### Catholic Aids Jewish Cause For Past Help

**CHICAGO, Oct. 10**—When he was a youngster John Sorenson was a member of the Jewish Community Center in his neighborhood. It was 40 years ago, Sorenson said, that he first met a Jewish man who was a member of the Jewish Community Center in Chicago and endorsed a cause which said: "I am an Irish Catholic and when I was a small boy I used to go over to the Irish on Taylor street, used to buy milk and cookies for a penny."

### Italy Testing U. S. Plan on 'Open Skies'

ROME, Oct. 10 (AP)—Italy has twice plane-crossed over Rome in a huge photographic operation today to test the practicality of the United States' "open skies" plan for world disarmament.

The P-84 jet planes of Italy's third-wing air force were photographing the entire city. The planes graphed to conduct similar aerial mapping operations in other regions of Italy from Genoa to Naples and Milan to Palermo.

Camouflaged war-making material and equipment was set out in certain spots around Rome to test whether it could be detected in the photographs. Made with special filters to penetrate haze and detect different colors in the ordinary black-and-white photographic film.

Officials said the aerial mapping program will continue for the next three or four days and that results of the test will be known by the end of the week.

By the time the operation has ended, everything under the Roman skies will have been photographed, from the Colosseum to the garbage cans in residential back yards.

The aerial photography program however is President Eisenhower's idea, which Italian aircraft will be free to cruise over the United States. In Rome said the move took them by surprise, but they said they were "delighted" that the Italians decided to try out the scheme by themselves.

The plan was approved by Premier Antonio Segni last week, and ordered by Defense Minister, Paolo Emilio Taviani.

### Dulles Seeks Wide Control On Waterway

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 10.—Secretary of State Dulles has said today that he is studying the possibility of a wide control of the waterway as an instrument of national policy.

Dulles told the U. N. security council today that this is the heart of the problem and that the first step should be an acceptance of the principle of the principle that a system should be set up to ensure against any such action.

He did not say whether a proposal made by Egypt yesterday for the establishment of a U. N. system of control for the operation of the canal was "constructive," but he indicated that this did not go far enough.

Soviet Foreign Minister Dmitri Shepilov quickly made it clear he would not accept the principle of all powers of the canal, but he said that the canal must be "insulated" from politics of any country.

Dulles said an important part of the conference this actually was a proposal for internationalizing the canal, but he said that he would appear in any international body organized to control the canal.

Dulles said firmly behind a British-French proposal which called for the establishment of a U. N. control of the canal. He said he would have no role for the British-French plan.

On the basic principle of guaranteeing that use of the canal as an instrument of national policy, the secretary of state said:

"I accept that simple and rudimentary principle of justice, then I believe that the subsidiary principle can be applied. If that principle is repudiated, then it is difficult to foresee a useful role for a governing body."

"Indeed, under those conditions it is difficult to foresee any settlement in the canal with the principles of justice and of international law."

Dulles spoke as the 11-nation conference moved to its opening session today in Geneva.

Despite the apparent gap between the western proposal and those of the Soviet bloc, Dulles said the "possibilities are good" for a peaceful solution of the problem.

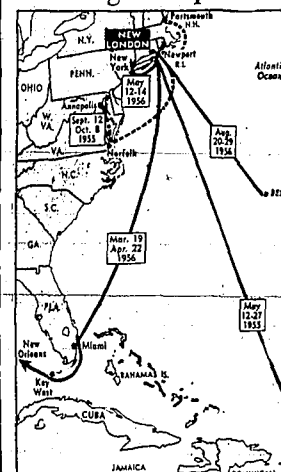

"That's a new problem facing sufferers of the hereditary disease whose victims bleed internally and their blood fails to clot."

And it's new because today most hemophiliacs aided by the coagulation powers of transfused blood and other modern medicine, reach adult life fifty years ago, 80 percent of them died before they reached 20.

