VIENNA, Oct. 25 (U.P.)—Rebel forces seized control of most of Hungary today, set up a revolutionary regime and battled to oust all Russian troops from the country with the help of Hungarian army elements, Soviet deserters and a general workers strike. Diplomatic reports said heavy mortar and tank firing continued in the suburbs and center of the capital city of Budapest, where the revolt started as a protest demonstration Tuesday night and spread into full-scale rebellion.

### WEST GERMAN PROBLEM

Despite the fact that the political spotlight today is on nuclear weapons and their future, it is still true that the United States and its allies must rely upon the presence of West Germany's political continuation as a vital element.

A German army of 500,000 men has been planned. But almost from the moment the Germans were admitted to NATO obstacles have cluttered the path to its fulfillment.

Right now the barriers seem high.

The Social Democrats' main reason for opposing a German NATO army is their opposition to the belief it will throw a permanent roadblock in the way of German reunification. They play, too, on Germany's reluctance to serve as a battlefield in a future war, or to become involved in a major conflict with the Soviet Union.

There are, however, some realistic realizations in Europe that have not materially changed. The way to keep the Russians out of Germany will be strong, on the ground of German soil as well as in our plane reserves and nuclear arsenal.

It is hard to understand this. Evidently he will need only our moral support but a good deal of luck, however, to bring the German army into being in sufficient numbers so that it may fill its key place in the NATO shield.

One can only hope he has that luck in the year ahead.

### 'Peace Atoms' Statute Ready For Signature

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 23—The United Nations opened for signature today the atomic energy statute approved by 82 nations to govern the first global "atoms for peace" program.

Delegates had worked over the IAEA statute paragraph-by-paragraph since mid-September. They reached final agreement Tuesday when in France and Switzerland worked out a compromise formula on the inspection-and-control system that had threatened unyielding opposition from India and the Asian countries backed by Russia.

U. N. officials said about 60 nations were prepared to sign the charter in today's session.

Following signature of the statute, it will be sent to the parliaments of the countries signing it for ratification. The IAEA will go into operation when 18 countries have ratified the statute. The target date was set for next spring.

Until the first board of governors is elected, an 18-member preparatory commission will take charge of arrangements, including provision for locating IAEA's permanent headquarters in Vienna.

Ambassador James J. Wadsworth, who represented the U. S. government throughout the long proceedings on the statute, will speak for Washington on the commission.
