# 8 Persons Killed In Road Mishaps Over Week-End

Idaho's traffic death toll shot over the mark set for all of last year and soared to a new all-time record Monday as three week-end accidents which took the lives of eight persons.

Two of the wrecks were multiple fatalities in southern Idaho. The third killed a Sandpoint woman. Together they made up the worst week-end of the year. The new total of 34 deaths ahead by eight over last year's mark with three months to go.

The death rate showed a 20 per cent increase for the last three months of 1955, the state would wind up with 244 deaths for the year.

The week-end had one death south of the Snake and one in the all-time record set in 1954, when 245 persons were killed on Idaho roads. This year's total to date is 123.

Killed on the outskirts of American Falls early Sunday were William B. Smith, 29, his wife, Opal, 30, and Mrs. Irene Bowman, 33, all American Falls.

Mrs. Bowman's husband, Wylie, 41, critically hurt, died Monday morning.

A housewife was killed in a Power County Sheriff Rulon Neal said the car was traveling at high speed when it struck a tree and was thrown into the air.

Head-on collision of two cars near Boise Saturday killed John P. Dulin, 70, Mountain Home; Pauline Dulin, 68, Mountain Home; and Mrs. Irene Horn, 56, Boise.

Mariene Harris, 26, was killed Saturday in a night-wrecking train which crashed into a railroad car at a crossing in Sandpoint. She was killed under the train.

The car driver, Dale Thompson, 29, Elmiria, Wash., escaped unhurt. He had another passenger, Norma Corway, 24, was hospitalized with cuts and bruises.

### Karl Doenitz; Hitler's Heir, Is Freed Man

BERLIN, Oct. 1 (AP)—Grand Admiral Karl Doenitz, the man who succeeded Adolf Hitler as the dying monarch of World War II, was freed from a four-power international prison today.

Doenitz left the rambling red brick fortress at four minutes after midnight. He had served every minute, every second of his 10-year sentence for war crimes that included a sea mine campaign of terror on the high seas.

The man, whose submarine fleets played havoc with allied shipping and almost cut the flow of American supplies to hard-pressed Britain, is suffering from diabetes and a weak heart. At 65 he is older than his years.

Only 30 curious onlookers were on hand to see the man who had ruled Germany for eight days. He walked through the gates and entered a limousine with his wife, Inge, who came from his home in West Germany to greet him.

Doenitz's release posed a problem for the western allies and the West German government. Doenitz has an underground Nazi following that still regards him as the only leader of Germany. To many he is the symbol of the Nazis who fought on.

Doenitz was sentenced on Oct. 1, 1945, by the four-power international military tribunal in Nuremberg. He was convicted of a list of war crimes and of planning and starting a war. He was also convicted of charges he committed crimes against peace. He was not tried for crimes against humanity.

At Nuremberg, Doenitz was charged with ordering his submarines to sink merchant ships. He was accused of sanctioning a plot to exterminate Jews and communists and of helping to set up the German first in violation of the Versailles treaty.

# Gigantic Task Begins to Harness and Control Colorado at Glen Canyon Dam

KANAB, Utah, Oct. 1 (AP)—A large sun-baked workman stopped his bulldozer near a later bag of water and stepped down into an inch of dust. He filled a cup and drank deeply of the cool liquid. "Man, that tastes good!" he exclaimed, filling the cup again.

He wiped the sweat of the 100-degree heat from his face and walked to a pickup truck where two other workers waited.

The truck bounced along a newly graded road, throwing up a screen of dust behind it. Half an hour later, it pulled into a trailer camp and the three men went to their respective trailers to wash, eat and rest.

Working men, bulldozers, desert heat, trailer camps and dust—these are the ingredients today of a small area of southern Utah and northern Arizona. They are the ingredients that are going into the building of a dam.

The dam is Glen Canyon, the key unit of the 700-million-dollar upper Colorado river project—the largest civil engineering authorization ever granted by congress in a single piece of legislation.

Most of the work today is directed at constructing access roads to the graded road, which is located in rugged Arizona country five miles south of the Utah border. It will be three years before the first concrete is poured for the dam itself.

A year ago the Glen Canyon gorge of the Colorado river was accessible only by horseback. The nearest highway was at Kanab, 45 miles to the northwest, and at Bitter Springs, Ariz., 40 miles to the south.

Today crude roads—the remnants of a major highway—reach from Kanab and Bitter Springs to the opposite ends of the 800-foot gorge.

Building roads in this desolate country is no easy task. There are no rivers to dig or carve through; there is deep sand and dust which makes a poor foundation, and there is the problem of bringing equipment and material to such a remote area.

And underlying this is the struggle between Arizona and Utah over which state will build a millable road to the dam site first.

It is generally believed that the two contracts will go to companies in the state which first completes a road to the site.

When the road began, Arizona had the advantage because it could construct a road to Glen Canyon, while Utah could build only to the Arizona border, five miles from the site.

Arizona did not want to build a road from the site of the Utah border. It wanted to run a road to the site and stop it there.

But the bureau of reclamation and the bureau of public roads wanted a loop road from Utah to Arizona which would cross a bridge to be built below the damsite. So the reclamation bureau took on the job of building the road from Glen Canyon to the Utah border, a project which is almost complete.

Recently, Utah and Arizona highway officials patched up most of their differences and agreed to con-

struct their efforts to hasten construction of the road. However, the race continues to see who first finishes a road.

Each state has thrown hundreds of men into the work in an effort to complete by November a road adequate enough to carry equipment and material for a mammoth diversion tunnel to be built near the damsite. The roads later will be strengthened and paved to handle the heavier material needed for construction of the dam.

The diversion tunnel will be an engineering feat in itself. It will be 2,600 feet long and 46 feet in diameter and will be cut out of solid rock at the bottom of the 800-foot gorge. It will divert the water of the river around the dam construction site.

About 250 men will work around-the-clock shifts on the tunnel starting in November. The tunnel will take more than a year to build and then huge coffer dams will be cre-

ed above and below Glen Canyon before actual work can start on the big dam.

Some preliminary work is being done on the dam today. A handful of men in diamond drilling along the canyon walls to study rock formations and to determine the best anchor points for the dam.

This is dangerous work because the men are lowered by ropes from the canyon rim and a sudden wind sends them swinging dizzily high over the river bed.

When concrete for the big dam begins to pour, an estimated 4,000 men will be employed at the site. They will bring their families and a town of 8,000 or 9,000 persons will sprout out of the desert near Glen Canyon. Additional thousands will make their homes in Kanab, whose present population is 1,600, and Flagstaff, Ariz., a town of 10,000 about 140 miles to the south of Glen Canyon.

Kanab and Flagstaff are the only

towns of any size in the area and both are expected to benefit greatly from the dam. Both are making extensive expansion preparations.

When completed in about 10 years, Glen Canyon dam will be 700 feet high and about 1,000 feet across. It will be the second highest dam in the United States, behind Hoover dam. The dam will create a lake 186 miles long and up to several miles wide, most of it in Utah. The lake will become a great recreation area and is expected to become one of the nation's finest tourist attractions.

But the dam's main purpose will be to provide irrigation and hydro power for the West. This will benefit arid lands of Arizona and will generate as much power as far away as Los Angeles.
