U. S. Urged Never to Neglect Obligations to Its War Dead

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (AP)—Air force reserve Col. James Stewart said yesterday that the United States "will never neglect its sacred obligations to honor" those who died in battle.

Stewart, better known as a movie actor, was the main speaker in the Veterans day observance at the National Shrine in Washington, D. C., which he dedicated at President Eisenhower's personal request.

Stewart, who was a bomber pilot during World War II and holds the distinguished flying award, said the nation's veterans are aware that "peace today must be maintained through strength."

Veterans Administrator Harvey V. Hixley placed the presidential wreath on the tomb in the solemn ceremony marking Veterans day.

A crowd of more than 2,000 persons, including many widows, mothers and other relatives of soldiers buried at Arlington National cemetery, stood with heads bowed as a navy bugler played the traditional "Taps."

President and Mrs. Eisenhower observed the occasion with special prayers for servicemen at National Presbyterian church.

Veterans day observances were held under clear skies throughout most of the nation. A number of cities have scheduled special services today as well as a holiday for banks, schools and federal offices.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (AP)—The geological survey has reported that Idaho water storage was above average for October.

Discharge of most streams continued above median. Snow is beginning to accumulate far in excess of average in many high-altitude areas.

The better than average storage in many reservoirs, which reported a substantial carryover supplies for irrigation for next year and good runoff supplies for power production during the coming winter, the report said.

Soviet Propaganda and U.N. Slugged Hard by Red Retaliations in Hungary

VIENNA, Nov. 12 (AP)—The Hungarian revolution, though it was crushed by overwhelming Russian military power, has set Soviet propaganda back 10 years. But the United Nations has sustained a severe blow.

For the Russians, the revolution meant a severe and perhaps irreparable setback to a campaign keyed to a new look. All the Mandates of the last two years of Soviet foreign policy have been blown up in the smoke and fire of the Hungarian rebellion. This was noted sharply by the Soviet imperialist for the whole world to witness—a demonstration of the worth of Soviet promises of the world.

Where did the United Nations stand now? The Soviet Union was attempting to use it as a forum for propaganda when that aimed Moscow purposes, and was utterly ignoring the U.N. when the protest from New York were inconvenient.

The Soviet Union threatened to use the U.N. as an excuse to intervene in Middle East events. But although Soviet troops were pouring into Hungary to suppress a popular "house cleaning" Communist and Russian tyranny, this was entirely an "internal affair" of Hungary and no business of the United Nations.

Western Germany, for example, the situation that the Soviet Union could be trusted in negotiations in place. It, too, who ignored the principle to give-and-take were important to the aggressive. Its rebounding failures were the herald of the United Nations.

The Hungarians opened some eyes in Asia to the realities of Communism. It is a big defeat for the Kremlin to have the voice of India's Prime Minister Nehru joined in condemnation of Soviet colonialism.

This Soviet colonialism now stands out in all its nakedness for the Asians to admire. In spite of the pretensions of Soviet love for weak nations, exhibited by Bulganin and Khrushchev in the days of triumph, diplomatic tourism, the Hungarian revolt and what happened in it will ring as a salutary lesson. It will be a long time before the Kremlin mends this break in its propaganda front.

Study of Skeleton May Give New South Seas Information

NEW YORK, Nov. 12 (AP)—Determination of the age of a woman's skeleton which was found on a throne of female skulls and a giant white bone is expected to lead to new information about an ancient South Seas civilization.

The skeleton is believed to be that of a queen or high priestess, the leader of the first archeological expedition to the Marquesas Islands said today.

It was discovered last summer when an American Museum of Natural History group opened a burial mound on Nukuniva, chief of the 11 volcanic islands making up the Marquesas group about halfway between Australia and South America.

Dr. Harry L. Shapiro, chairman of the museum's department of anthropology and head of the archeological task force, explained that dates of an early culture in the Marquesas would help enlighten students of the South Seas on early societies in the South Pacific.