"Our hemophiliacs are daily more convinced that they are able to live a normal life; to marry and face the responsibility of bringing up a family," said Argentine blood specialist Dr. Alfredo Pavlovsky to a report of the International Hemophilia symposium.

"At the symposium, held as a prelude to international meetings concerning the whole range of human blood problems, Dr. Pavlovsky said:

"Emotional tranquility," he said, "appears to be conducive to less severe and less frequent bleeding. Hemophiliacs who show intelligent ability, have tended to join in strenuous activities and often become the best adjusted of the adult population."

"Telling our" group meetings of hemophiliacs and their parents, now being sponsored by the National Hemophilia Foundation, were applauded by Poincaré as helping the cause of the disease."

Proceedings of the symposium will be published by the national foundation, and are expected to become the bible of men fighting the incurable disease, once thought limited to royalty but now reported to afflict 40,000 persons in the U.S. alone.

## Medical Official Scores Ethical Code; Blast Also Given Against Blue Shields

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 10 (AP)—The American College of Surgeons' belittles Emily Post could have written a "much better" code of medical ethics than the American Medical Association's.

This observation came yesterday from Dr. Paul R. Hawley, chief of the department of surgery at the University of California at Los Angeles, in the course of talks to two groups attending the 42nd annual conference of the ACS.

At the same time, Hawley also attacked the "questionable" activities of Blue Shield plans throughout the nation and criticized "scandalous" welfare general practitioners.

Dr. Thomas O. Murphy of the University of Minnesota medical school told the American College of Surgeons that one of the most common operations for arteriosclerosis may not be as effective as thought.

Murphy said he and other researchers at Minnesota experimented on rabbits to study the apparatus in the operation, in which surgeons cut the sympathetic nerves running into the legs.

Murphy said studies on rabbits who were operated on showed an increase in arteriosclerosis not only on the lumbar aorta but also in the smaller vessels of the paws and tibia.

Arteriosclerosis is hardening of the arteries, often found in older people. Arteriosclerosis is a form of arteriosclerosis involving the fatty degeneration of tissue.

Yale university surgeon described experiment using a substance which promotes help in treating blood clotting diseases.

Dr. Michael Hume, speaking to the American College of Surgeons, said the substance, Plamin, is an enzyme isolated from human blood. It attacks and destroys blood clots by eating away at the web-like network, called fibrin, which holds a blood clot together.

Hawley charged that the AMA code is like the traditional Mother's Day card.

"It covered everything, but touched upon very few points," he stated, "it overlooked the most important patient in the medical practice—the patient."

Dr. Hume said it is "largely a code of etiquette among physicians, which Emily Post could have written much better."

Hawley said Blue Shield plans

which covered 27 million Americans in 42 states, Purita Rico and Haiman doctors are trying to do special operations for which they have no training. But too many doctors, he continued, are splitting fees with unethical relatives, performing unnecessary operations, doing ghost surgery and charging exorbitant fees.

The best guiding precedent for a doctor, he said, is the golden rule.

"The full measure of the physician's ability is that he do unto his patient exactly as he would wish done to him, were he in the patient's position."

### Father, Child Will Continue Russia Flights

LONDON, Oct. 13 (AP)—Turnabout Russian-refugee Alexei Chwasov and his American daughter leave the "ambulance" of the Soviet Embassy Friday and sail for Russia aboard the Soviet liner Molotov, it was reported today.

There was no indication that any court action is contemplated to prevent Chwasov from taking the 24-year-old Tanya behind the iron curtain.

Chwasov arrived in Britain yesterday with the girl he smuggled past U. S. customs officials in New York over the protests of her mother, Mrs. Helen Dieczok, Detroit.

The Molotov is scheduled to sail Friday morning. Soviet officials hinted recently that Chwasov and Tanya would be aboard.

Mrs. Dieczok, who said she bore the child to the 24-year-old Chwasov out of wedlock, appealed to U. S. immigration officials to prevent him from taking her out of the United States. Inspectors searched the luxury liner Queen Mary for hours without success.

