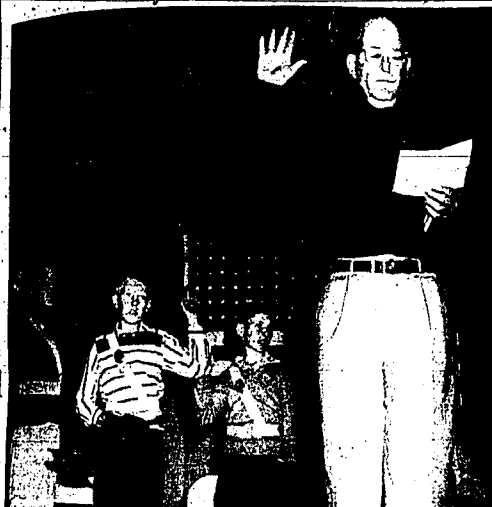

### Navy Aircraft Equipped by New Weapon

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17 (AP)—The navy announced today that its aircraft in the Mediterranean and western Pacific now are equipped with a new guided missile able to destroy enemy planes at altitudes greater than 50,000 feet. The "Sidewinder" after the fall-striking desert rattle-snake. "Sidewinder" is a bi-boosted weapon about eight to nine feet long with four fins at its nose and four at its tail. Navy photographs showed F-4 Phantom fighter planes carrying two of the missiles under each wing. The navy described the "sidewinder" as "a rugged, inexpensive weapon capable of operating against high performance type aircraft." The weapon is designed chiefly for defense of ships at sea but also will be employed by navy units in continental air defense, the navy said. The range of the sidewinder is not given but was reported to be greater than that of the sparrow, a guided missile carried by fighter planes in the sixth fleet. The sparrow has a range of about five miles. The missile, conceived six years ago by the naval ordnance test station, China Lake, Calif., is being produced at Philadelphia, Pa., by the government industrial division of Polio, General Electric, Utica, N. Y., has been given a production contract.

### Scholars Try To 'Recreate' Biblical Text

ATLANTA, Ga., Oct. 17 (AP)—Biblical scholars are trying to recreate the New Testament in the very words of the first devout men who recorded its nearly 2,000 years ago.

The task is staggering. Seven years already have gone into the project. Another 15 years and \$500,000 will be needed when the results are printed in four languages which only a few hundred scholars will read.

But Dr. Merrill M. Parvis, a crew-cut professor of theology, believes a new translation of the New Testament will eventually come from the International Greek New Testament project he directs from two small basement rooms at Emory university here.

Scholars working at Emory and Oxford, England, journey with microfilm to libraries, museums and remote monasteries on Mt. Sinai, arduous every variation of every word in every known manuscript written in the first thousand years of the Christian era.

In the 800 manuscripts, mostly in Greek, they expect to find one million variations in the 162,282 words of the present New Testament.

The New Testament was not considered the basis for a religion at first, Parvis said. "Many years elapsed and many changes were made before it was accepted as scripture and preserved."

Thirty thousand hours of work have turned up 30,000 variations, mainly typographical and similar minor errors, in the gospel of Luke alone.

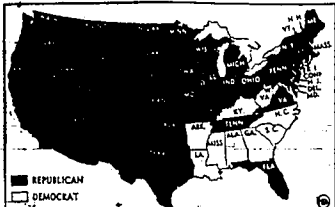

### Christening Is Held on Sleek, New Pacific Service Steamer

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 17.—A bottle of champagne was smashed against the hull of the Matson line's new 14,000-ton passenger liner Mariposa yesterday as the new vessel was christened with the blessing of President Eisenhower.

The Mariposa, which will ply the route Pacific coast, was the first of two liners to be completed for Matson at the Willamette Iron and Steel company here. The second, the Monterey, will follow the Mariposa into service Jan. 6.

Fretty Electa Bevier, 16-year-old daughter of Matson President Harold Bevier, smashed the bunting-wrapped champagne bottle against the sleek vessel which sails today for San Francisco to prepare for her maiden voyage Oct. 28.

Some 400 persons braved a drenching downpour which caused postponement of a scheduled number of speeches.

The short ceremony lasted about seven minutes. Gov. Elmo Smith was introduced and a high school band played the national anthem. A personal message from President Eisenhower to Bevier read:

"Congratulations to the man who built the new SS Mariposa and to the men who will direct her maiden voyage via Honolulu and the south seas to New Zealand and Australia. The christening of this ship is a splendid sign of our economic strength and of our faith in the future. The Matson Navigation company are serving the highest interest of the nation and the American merchant marine in this undertaking."

The reconstruction of this vital American flag passenger ship service includes a new link with our friends and allies in the Pacific and strengthens the men of good will everywhere. Best wishes for the first of many safe and pleasant voyages."

The Mariposa, which had been tested at sea in a trial run earlier, is a converted mariner type vessel. It will carry 325 passengers, all in first class air-conditioned accommodations.

The new Mariposa is the third Matson ship to bear the name. Mrs. Bevier christened the vessel with these words: "I christen thee SS Mariposa, May God bless you and those who travel upon you."

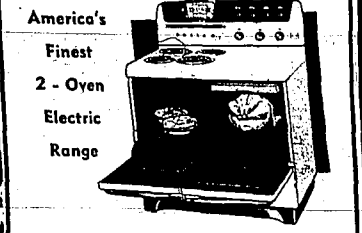