Working in the setting for Herman Melville's novel, "Typee," and many of Paul Gauguin's paintings, Shapiro said his group obtained carbon samples from caves. The samples are presently undergoing radiocarbon tests which will set their age and the age of the burial mound that contained the skeleton.

Further study of the material found in the grave, plus information from the tests of carbon, he said, "should tell us a good deal."

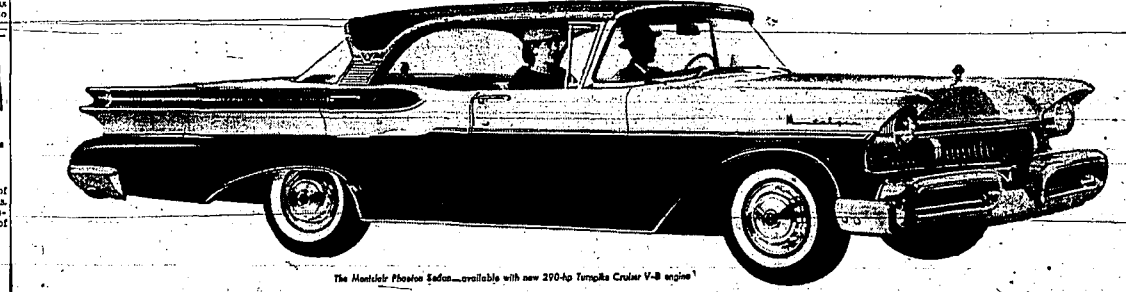

Employment Increases in West's Areas

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 12 (AP)—Wage and salary employment, excluding agricultural and domestic workers, reached an all-time high of 1,686,100 in mid-September in the eight mountain states, the U. S. department of labor reported today.

Max D. Kossoris, western regional director of the department's bureau of labor statistics, said employment was 10,000 higher than in August and 42,000 above the September, 1955, level for Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming.

Gains in government and manufacturing more than offset losses in construction, trade and service, Kossoris said.

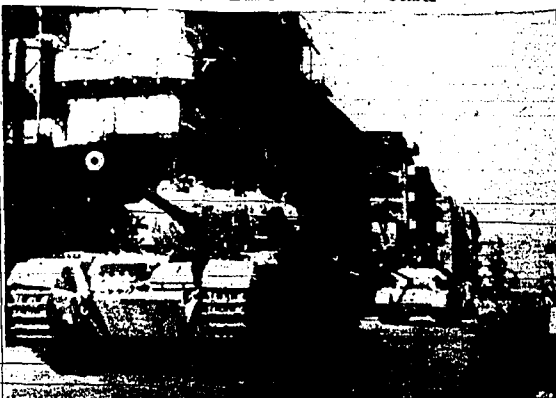
Average weekly hours of manufacturing production workers increased in Arizona, Montana, New Mexico and Utah but declined in the other four states. Weekly hours of 37.8 in Nevada and 39.8 in Wyoming were below the national average of 40.5. The other six states were above average.

Average weekly earnings topped the national average of \$91 in all eight states. Earnings averaged \$83 in Utah, \$83.44 in Colorado, \$85.08 in New Mexico, \$85.88 in Idaho, \$87.81 in Wyoming, \$82.85 in Arizona, \$94.12 in Nevada and \$94.97 in Montana.

