Writer Offers Story of Suez Area Invasion

 WITH ROYAL MARINE COMMANDER
 MANDYB-Port Said, Nov. 4.—(Delayed)—I was at a vantage point 500 yards from the beach when British commandos advanced ashore for the invasion. I had lived underground for 72 hours—an enemy alien behind barbed wire—prior to the landing. (Webb is a British citizen.)
 From a strategic apartment I could see the 100-foot-high lightning. It still is raging late in the afternoon. Egyptian suicide squads, making a last-ditch stand there, shot the last of the resistance is coming from the Egyptian army yesterday when British and French paratroops landed west and south of the town.

Little Resistance
 There was little resistance from the Egyptian army as the commandos descended ashore just as dawn was breaking.
 Accurate naval bombardment of the resistance of the Egyptians in the beachhead at Port Said was under the able state of Ferdinand de Lesseps, the man who built the Suez canal in the 19th century.

British and French paratroops retreated into the town in disorder. Retripos and along the beach. The British and French were being blanketed out one by one by the Egyptian commandos. Costs Increased



The Washington wholesale produce market, like many others across the country, continues an unrelenting way of bringing fruit and vegetables to dining room tables. Marketplaces, supplies, deterioration and excessive trucking costs add \$100 to carload prices.

Antiquated Methods of Wholesaling Produce Add Millions to Consumers

New York, (NEA)—Millions of dollars are plucked from American pocketbooks each year by antiquated methods of bringing fresh fruit and vegetables from farm to family dinner table.
 Powerful and entrenched interests across the nation persist in operating dilapidated wholesale markets in industrial areas, blighted by filth, congestion and unsanitary handling of produce.
 The result is that spoilage, deterioration—and excessive carrying costs add about 20 per cent to the nation's annual seven billion dollar bill for fresh produce. Who picks up the tab? You and the farmer—you pay more, he gets less.
 In New York City, where some 150,000 tons of fresh fruit and vegetables roll in every year, \$100 is added to the cost of each carload of an antiquated wholesaling setup.
 The Washington Wholesale Produce market is a group of ancient buildings covering 17 city blocks in the shadow of lower Manhattan's financial-district skyscrapers. Here most of the city's 300 wholesalers have ground-floor stores. The top floors are abandoned, their broken windows yawning like a giant's teeth, eating blocks, millions of dollars of fresh, and not-so-fresh, fruits and vegetables—by foundations—ready for their local customers.
 Patay D'Agostino, who owns a chain of supermarkets in Manhattan, must send his trailer trucks from his Bronx warehouse at 11 o'clock at night to pick up produce in time for next morning's shoppers. At Washington market his trucks, along with hundreds of others, get jammed in the narrow, produce-piled streets. His drivers must park blocks away and the produce must be handled by hand carriers—adding costs meanwhile his own men, paid at union rates, sit idly by because of the confusion and congestion it

Knuhl Grange Is Winner of Prize

Advertising Men View Presley As New Boon to Vast Market

NEW YORK (NEA)—To the boys in the advertising dons of Madison Avenue, Elvis Presley is just a statistic. He excites them, but not because they see in him a young, lithe, eye-catching figure.

They see in Elvis Presley a way to reach the teen-age market, an ever-increasing group that has an average of \$12.71 spending-money each week.

The first beautiful surveys indicate that the teen-agers are a loyal group; if Elvis appears on a show that sponsors hearing aids, about that sponsor hearing aids, although they'll have up for hearing aids.

—The ad-men, just like competitors, the Bill Haley, the Pat Boone, the Carl Perkins, and the other rockers, rollers and wigglers—seem to have equal facility at reaching the young spenders.

All this is explained in the influential TV advertising magazine, "Sponsor," headed "Can Elvis Sell Soap?" The conclusion is that the teen-agers' hearts and pocketbook.

Elvis Presley's appeal is often hard for some people to figure. There have been attempts to explain it psychologically — he represents, this reasoning has it, the freedom from adult supervision that many teenagers subconsciously hunger for. And there have been attempts to explain it economically — a cold publicity bought him his fame and fortune, and the people adore and say that it's just one of those crazy things.