Sen. Herbert H. Lehman, D. N. Y., yesterday called on the state department to stop what he described as the "kidnaping on Communist leaders of an American citizen. Leaders of the Russian Orthodox church in the United States joined the appeal. The Church World Service of the National Council of Churches, which had sponsored Chwasov's entry into the U. S. from Germany in 1931, also urged action.

But Chwasov insisted he "shall be happy in Leningrad with my daughter."

"That is all I want," he said, in his broken English, to reporters yesterday.

But mostly he let his two Russian escorts speak for him.

The British consular reports that Chwasov was being coerced into returning to Russia. They called them "all foulmouths."

The American Church World Service said it understood Chwasov was returning to Russia because of threats of reprisals against his 22-year-old mother in the Soviet Union.

### Angry Mother Hates Man for Stealing Child

DETROIT, Oct. 13 (AP)—An angry mother has promised to sue the nose off the man taking their daughter to Russia if she ever sees him again.

It is unlikely, however, that Mrs. Helena Dieczok, 44, ever will get a chance to sue her promiscuous son, turnabout refugee Alexei Chwasov, 24, and his 24-year-old Tanya are expected to leave London for Russia Friday. Officials are not expected to make any effort to stop the two.

"I want Tanya back," Mrs. Dieczok said. "She belongs to me. I am promised to give her to me if he went to Russia. He does not need her."

Mrs. Dieczok said Chwasov was the father of the child but claimed Tanya was born in a Philadelphia hospital under the mother's maiden name of Ramonoff.

Freddie's father, Willard Elber, works during the day at Bishop Lumber company, 835 Shoshone street, south, near where the child was struck down by the car.

"A numerous crowd of friends came out every day to see Freddie's favorite of the hundreds he has received. He has it pinned above his bed where he can see it. 'The duck cries, but I don't,' Freddie said.

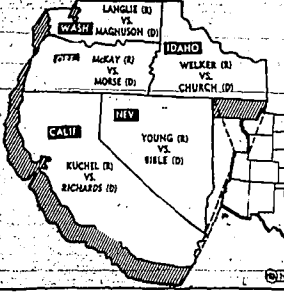

### Hodge Cannot Recall Details Of Fund Loss

CHICAGO, Oct. 10 (AP)—Former State Auditor Charles Hodge was called a liar and told he may be indicted for not cooperating with a Senate committee investigating a \$1 million dollar embezzlement of state funds.

Sen. J. William Fulbright yesterday said Hodge, currently serving a 15-year prison term, now he spoke of the money he pilfered from the state treasury.

"I don't know," Hodge responded to the Arkansas Democrat's question during a public hearing of the Senate banking and currency committee.

Opinion Snapped

"I think you're lying to the committee," Fulbright snapped.

Hodge's attorney had tried to account for a series of fraudulent checks by saying they were "trivial questions your memory works fine." Fulbright said "when we ask you about these checks, you refuse to tell us."

Cites System

"We have a system of parole," Hodge added. "It seems to me that if you had a more cooperative attitude you'd be more likely to get the benefits of the parole system."

The once-popular politician stated throughout the hearing that he was not "covering up" for anyone. Hodge spoke in flat, lifeless monotone, showing little of the spirit that had marked him as a free-wheeling playboy in his pre-prison days.

Hodge was finally excused from the witness stand and Fulbright named Edward A. Hitt, former Chicago bank president who accused the cashing of Hodge's stolen checks. Hitt, like Hodge, is in prison for his part in the scandal.

### Chinese Fight In New Riots; Police Called

HONG KONG, Oct. 13.—Two thousand Chinese refugees, fought with police and rioters today in a resettlement camp riot that started as a quarrel between pro-nationalist and pro-Communist Chinese.

Two Britons and an unknown number of Chinese were injured in the clash which police broke up by firing tear gas bombs. It was Hong Kong's first political demonstration since 1932.

An official statement said the rioting at the Lichenauk village resettlement area, near the city of Kowloon across the bay from Hong Kong proper, broke out following a "dispute over some flats." He did not say what the dispute was about.