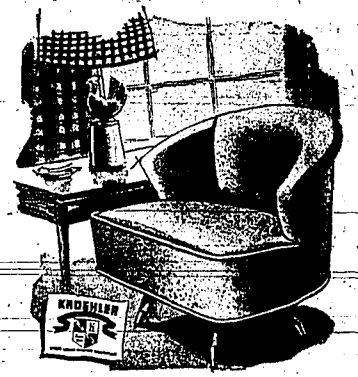

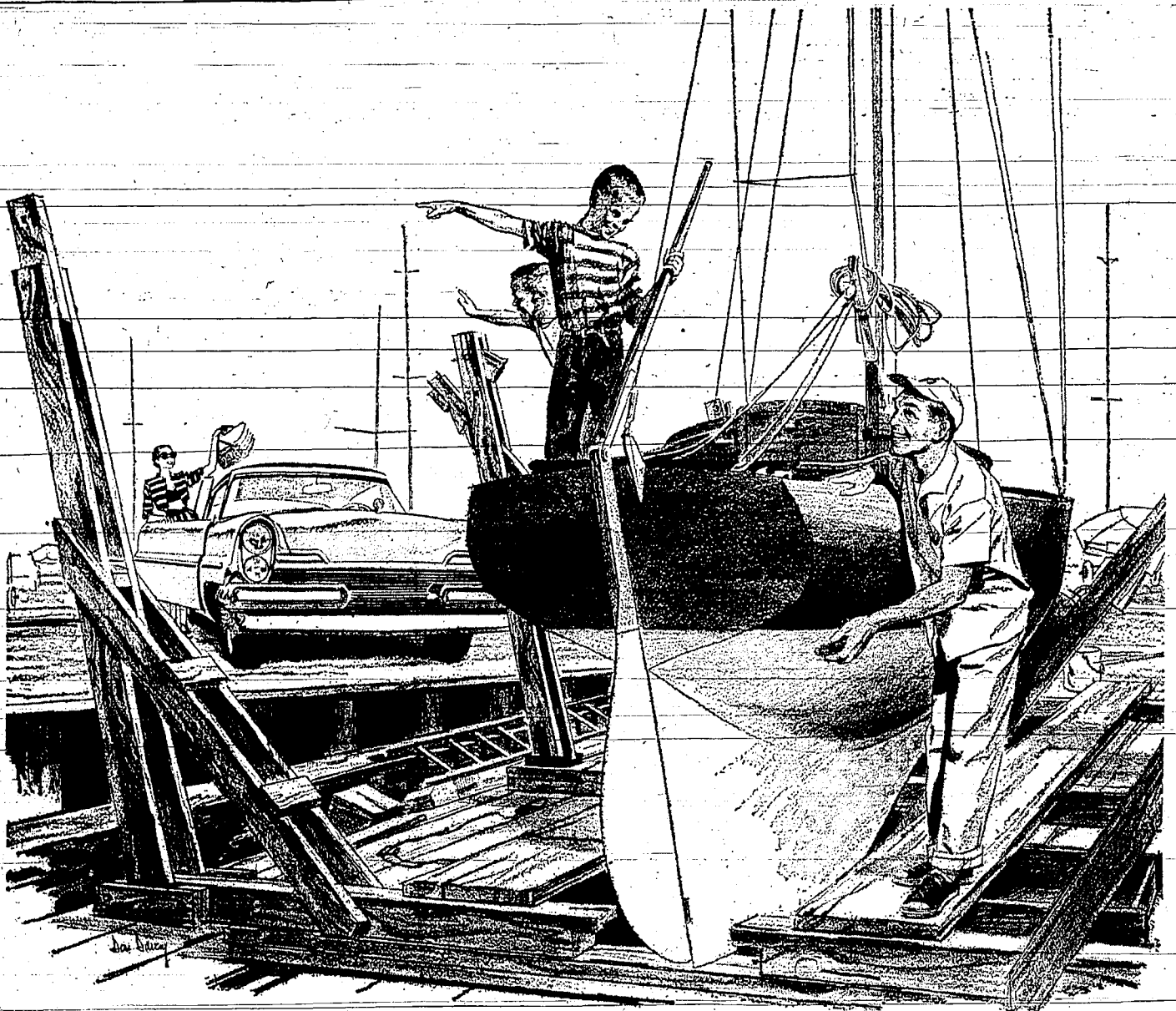

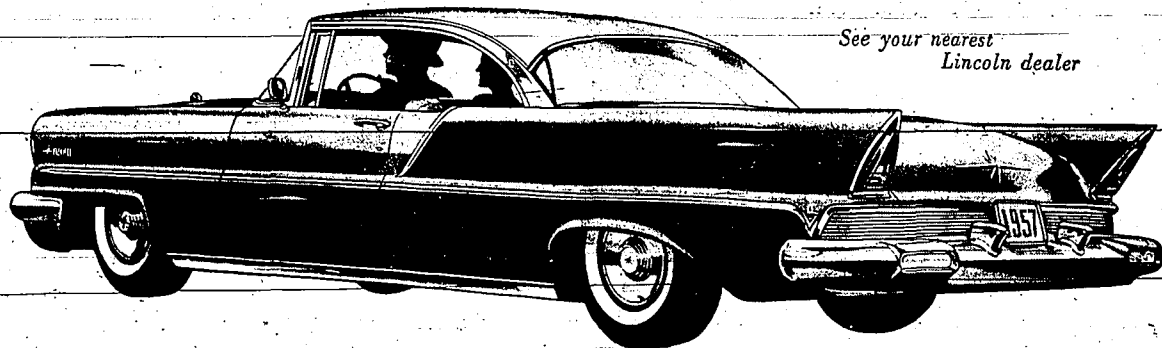

Many Leave Communist Party Group

LONDON, Nov. 12 (AP)—Disgust with Russian violence in Hungary and Communist desertion from the east coast of the Iron Curtain.

In Paris, philosopher Jean Paul Sartre quit the ranks in protest. Workers in Vienna ripped up their party cards and threw them in the face of Communist officials.

In England, the Oxford University Communist club disbanded.

A survey showed that Soviet military intervention in the Hungarian revolt has convinced western communists with one of their worst internal crises since Stalin died in Moscow in the short-lived Molotov-Vostok pact of 1939.

Here are some of the developments:

Paris—Leftwing Socialist Pierre Nenni, now writing off a long alliance with the Communist Party, announced Russian withdrawal from Hungary, the provincial organization in Hungary assumed a resolution which deplored the Red Hungarian government's "need" for calling in Soviet troops.

Berlin—The Communist Party of North Germany called on Russia to withdraw troops from all countries outside the USSR. The Daily Worker in London, while still supporting Russian intervention, urged the party to publicly let leaving protests, and let its cartoonists who walked out in protest against the party's action at Oxford, the usually noisy Communist club voted to end its existence.

Some 4,800 party members in one district alone reportedly quit the party. The only communist city councillor in Graz said he would take no further part in city business. A meeting of the Austrian Communist committee broke up in disagreement over how to answer the Hungarian action.

New West German Army Made Palatable; Ghosts of Prussians May Be Writhing