But nobody can doubt that his appeal exists. A TV show with Presley on it zooms into the wild high-rating syndicates. A new Presley record sells almost a million copies before it comes out; a Presley movie, slight as it is, is booked into the biggest theaters across the nation; Presley's name is on the lips of millions and is snatched up by adoring fans.

These fans, with a few pitiful exceptions, are confined to the 13-18 year age bracket. This is a whopping bracket — every day, Sponsor says, 100 million children qualify.

Time was when Madison Avenue and its wealthy clients all but ignored teen-agers. They figured they had little money to spend, little in-

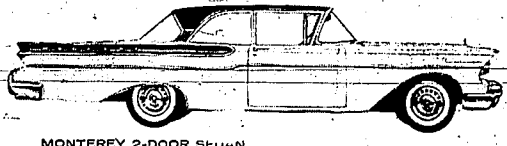

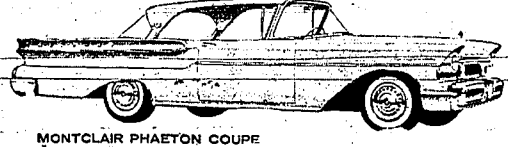

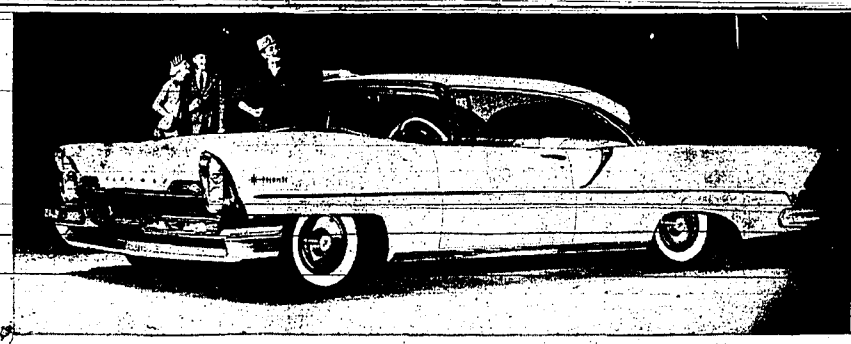

Easy Payments Plans Shaping Living Pattern

NEW YORK, Nov. 8 (AP)—Living it up means more than the usual increasing number of Americans. Just Uncle Sam gave a helping hand. Now it's the banks, although mostly with reluctance.

For some time living it up has meant an income—meaning, living up the current and expected income by budgeting it carefully and promoting it as the installment plan. For most this means determining just how many different ways or monthly payments the paycheck will stretch. For the cautious it also means leaving a few dollars leeway for emergencies.

Business demerit has entered this way of life increasingly of late. This consists in essence of making the budget as nearly unalterable as possible—by having them extracted either from the paycheck itself or by having the bank payments without troubling the debtor.

Uncle Sam gave the movement a big boost when he had employers deduct income tax and social security payments from paychecks. As one result many persons now only vaguely what percentage of their incomes goes for taxes.

Many other deductions can be made. You can arrange similarly for payment of union dues, contributions to pension programs and purchase of savings bonds or of stock in the company where you work.

You never get your hands on the total amount you're told your employer is paying you—except in the form of a check which management can use it, or the amount it costs the company to have you around.

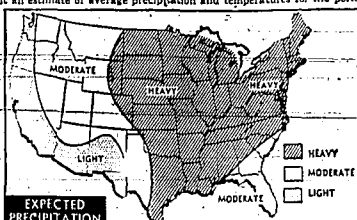
Accustomed to this, many Americans began budgeting to see just how many payments the remaining income would cover. Their standard of living is now determined not so much by what the wage earner makes but by how much he does to owe.

