# Anglo-French May Reject Nasser's Terms; Posing Forces Delayed in Naples

LONDON, Nov. 13 (AP)—Britain and France hinted today they would reject Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser's terms for establishing a United Nations police force in Egypt. New news, both diplomatic and mechanical, crossed the U. N. peace corridors in the Middle East yesterday. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld is reported to fly to Rome, Naples, and Cairo on his most delicate mission. The secretary planned to leave his U. N. headquarters at 5 p. m. EST. to meet U. N. police force commander Maj. Gen. M. B. Barin in Rome. Units of the U. N. police army trickled slowly into the Naples area today. One group of 212 Danish soldiers was being airlifted from Copenhagen today and about 35 Czechs were en route by air. In Naples already were 185 Danes, Norwegians and Colombians. The first units had been expected to fly to Cairo today. Later it was announced there would be a delay and that they "may" fly to Naples tomorrow. The delay was said to be the result of a last-minute decision to take the troops to an airport in the Sudan called "probably near Yamalla" instead of to Cairo.
