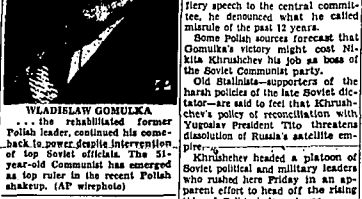

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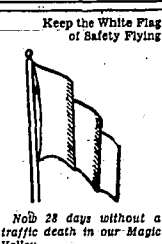

BOISE, Oct. 22.—Federal funds for extension library services to rural communities will not be available to Idaho unless matching funds are provided.

Mrs. Glenn Balch, Boise, chairman of the state library board, addressed members of the state library board and the Idaho State Library association Saturday during a meeting at the headquarters of the state traveling library.

To qualify for the federal aid it is necessary for the state to have a library fund to provide 12,500, she said. In order to do this, the budget would have to be raised to \$110,000 for the 1935-1936 biennium.

This local unit has been handicapped by the inability to get aid from the state library to assist in aid and to solve "technical and administrative problems," Mrs. Balch said. "We need extension workers and consultants to help."

Arthur L. DeVolder, Twin Falls, chairman of the Idaho Library Development committee, read a paper on present library conditions in Idaho and the need for a careful study of existing laws. He mentioned the possible need to change local and state laws to allow a better working partnership between the state and federal governments.

DeVolder emphasized the importance of organizing large library districts in the rural areas to take full advantage of concentrated financial, educational and administrative services.

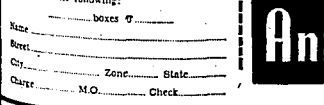

There are the tentative conclusions of observers who make a profession of studying the communist line. They do not always agree on all points, but they do agree on one thing: that communism has reached a major turning point in its drive for world domination. They believe the near-revolt in Poland, the intellectual rebellion, the reports of satellite and western communist for "separate roads to socialism" are effects rather than causes of the ideological split which has produced ferment in the Kremlin Empire.

The experts believe that Khrushchev and the present controlling majority of the Soviet Politburo have decided that the development of communism at home and abroad tends a loosening of the reins. "democratic" debate and a choice of "separate roads."

The long-range aim of this process is to bring about a "democratic" party by winning genuine support of the Russian people, who are disgusted and disillusioned by the present regime. They do not know real democracy.

To allay the fears of former communist people in the Near-East, Far East, Europe, for the industrial progress communism promises, but suspicion of the Soviet record of exploitation.

To tell western peoples into the belief that communism is "just another" political movement, and that democratic people should join into a "popular front."

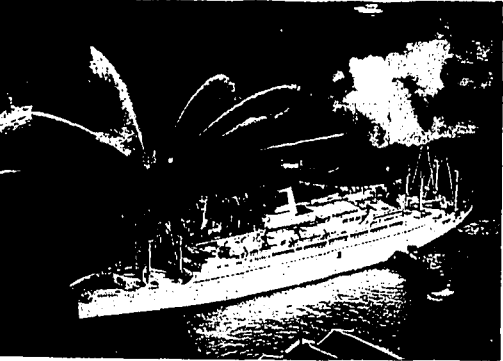

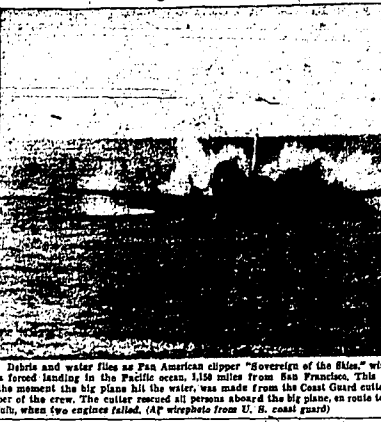

Ike's Speeches Raising Party's Hopes for Win

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22 (AP)—President Eisenhower's five-day campaign swing last week made him more confident than ever of winning the Nov. 6 election, White House sources said today.

His confidence was bolstered both by the enthusiastic reception of large crowds and by the optimistic reports of local GOP leaders, a White House aide said.

"We think we are going to carry all five states we were in," White House Press Secretary James W. Hagerby said. The states were Minnesota, Washington, Oregon, California and Colorado.

The trip also was considered by Mr. Eisenhower's associates to be a most effective answer on the health issue.

Mr. Eisenhower appeared fresh, healthy and in high spirits throughout the five days of plane flights, long motorcades and speeches.

White House aides said the campaign tour wasn't barnstorming, which Mr. Eisenhower had said he would not do. But they smiled when they said it. And to veteran political reporters who covered the trip, it was at least the next thing to barnstorming.

Globemaster Has Antarctic Mishap

AUCKLAND, N. Z., Oct. 22 (AP)—The U. S. air force Globemaster "State of Washington" crashed landed at McMurdo sound in Antarctica at end of a flight from Christchurch, N. Z., it was reported here today.

No injuries were reported.

It was the second crash to be reported. A U. S. navy Neptune bomber crashed in bad weather last week when landing at McMurdo sound, killing four men.

The first air force round trip flight to Antarctica was completed successfully last night when the Globemaster, "Miss South Carolina," landed at Harewood airport on a 4,000-mile flight. It brought out three seriously injured navy fliers, victims of the Thursday Neptune crash.

Hearst officials in New York said the sale was part of a modernization and expansion program of the organization's 15 newspapers in 11 other cities. The Hearst newspaper group has been installing new production equipment in 11 papers and the sale of the American will facilitate the Hearst modernization program in Boston, Baltimore, New York and San Francisco, officials said.
