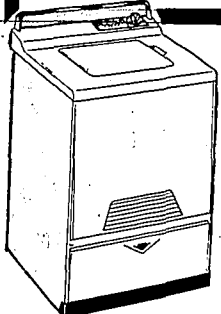

Meanwhile, State Attorney John G. Clark said he would file charges of murder, manslaughter, conspiracy against about 14 youths involved in the street brawl.

This was a gang affair and the responsibility for it is a gang one," Clark said. "We are going to prosecute all identified in the gang."

"They tell you 'you're going out on a rumble with us, aren't you? You have to go... you just can't say no...'"

Blach also explained terms like "rumble" and "jam" to police, saying "rumble" meant a willingness to fight in a knife brawl while "jam" meant a dare or lack of fear about the consequences which might arise.

One story heard by police about the conflict was that Krue, Bakovic and two others drove up to a bench where White, Melant and another youth were sitting. Krue asked if the two were "heckle" neighborhood gang. When White stood up and said he was, Krue was said to have started shooting.

Frank White, father of the dead youth, said he and his wife attended to play for their boy and his killed. He said "we feel sorry for him" even though he has a "ret" price to pay for his action.

Clergy Rates Near Bottom In Pay Scale

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17 (AP)—Despite an upward salary trend in recent years, ministers still rank at or near the bottom of the professional pay scale, a United Press survey disclosed today.

For school teachers — another notoriously ill-paid group — apparently are somewhat better off than professional men.

Precise comparisons are impossible because of wide variations in salaries collected by different religious bodies on clerymen's income. Government agencies have collected official figures since the 1850 census.

The census showed that the median income of a minister in 1940 was \$2415—less than that of any other professional group and less than many non-professional groups such as bus drivers, bakers and blacksmiths.

The survey showed that ministers in some denominations have received substantial pay raises since 1940. For example, the United Methodist church reported an average 37 per cent in the Congressional Christian church, 35 per cent in the Episcopal church, 21 per cent in the Protestant Episcopal church.
