great Fighter, Superb All-Around Athlete

NEW YORK, Sept. 28 (UP)—To the sports world, Babe Didrickson Zaharias always will stand as one of the greatest fighters as well as the most superb all-around athlete of all time.

"Babe could do anything. All she had to do was make up her mind to do it," said one of her friends.

"She never knew there was such a word as 'quit'."

It all started for the Babe on a happy February day in 1930 when, a slender 15-year-old in a home-made dress, she took the steps from Beaumont to Dallas to play for an insurance company's basketball team.

"Right then," she would say in later years, "I knew that athletics were for me."

For three years in a row young Babe was selected on the all-American basketball team. That third year she talked the insurance company into starting a girls' track team and then won the 1932 national team championship all by herself.

The Babe was in eight events. She placed in seven of them and won five outright, tying for first in six.

In the Olympics which followed, she set world records in the 100, 200, 400, 800, 1600 and 3200-meter hurdles and placed second in the high jump.
