Rioting Flares In Protest for Poznan Trials

POZNAN, Poland, Oct. 2 (AP)— Riotous prisoners in a correctional camp 50 miles from Poznan broke out today and started rioting in the streets against the Poznan trials. It was reported today.

The reports said the prisoners, at Poznan, are protesting against the "Poznan district correctional camp" which is being used to house prisoners awaiting trial in the streets.

Further details on the demonstration were lacking, but they were the largest since the major demonstration during the trials that started last week for workers accused of participating in fatal riots here last year.

The demonstrations were reported as peaceful and without any rioting. The trial of three workers accused of murdering a police sergeant during the uprising here in 1955.

In a second trial where nine workers from Poznan were charged with murdering the police sergeant, they were altering their pleas, it was reported, from that they were guilty to that they were not guilty.

Diet of Beetles Helps Serenity

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2 (AP)— Quite likely the reason you never saw an antihypertensive diet is that he eats beetles.

That is the gist of a report by an anthropologist-priest who recently returned from New Guinea where he observed the apparent workings of a "hypertensive vitamin."

The Rev. Martin Guinde described the source of pygmy hagnapras as "vitamin B-12" and he told reporters they get it from eating beetles.

Father Guinde, 70, is a member of the Society of Divine Word and a professor of anthropology at the Catholic University of America here in Washington. He has just returned from a four-month study of the pygmies in a remote region where the white man has never been before.

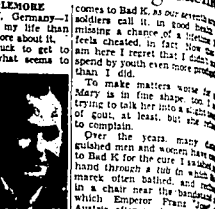

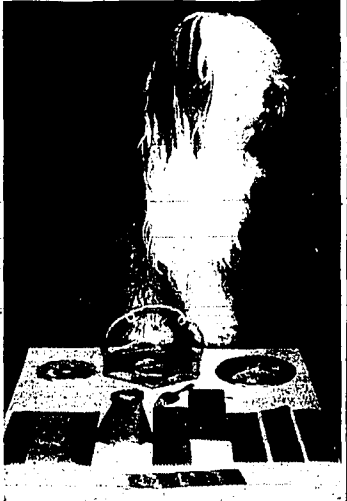

Hole Is Punched in Scientific Theory of Verbal Reinforcing

NEW YORK, Oct. 2 (AP)—Harvard university psychologists have put brakes on the growing popularity of a scientific theory that you or anyone else can influence the behavior of other human beings by interrupting their talk in proper places with a murmured, "mm-hmm."

Technically that is "selective reinforcement" and it has become the well-known psychological experiment in 1951 when Dr. Greenspan revealed the results of an experiment which indicated that the "reinforcement" need only a neutral murmur, like "mm-hmm."

He got college students to recite every word they could think of. Each time they gave off a plural noun, he said, "mm-hmm." The students responded by giving off more plural nouns. They had been "reinforced" their "verbal behavior" was influenced.

In reporting a contradicting experiment to the American Psychological Association, Donald C. Hill and Roger W. Brown of Harvard remarked that the implications of Greenspan's work were unpleasant. "This is learning without awareness," they said.

'Tight Money' Policy Boosts Cost of Autos

NEW-YORK, Oct. 2 (AP)—Rising costs of buying autos and appliances on time and difficulty in getting cash from the small loan companies are seen today as the next impact of tight money on consumers.

The firms that finance your auto purchase first borrow that money before they, in effect, lend it to you by handling installment business for the auto dealer.

Interest charges on the funds they borrow are going up and the big auto finance companies say that if their business is to remain profitable the wholesale finance charges they assess the dealers must go up, too. Auto dealers, in turn, will be less inclined to shave much off the price suggested by the auto makers.

In short, your car is likely to cost more because money is tight.

"I'm a realist," said Knowland, Senate minority leader. "It's quite obvious that the Democrats are making a vigorous campaign. I also feel Stevenson is a stronger candidate now than Harry Truman was in 1952—and it was Harry Truman's record the Republicans ran Against then."

Knowland told local Republican leaders that the presidential race could become so close that "one or two states could turn everything one way or the other."

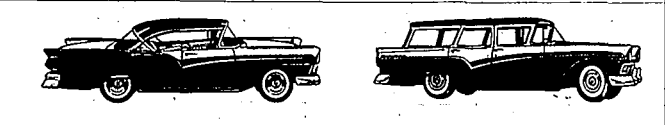

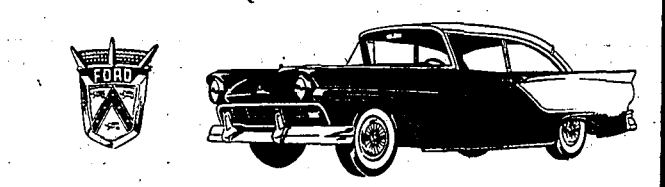