But Chinese reports said the rioting began when the communists tried to lead down a ceremonial march led by the nationalists to celebrate today's "double tenth" anniversary—the 45th anniversary of the founding of the national government by Dr. Sun Yat-sen.

Police sources said the riots appeared entirely spontaneous and that they believed no organized rioting was planned.

The rioting was reported to have been a "dispute over some flats." He did not say what the dispute was about.

But Chinese reports said the rioting began when the communists tried to lead down a ceremonial march led by the nationalists to celebrate today's "double tenth" anniversary—the 45th anniversary of the founding of the national government by Dr. Sun Yat-sen.

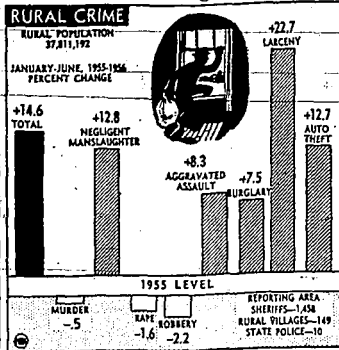
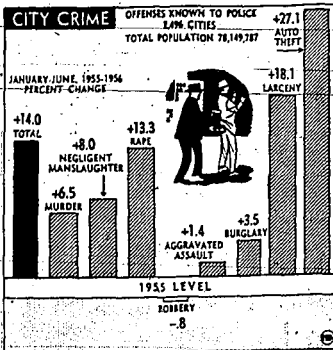

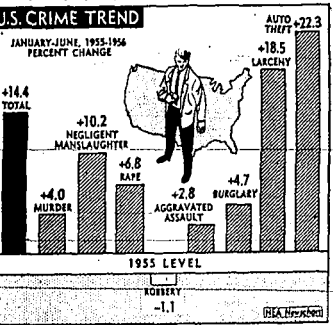

During the first six months of this year, crime in this country took a whopping jump of 14.4 per cent over the corresponding period of 1935. That's the startling story told in the federal bureau of investigation's semi-annual report, just issued. By mid-year, 1935, over-all crime was down 8.2 per cent from 1934's first half, the first crime decrease in eight years. By mid-year, 1934, 1,291,159 crimes had been committed—15,778 more than 1935's mid-year score. National crime picture shows one bright spot—robbery is down 1.1 per cent from 1934. Chart shows rural crime up 14.8 per cent over 1935 mid-year mark, although murder decreased 3 per cent, rape 1.4 per cent and robbery 2.2 per cent. Chart shows a rise of 14 per cent in city crime. There were 164,182 crimes committed in cities—82,719 more than in the first half of 1935. (APCA)

### Wartime Gas Now Used to Slay Cancers

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 19.—A report of the wartime gas used in the world war is being given to patients undergoing surgery for cancers that spread by way of the veins.

They took the 42nd clinical conference of the American College of Surgeons on "encouraging" results from the use of the drug, nitrogen mustard, on patients.

The doctors are Ernest P. Cruz, Gerald O. McDonald and Warren H. Cole. All are in the department of surgery of the University of Illinois college of medicine.

The drug already has been administered to cancer patients operated on for removal of tumors from breast, stomach or colon.

The aim, the researchers said, was to kill at the start microscopic cancer cells that often are left undetected after surgery and find their way to the lungs or the liver.

These cells may account for some of the poor results in cancer surgery, McDonald said.

"We still feel that surgery is the main weapon against cancer, but we believe that drugs can be an important adjunct in this fight."

In another paper, three Tennessee doctors reported on the first cure of an acute form of leukemia in a laboratory animal.

It involves an anti-serum similar to that obtained from horses for the treatment of tetanus, leukemia tumor cells of a mouse were injected into a rabbit to form an anti-serum and which in turn was injected back into leukemia-infected mice.

Leukemia was completely suppressed in 90 per cent of the cases, depending on how much anti-serum was administered.