MEUNSTERLAGER, Germany (NEA)—The likes of von Hindenburg and Gen. von Manstein must be doing a ghostly goose step in protest over what's going on in the new German army.

A young captain tells a group of trainees at this armored center: "You are only required to salute an officer once a day, the first time you see him."

The 10-minute resume of the rules of military courtesy and says, "now the committee meetings."

The trainees break up into groups around tables. They discuss the possibility that the captain is full of wiles and scheming and whether they should bother to salute at all.

The captain latens but doesn't bat an eye.

At all another German army post a group of quartermaster officers discuss how many ice cream machines and how shower bath units must be provided, each division.

They are easily satisfied.

The trainee discussion and the U. S. army type of logistic planning are merely the cream of the new infant German army contrast to the harshly disciplined war machine of the Wehrmacht.

Undoubtedly, one reason for it is an attempt to make the new army more palatable to all soldiers.

Date for the new army is the most "unanimous opinion" German soldiers have.

"Arms have won us nothing but misery," says the German-in-the-street.

The concept of a purely defensive army is meaningless to him. He's sick of arms, period.

But there's more to it than meets the eye. A German general says frankly: "During the last war our soldiers didn't know how to make quick decisions in the field and many of our officers were not up to the task."

The committee idea is just one attempt to correct that. It's used on all levels.

And the fact is: The "lighter" inevitably requires lighter regulations. In drill, too, young soldiers reveal the deep German army tradition of spit and polish, army and instant obedience to a barked command. You just don't find the same "feel" for discipline among American troops.