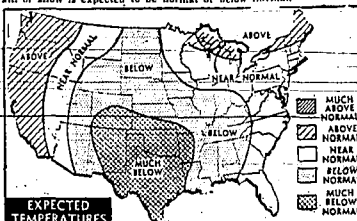

Chinese Reds Back Russ in Hungary Acts

TOKYO, Nov. 8 (AP)—Communist Chinese Premier Chou En-lai has assured Russia his government's friendship will not be affected by the current "man-of-steel" trial in the Moscow-imposed government in eastern Europe.

The Chinese people "will always cherish their unbreakable friendship with the Soviet Union," Chou said at a reception given by Soviet ambassador to Peking yesterday.

"The great and eternal friendship between China and the Soviet Union fully conforms with the fundamental interests of our two peoples and of all progressive peoples," Chou said, according to a Peking radio broadcast heard here.

The red premier gave support to Russia's recent warnings to British, French and Israel to cease their fighting against Egypt and withdraw their troops. He said the Soviet position proved Russia is "the staunchest champion of world peace and the freedom and independence of nations."

Chou also said the Chinese people "absolutely support" the "just" position taken by the Soviet Union in the Hungarian incident.

Court Refuses Indian Claims On Lost Land

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8 (AP)—The U. S. court of claims today turned down a plea by the Sioux Indians for additional compensation for land they say the white man took from them under "duress" in 1877.

The long in question is 7,245,175 acres in the Black Hills country of South Dakota. Gold was found on the land in the 1870's and the subsequent rush of white men led to a Sioux uprising and the massacre of General Custer on the Little Big Horn river in Montana in 1876.

Today's ruling upholds an earlier ruling by the Indians' claim commission, which asserted the Sioux had been "fairly compensated" under the 1877 treaty.

That treaty, besides giving them 917,000 acres of other land, provided \$60 payments "to them" for rations, and other forms of help until they "are able to support themselves," the opinion said.

"These payments, through 1952, have totaled more than \$7 million dollars and are expected, the opinion said, to continue "for many years to come" at a rate of about \$250,000 a year.

"The only further course open to the Sioux is to take their case to the supreme court."

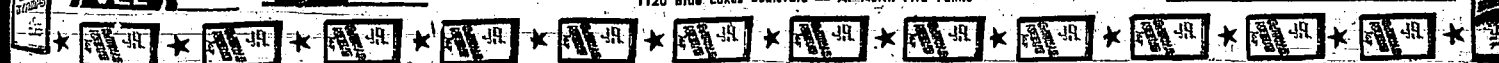

Postal Patron May Aid Yule Mail Delivery

Postal patrons can speed processing and assure faster delivery of Christmas packages and cards this year by now availing themselves of various postal services and special pamphlets. Postmaster W. W. Franta announces.

The pamphlets, available at all post offices, are titled "Packaging and Wrapping Parcels for Mailing" and "Domestic Packages Paid and Free." By obtaining both pamphlets patrons should become acquainted with all questions and problems regarding fees, special services and protection of Christmas parcels in transit.

The services listed in the pamphlets include:

1. This year, for the first time, sealed parcels may be mailed at the third or fourth class postage rates without labels, markings, or endorsements or endorsements authorizing the opening of the parcels for postal inspection. Strong cardboard boxes used on all Christmas packages as well as modern sealing materials.
2. A new "consumption mail" which is used for the first time during the 1954 Christmas mailing season, permits a sender to attach a fee of 15 cents plus first class postage.
3. Certified mail, also used for the first time in 1954, permits mailers to have proof of the delivery of Christmas letters, cards or parcels. It is insurable against loss for up to 15 cents plus first class postage.
4. Registered mail which provides greater security protection to letters and parcels carrying items of real financial value.
5. Special delivery mail which is given immediate delivery at the office of address during prescribed hours.
6. Airmail and air parcel post which provides quick delivery of parcels to any section of the country.

Postmaster Franta emphasized the importance of keeping labels and outside matters small. He says free labels for that purpose are available at the post office.

Atomic Plant Described at T. F. Session

Report on progress of the reactor testing station near Arco was given by W. C. Funk, deputy manager of the Idaho Operations office, at the latest dinner of the Methodist Men's club Tuesday night.