Results of the experiment were reported by Drs. James T. Grace, Frank Gillan and Robert L. Carlson, all Nashville. They are members of the surgical experimental laboratory and surgical service of the Veterans Administration hospital, and department of surgery of Vanderbilt University hospital.

### Reds to Receive Japanese Autos

TOKYO, Oct. 19.—The first Japanese automobiles to be exported to Communist China will be shipped sometime this month, well-known trade sources reported today.

The automobiles—two Toyopet crown six coupe models built by the Toyota auto works at a cost of \$1,233 each—were purchased by Red China for research purposes to help set up its own auto industry, the sources said.

Radio Beijing said Communist China previously received a shipment of 115 Japanese three-wheeled trucks.

### Injury Sustained By Large Vessel

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—The Navy said today that the super-cargo carrier *Porpoise* damaged the blades on one of its four turbines and has put in at Norfolk, Va., for repairs.

One of the damages is being investigated, the navy said, before the 80,000-ton vessel, first of the super-cargo class, was operating off the Atlantic coast when the damage was discovered. The vessel headed for port immediately and put in at Norfolk on Monday.

The navy said it does not know how long the carrier will be laid up.

### Hitler's Sister To Set-Down Her Memoirs

BERGHEIM, Germany, Oct. 19.—Adolf Hitler's sister said today she is writing her memoirs to set some of the record about her family straight.

"And the readers will forgive me if I abstain from depicting my brother at all costs as a wicked character, just for the sake of profit," she told a reporter.

"I must complete these memoirs. I owe it to the memory of my parents to tell the truth. So many distorted reports have been written in the postwar years that I have to set some facts straight about my parents, my youth and my brother."

Paula Hitler, 60, whose name was changed to Paula Wolf on Hitler's orders in 1938, was interviewed at her home.

She said she had been using the name Wolf for some time before 1938 because "I never liked to show off."

"I am a simple woman and I have always lived simply. I never had more than two rooms and a kitchen," the white-haired woman said.

Adolf Hitler probably will be declared dead officially later this month by a Munich court. Miss Wolf hoped she then will be allowed to take possession of a trustful of Hitler keepsakes, including some water colors he painted. She said she had decorations and a Nazi party badge. These are held by the Bavarian government.

Since the war she has lived on a small pension in one room of a crab house here. She said she had been given notice to move out but the tenant who needs the room has agreed she may stay until she has found a new apartment.

"It's the first time in my life that I have been given notice," she sighed, glancing around her simply furnished room. "There was no picture of her brother on the wall."

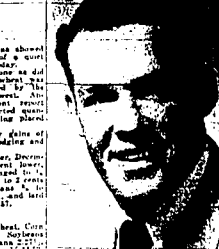

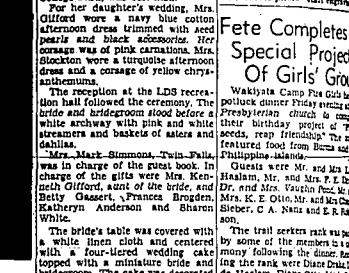

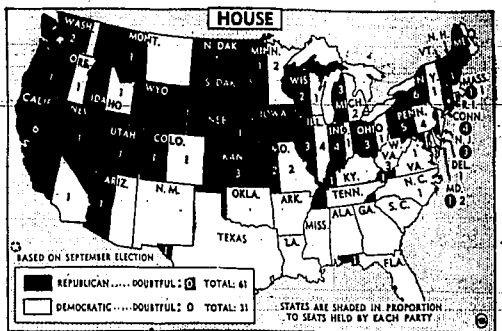

**BROOKLYN, Oct. 10 (AP)—**Jackie Robinson laced a single over leaping Enos Slaughter in the 10th inning Tuesday to give Brooklyn's Ciam Labine a 1-0 victory over the New York Yankees' Bob Turley and square the world series at three games each. It was a tense battle all the way between Labine's sharp breaking sinker and Turley's smoking fast ball until Robinson finally came through with the blow that assured Dodger fans of a seventh game at Ebbets field Wednesday.