On the aircraft, attempts to build a new army seem pitiful. Training facilities are inadequate. Only 60,000 volunteers are in uniform. The goal of 80,000 men by the end of the year, 12 combat-ready divisions in three years, and an eventual total of 200,000 men seem impossible.

Even a one-year draft is violently resisted.

But again there's more than meets the eye.

Most of the volunteers plan an army career. Only 400 out of the 60,000 volunteers have exercised the choice of getting out. AWO is nonexistent here.

The officer corps is excellent. The cream of the officers of the former army have given up better paying jobs to come back.

Typical of the top officers is Gen. Oscar Munzel. He is a brilliant tank tactician, commanded two divisions against the Russians in World War II and was charged with all armored training. He has the same job today.

His staff is busy writing new tactical tank doctrine for atomic warfare.

General Munzel is aware of public antagonism. But his eager talk of the future reveals not the slightest doubt that there will be another strong, efficient and effective German army.

The same spirit can be found in just about all of the branches of the new German army.

U.S. First Lady Will Celebrate 60th Birthday on Wednesday

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (AP)—Mrs. Mamie Eisenhower observes her 60th birthday anniversary Wednesday in much happier circumstances than last year and ready to start another four years as the nation's "First Lady."

The White House has not yet announced any special plans for the day, but there is sure to be some celebration.

Last year, the formal party for Mrs. Eisenhower's birthday was frequently four months because of the President's illness.

Eisenhower, stricken with a heart attack in Denver on Sept. 24, unable to fly back to Gettysburg, Pa., on Nov. 12 and Mamie's birthday. Mrs. Eisenhower was quietly at her farm home.

Four months later, on March 22, Mrs. Eisenhower had her official birthday party, including a nationally televised program of her favorite tunes entitled "To Mamie With Music."

This birthday, the diamond jubilee, 60th—linda, Mrs. Eisenhower, also observing her 40th year of marriage, with four grandchildren.

Since she married Dwight David Eisenhower at the age of 19, Mamie has come up the ladder as an army wife, moving her home some 25 times.

In the four years she has been mistress of the White House, Washington has gained some impressions of Mrs. Eisenhower, who was born in Boone, Ia., in 1895.

She has had few meetings with the press, and much of what is known of her comes indirectly from friends, her secretary, other associates and from observations at public functions.

Entertainment at the White House picks up soon after Mamie's tenure, and she is credited with injecting a certain informality, appreciated by her own "friendly, enthusiastic, bubbling" personality.

American Pilots Leave Hot Zone

ROME, Nov. 12 (AP)—The United States has the latest batch of American pilots on the Suez canal area, here last night, aboard the British destroyer Diamond.

They said three American pilots left Egypt earlier, and the other eight apparently intended to remain in Egypt "just to see what happens."

The five who chose to leave were among 28 American, Greek, Dutch and Panamanian citizens evacuated from Port Said aboard the British destroyer.

Allies Alarmed by Increase in Code

NICOSIA, Cyprus, Nov. 12 (AP)—Allied headquarters here were worried concerned today over a sharp increase in Russian coded wireless messages to the Middle East.

The signals picked up by British monitors consist of a 25-word-per-minute four-letter code which informed sources said was definitely Russian.

The sources said the output had been stepped up considerably during the last 48 hours.

Plaque Given

West German Workers Reach Stage of Home-Luxuries Now

HANOVER, Germany—(NEA)—West German workers are enjoying the luxuries of their country's phenomenal prosperity. The general booming recovery of West Germany and the comfortable way-of-life of the "average worker" are important factors contributing to the current "Yuletide" in the satellite countries. Word of what is going on in West Germany has helped inflame workers in the adjoining Russian satellite countries, whose lives are so deplorable by comparison.

Plans Near for U. S. Fighters' Shrine Honor

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 (AP)—The defense department today announced tentative plans for establishing a "known soldier" shrine on each front World War II and the Korean war in Arlington national cemetery.