Funk said the Arco plant became the first plant to use electricity generated by atomic power. He said the plant was generated in December, 1951, and last July the town of Arco was lighted briefly by atomic-produced electricity.

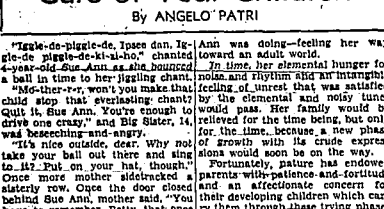

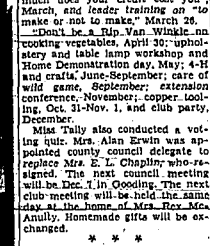

Strategists Cannot Determine Trend To Show How Demos Won Congress

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—Political strategists today are unable to determine how the Democrats will win Congress in the coming year, according to their presidential advisers.

But they could not agree on any one trend. Republicans made their predictions in some long-range forecasts. Democrats predicted a Democratic strong hold on the House and a narrow GOP majority in the Senate.

Democrats were assured of a majority even though a handful of seats still were in doubt. Apparently the Democrats' lead in the House is the main reason for their confidence.

Sen. George A. Smith, D. Fla., chairman of the Democratic national campaign committee, said he felt the people recognized that the Democrats have "done a good job" of running Congress for the past two years despite a Republican majority.

Smith said he thought regional issues, such as farm policy, public power and drought, may have been a factor in some areas. But he said most voters apparently felt free to ignore party labels and vote for the man they liked most for each office.

The Democrats defeated such staunch friends of Mr. Elzenhower as Sen. James H. Duff, R., Pa. one of the original Elzenhower-for-President enthusiasts, and former Gov. Don Thornton of Colorado.

The President's personal golfing companion at Denver, Thornton was left many people voted for the President as an individual but turned on GOP congressional candidates as a means to "get even with somebody" for dissatisfaction over drought, economic problems, farm policies or what have you.

Republicans won a major upset in normally Democratic West Virginia. They also won control from Democrats in Ohio and New Mexico.

In Oregon, Robert D. Holmes became the first Democrat to win the governorship since 1935 by defeating incumbent Gov. Elmo E. Smith. The Democratic gubernatorial victories in Kansas and Iowa were the first in two decades.

Republican Gov. William G. Stratton of Illinois won an uphill battle for reelection with an outpouring of downstate votes that offset the lead piled up by Democrat Richard B. Austin in Cook county (Chicago). Stratton was on the defensive because of a GOP embezzlement scandal.

Two Democratic governors who are leaders of the liberal wing of their party won reelection. Gov. Orville L. Freeman won a second term in Minnesota.

Democrats also won in Arizona, Arkansas, Florida, Missouri, Colorado, Texas, and North Carolina. Republicans also won in Delaware, Indiana, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah, Vermont and Wisconsin.