The first time Robinson poked two to third base, Turley was lined out. The second time he lined a fly ball with two out to score Jimmy Gilliam with the run which beat the Yankees 1-0. "I carried the world series into the clinactic seventh game Wednesday," said Robinson.

"Of all, I didn't want Turley pitching to that lefthander (Robinson)," Stengel said. "But the main thing was the wind. It was blowing out toward right field and in toward home plate from left. So the odds were all right." Turley, beaten despite a magnificent performance, said, "I'll have to go with the manager all the way on that."

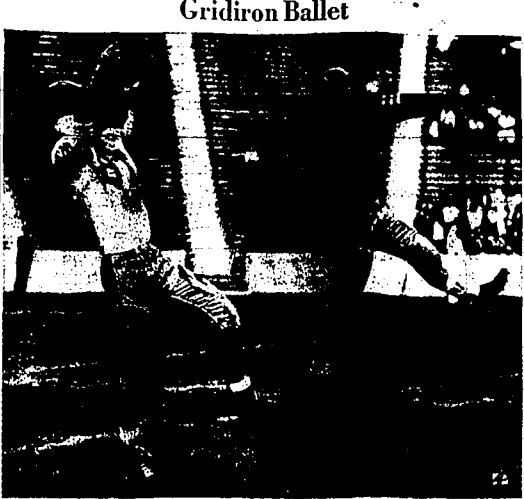

## Larsen Joins Select Group of 'Immortals'

BROOKLYN, Oct. 10 (AP)—Destiny has claimed Don Larsen as it has claimed only nine other men in baseball history. Down through all the years it had come to only these few to possess what the New York Yankees' 27-year-old right-hander possesses today—an achievement which sets him apart for all time. These are men who achieved immortality in varying ways—one with a stroke of his bat, another with a stroke of luck and four others with the help of each other. And yet, they stand unique — to be remembered for all time because each has stood in a situation in which none other can say he has.

Larsen achieved that distinction Monday with the first perfect game in the 53-year history of world series play. If he never retires another ball—or throws another ball—he always will be remembered for his special two hours and six minutes of consummate pitching ability.

Such an hour, came to Bobby Thomson of the New York Giants on Oct. 12, 1951, when he struck a three-run homer off Ralph Branca with one out in the last half of the ninth inning to give his team a 4-1 victory in the final game of its three-game playoff for the flag with the Dodgers. It was—and is—the greatest "clutch hit" in the game's history.

That game—and yet distinct—lightning of immortality struck for Cookie Lavagetto, Oct. 3, 1947, when his pinch-hit, two-run double in the

## Larsen Makes Diamond History After Nearly 10 Undistinguished Seasons

NEW YORK, Oct. 10 (AP)—Until he pitched the greatest World Series game since 1903, Don Larsen's name in baseball had been undistinguished. He was only seven games in 1953 and only three in 1954, while establishing a dubious record of 27 defeats in 1954.

Larsen was virtually an unknown in 1947.

He pitched 1947 and 1948 with the Yankees and in 1949 he was sent down to Glove-A-Min of the Texas-Arizona League because of a sore arm.

There he played outlandish and for a period it appeared he might never become a pitcher at all.

His minor league tour included Wichita in the Western League and Wichita Falls of the Big State (1950).

**Series Pitchers In Legal Trouble**

NEW YORK, Oct. 10 (AP)—Two world series pitchers got into judicial hassles Monday—some over support payments to his estranged wife and the other over a subpoena issued by a hecker.

Shortly before Yankee Don Larsen pitched the first perfect game in series history, his wife got a state supreme court order designed to hold up his series money on the ground that he was in arrears.

Doctor Don Newcombe was served with a simple assault summons. It was obtained by a parking lot attendant who raised the big pitcher last Friday after the Yankees knocked him out of the box.