The shrine will be a memorial to the unidentified dead of the two wars and the Unknown Soldier of World War I on Memorial Day, May 30, 1956.

The plans, prepared by the army quartermaster general, are now being circulated for approval among the armed forces and other government agencies. They have been modified to eliminate controversial features of past proposals.

Instead of building new tombs for known servicemen of the last two wars, the tombs of the World War I Unknown Soldier would be left standing alone on a bluff overlooking the nation's capital.

Two crypts would be added in the plaza west of the tomb — one for the World War I Unknown and one for the Unknown of the Korean conflict. Each would be covered with a granite cap matching the Unknown in the World War I crypt.

The famed inscription of the tomb of the original unknown soldier "here rests an honored glory of an American soldier known but to God" would be left unchanged and applied to all three buried unknown dead.

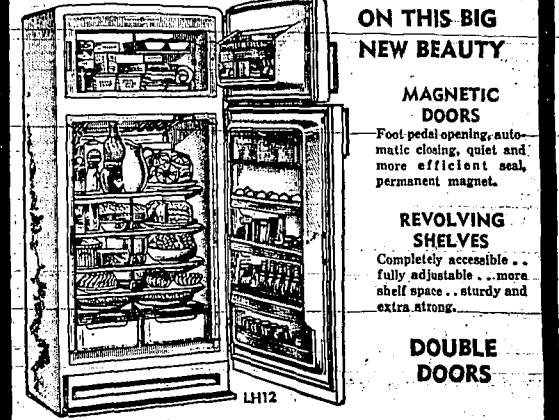

New Cadillac Is Scheduled For Showing

A modified change in the line styling of the 1957 Cadillac will be introduced this year but in appearance it is unmistakably Cadillac. It goes on display at Magis Valley Center this week.

The overall silhouette has been lowered three inches and the hood and rear deck are lower than the fender profile. The traditional Cadillac taillight is restyled and two new headlamps have been added to the line.

A new feature is the use of rubber tires on the bumper guards. Matching for and parking lights are located in the outer ends of the bottom bumper section.

Behind this front is a 300-horsepower engine, the most powerful ever offered by Cadillac in a standard equipment. This V-type overhead valve engine has a 10 to 1 compression ratio, leading to a 300-horsepower rating.

Air-conditioning is available on the forward edge of the instrument panel. The new air conditioning system itself is front mounted for the first time.

All models will have new front seats with a greater range of adjustments. The top-edge-of-the-backs will have a soft rubber lining, providing in-closed safety for rear seat passengers.

New fabrics, trims, leathers and floor coverings along with new interior finishes.

The front of the car is all new, although the cellular grille, efficient gull wing bumpers and bumper guards are similar to recent Cadillac styling.

The bumper and bumper guards are lighter in appearance and are situated so that the tie bar supports the hood from the undercarriage grille.

"The President has read your letter and asked me to thank you. You were very kind to write and tell him about the election held in your room. He is happy to learn that a majority of the children voted for him. He is also glad to know that you want him to win..."

50th Christmas Seal Sale to Be Started in T. F. Thursday

The 50th annual Christmas seal sale is scheduled to start Thursday in Twin Falls county and other counties in Idaho. The seals will be distributed to more than 125,000 families in Idaho by the various county tuberculosis associations.

The focus is on the future. There is no time for looking backward to past successes in the fight against tuberculosis, says Mrs. John E. Hahn, Twin Falls county seal chairman for the 1956 campaign.

The seals this year, as last year, were designed by Colorado Artist Field Brandt. They show a boy and girl dressed in green, each carrying the red double-barred cross, the trademark of the National Tuberculosis association and its affiliates.

"The children march across the seals toward the future—a future in which they must be safe from the ravages of tuberculosis," says Mrs. Hahn.

The annual independent sale of Christmas seals is the only source of funds for the state county tuberculosis association. Of the total amount raised by the county associations, 40 to 50 per cent remains in the county for local tuberculosis programs. Six per cent goes to the national association for research and support of the tuberculosis program at the national level. The remainder is used to finance activities of the