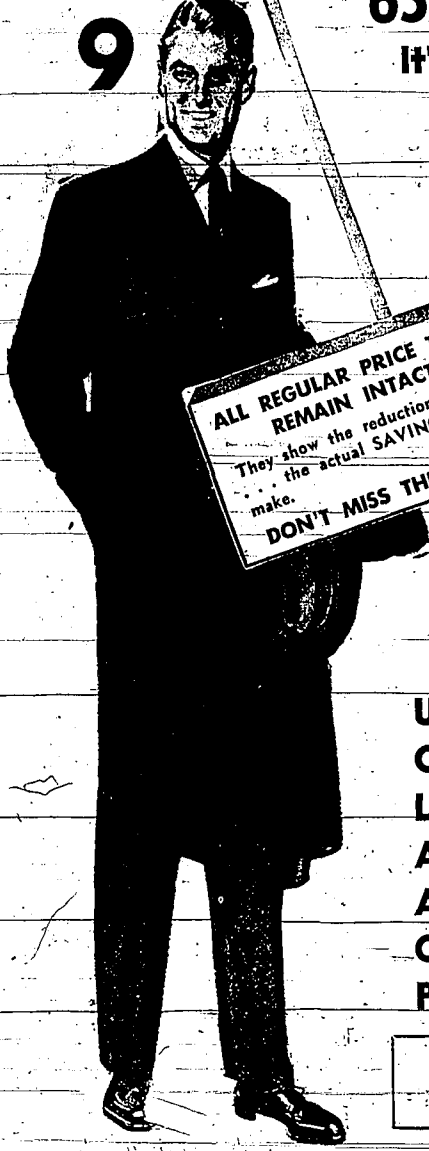

Labors Begin To Clean Out Blocked Suez

LONDON, Nov. 8 (AP)—Shipping experts said today it will take at least three months to clear the Suez canal of sunken ships and other obstacles that threaten the vital waterway to the east.

At least nine ships are known to be stuck in the narrow channel of the canal linking the Mediterranean and Red seas. The Ferdinand bridge near Ismailia also is wrecked.

According to latest reports, four British ships have been sunk at Port Said on the northern end, two near Suez at the midway point, and another at Port Suez, the southern end.

Difficulties are expected to be met in the salvage operations. They said "blitz" tactics must be ruled out because of the narrowness of the canal.

Work started yesterday said salvage experts. The admiralty said men were flown into the Port Said area to help in the canal clearing. The admiralty is preparing a schedule for the months ahead.

Thurston Morton, another Kentucky Republican, also may win a senate seat. His slight race with Democratic Sen. Eric Clements was undecided.

Pork to Have Special Tags In Meat Mart

Pork is the popular with the price-conscious housewife again this week.

Food stores across the country have cut pork prices, sometimes as much as 10 to 20 cents, to reflect the recent drop in the wholesale market. Here and there prices are a little higher, but these are mostly in stores that traded out with bargain sales last week for their week-end specials.

Pork is usually generally cheaper and in many places beef is down. Shoppers can look forward to further savings of local prices, since wholesale butcher prices for this meat showed another moderate decline.

Wholesale prices for pork moved up narrowly this week but are still around their lowest levels in many months. This is the season when a heavy run of hogs comes to market and housewives can expect lower prices.

Apples of many cooking and eating varieties brighten throughout the country but the good supply has brought little change in price. California grapes still look like the best buy on fruit stands.

Among vegetables, late fall crops still dominate the list of outstanding buys. These include cabbage, cauliflower and beans which generally retail light frosts and are still available in many areas from local growers.

Other plentiful and low priced vegetables are onion, radishes, spinach and parsnips. Potatoes are a little higher now, but are still cheap at a very good buy.

Beans, as a rule, are in the category of good potatoes are in the category of sweet beans. Lettuce has become a little cheaper but is still on the high side.

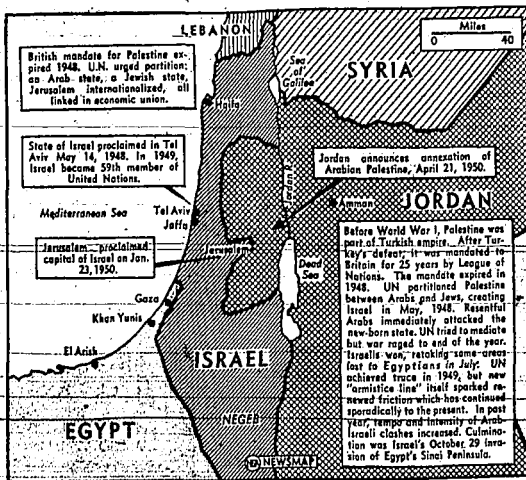

Fluoridation proposals lost in seven of 17 places where they were on the ballot.

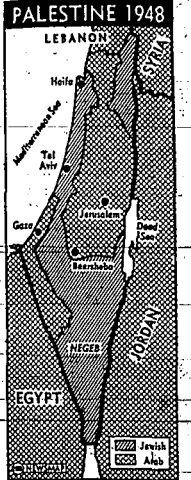

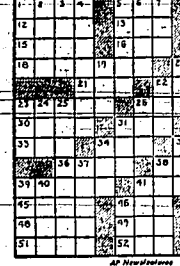
