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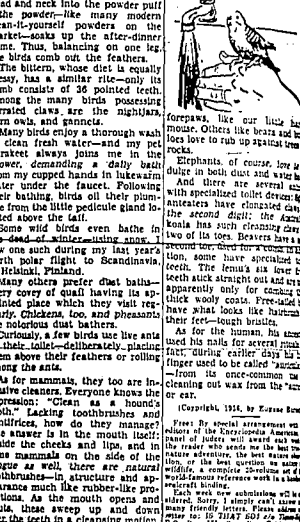



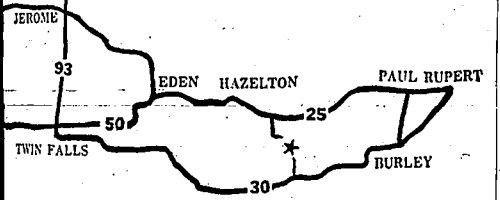

escapes in the continent. row course and they seem to jump and dash in path as they rush to Snake river follows another water course westward and the remains of the old river bed still are visible for several miles below the dam. At one point the ancient river cut sharply to the south and dumped its tons of water into the present river bed. Standing on the lowest bank of these dry falls is the stump of a cedar tree, which, according to its rings, was young and stout when Columbus discovered America.

The presence of this ancient stump is proof the river changed its course centuries ago. When in use by the river, water poured down the falls in a series of "steps." At the bottom of these steps are patches, worn round and smooth and deep by churning water.

Deep in the bottom of some of these holes is black sand and mud, mingling with the sand and silt of the low color-gold. Even though the area has been prospected time and time again, a little diligence with a pan will reveal enough gold to make it possible to claim you have discovered a mine.

Should you care to walk a little farther—the land beyond the dry falls borders between the crumbling walls of an ancient canyon far above the peeling, fuming Snake. In the walls on each side of this old canyon are indentations which, for want of a better name, could be called caves. Once they were the homes of nomadic Indians. Arrowheads, bone work, bone carvings and other artifacts of the ancient residents have been unearthed from the dry dust on the floors of the caves.

It is an arid country, this land now being made fertile by Millner reservoir. The waters of the Snake, harnessed for agriculture's use, have transformed much of the desert into farms and cities and homes. But the river are squeezed into a narrow here and there along the Snake's

Some critics say "yes" and assert as one of their reasons that the Church is not democratic.

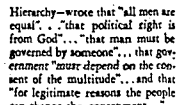

BOYDTON, Oct. 6 (Special)—The department has announced a report on streamflow records in the Snake river basin from 1885 to 1955. The report is a condensed summary of water supply and sanitary engineering data and operators of irrigation systems, irrigation power plants, and associated with streamflow records. The information easily can be obtained from the department. It has been necessary to publish 30 volumes of the report's annual water survey's annual water survey papers to find the average flow in the Snake river or its tributaries for any month over the past 70 years. From Woman's Hobby Comes Hours of Pleasure for Children in 14 Years

Using scraps of fur, old coats or jackets, Mrs. H. C. Martin, Twin Falls, has been proud hobbyist for her own and other children for the last 14 years by making an average of 50 stuffed teddy bears, puppies, horses and cats a year. She started making toys back in 1923 when the Martins lived on the farm, away from stores and toy shops. Mrs. Martin made stuffed animals and rag dolls for her children who at that time ranged from 2 to 14 years of age.

"My first efforts were pretty crude," she admits. "But the children liked them anyway. Soon their playmates showed an interest in the toys and I began making some for them."

From that small beginning, Mrs. Martin has progressed until she now makes toys for her grandchildren, their playmates, neighbors' children and underprivileged children, giving the bulk of the animals at Christmas time.

"It's surprising how you can make something that children will enjoy from things you were ready to throw away," said Mrs. Martin. "I have bought very little of the material I've used in my stuffed animals."

Most of them were made from old coats or jackets or scraps of material given to me by friends. They are "thank you" notes, a few written by the children's parents, but most of them written by the children themselves. Although she bought her first pattern, Mrs. Martin has made most of the patterns she now uses. She cuts them out on heavy paper, usually ordinary brown sack, and experiments with them until she gets the desired shape and size for her animals. Laying the paper patterns on her material, she cuts out each piece, then, using her sewing machine to give extra strength to the animals, Mrs. Martin pieces the material together and stuffs it with foam rubber, kapoc or scraps. Her favorite stuffing material is old nylon stock-

"I would definitely recommend making these stuffed toys to anyone who enjoys sewing and likes to do things for children," she said. "It's not nearly as hard on the eyes as crocheting or embroidering."

Mrs. Martin's biggest problem, however, is finding enough material and stuffing for her projects.