Normal Water For Columbia Basin Is Seen

Normal Water For Columbia Basin Is Seen

PORTLAND, Oct. 10 (AP)—The outlook is for a normal amount of water in the Columbia basin this year, according to a U. S. geological survey report today.

The report, issued by one of the dam project's engineers, says that the firm power loads can be met with the next month and that federal dams may begin restoring some of the interruptible loads soon.

The measurable flows depending on the amount of water being held by governmental power from the Henry Horse dam and other side sources.

W. M. Orem, geological survey chief, said that under average conditions the flow of water in the basin is 100 per cent of the 1955 average for the month. The flow could dip to 85 per cent if conditions are as adverse as they have been in 20 years, Orem said.

He said the 1955-56 water year, which began in September, is the second year at 17 of 31 gauging points in the basin. The flows were average every month of the year except February. The September flow on the Columbia river was 90 per cent of average.

**Nation's Youth Correction Act Untwists Delinquents**

WASHINGTON (NEA)—The 18-year-old, half man, half boy act scoring in front of the federal parole board official.

"How long before I can get out of here?" he asked belligerently.

"That depends on your progress," came the straight answer. "Under this set-up you have to earn your way out and prove you can get along in society."

This is a typical question, but it's a relatively new answer. It illustrates a fresh look Uncle Sam is now taking with scores of federal law breakers who "wear green-up" clothes but behave like children.

And this realistic attitude, mixed dose of therapy and discipline, means the nation is taking a step towards solving one of its most difficult problems—dealing with delinquents short of adulthood but beyond the juvenile age range.

Today scores of these young men between 18 and 22 are learning to face the responsibilities of adults under a program laid out by the federal youth correction act of 1950.

After two and a half years of actual operation the beginning to prove that the twisted lives of young criminals can be untwisted.

"Our function is to understand the offender and his problems in a manner that is socially acceptable," says George J. Reed, chairman of the youth correction division of the U.S. board of parole.

"Our program neither assures a 'soft' nor a 'tough' approach, but one of firm, consistent understanding.

In a nutshell this approach requires the delinquent to shape up or stay in an institution. The one thing he can't do is sit out his sentence without making a genuine effort to improve.

"We must diagnose his case, plan and carry through treatment and make recommendations as to his release," explains James V. Benetti, U.S. bureau of prisons director. "This is certainly a pretty large order and one we approach with the utmost seriousness."

Offenders are generally first sent to the Federal Correction Institution in Ashland, Ky. for preliminary study to determine what got them into their difficulties and "what ought to be done about it."

This is one of six institutions that have been specially set aside for a youth program. The others are at Englewood, Colo.; Chillicothe, O.; El Reno, Okla.; the National Training School in Washington, D. C.; and the Natural Bridge camp in Virginia.

To date, only youth committed from districts in the eastern part of the U. S. come in under the new program. By the first of the year, however, it's hoped that facilities will be available to include the rest of the country.

Results so far indicate that this more individual and flexible approach is paying off.

As last report, 716 youths had been sentenced under the act since it got rolling. In that two and a half year period 208 persons have been released on parole. And by the end of the year it is expected that the parole rate will reach 30 to 40 per month.

So far the average length of institutional stay has been 10 months for the youth offender, as compared to 15 1/2 for the average offenders who missed the program.

Of the 203 young men paroled, only 34 committed violations as of last May. This leads Reed to comment:

"When we examine the type person with whom we are dealing, we would normally expect a higher than average number of violators from this group. This is a very difficult but challenging age group and one that is responsible for most of the crimes committed in the U. S."

State's Prisoners May Bake Pastry

BOISE, Oct. 10 (AP)—Warden L. E. Clapp says he will ask the state board of examiners for authority to buy about \$2,000 worth of bakery equipment so the Idaho state prison can bake its own pastry. Clapp said prisoners and the staff eat about 300 pounds of bread a day. Approval of the funds would mean saving of about \$20 daily and would give inmates a chance to earn a useful job, he said. The warden said the baking activities would be set up in the old license plate factory in the main yard. They would provide various types of baked goods besides bread.
