**Hungary's Rebel Workers Demand Nagy's Return by Soviet Puppet Government**

**Baptist Church Leader Advises New U.N. Demand Voted on Recalling Force From Egypt**

**UDAPEST, Nov. 24 (AP)—**The general workers' council of greater Budapest demanded today night that kidnapped former Premier Imre Nagy be brought back and installed as the Hungarian government. This coincided with a demand by Yugoslavians the Hungarian government to return to his home in Budapest to return to his home in Budapest to take up refuge in Yugoslavia. President Tito's government said it did not believe Nagy went to Romania on his own free will, as the Hungarian government declared.

The council requested a three-member delegation be permitted to visit Nagy personally "wherever he is." Council members scoffed at the government version of Nagy's "voluntary" departure for Romania, saying they didn't believe a word of it.

The five-member committee investigated Nagy's disappearance and reported the version published by the Yugoslav press apparently was correct.

A member of the council said the workers are clinging to all their demands on the Kadar government including the reinstatement of Nagy and the withdrawal of Russian troops from Budapest.

"We want to know where Nagy is and when we find him, we want him to return as prime minister," the council member said.

The council advised workers not to launch another strike because they have not lost faith in Nagy. Leaders of the council said Hungary lacks about 27 million dollars in hard currency to buy a complete standstill and "ultimately the workers have to pay for it."

"We have proved to the world where we stand with the unprecedented general strike of the entire country," he said.

**UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Nov. 24 (AP)—**The U.N. assembly overwhelmingly called on Britain, France and Israel again Saturday to withdraw from Egypt and gave Gagarin Hammarik-Jeld wide powers to deploy the Middle East police force. The assembly renewed its demand despite an Israeli announcement she already has withdrawn two brigades, though 6,000 men, from Egypt and a British announcement moving up by 48 hours the departure of the first British battalion to be withdrawn from Port Said.

The assembly voted 14-3 in favor of a resolution by 20 Asian-African countries calling once more for the withdrawal of the forces and not voting with regret previous assembly demands were not obeyed. The United States voted for this resolution.

Then the assembly voted 53-0 in favor of a resolution by Canada, Colombia, India, Norway, Yugoslavia and United States authorizing the secretary general to act ahead with the United Nations force to maintain the police force in Egypt and Sinai. The Soviet bloc of nine countries abstained on this resolution.

The voting brought out sharply the continued split between United States and western powers and Britain and France—and wound up three days of scrupulous maneuvering on this resolution.

The United States, after wavering initially toward an abstention, came out firmly Saturday in favor of the Asian-African resolution. This led to the withdrawal of British and French delegates against the United States.

Britain, France, Australia, New Zealand and Israel were the five countries voting against the Asian-African resolution.

### Plea for Help

#### Is Backed by 'Grim' March

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—About 250 Hungarians and Slovaks-American marched Saturday in an anti-communist "funeral procession" in front of the White House to demand that their plea for aid to Russian-occupied Hungary.

Near the head of the procession was a huge black cross draped with chains, hangman's nooses and whips. "Today we 'buries you'."

Stop at Gate  
The orderly marchers stopped at a white House gate while the Rev. J. Lee Koyne, pastor of the First Baptist Reformed church, New York, gave a sermon for President Eisenhower.

The letter said, in part, "We beg you to act. Do not let Hungary be hurried into a seared, bloody torments chamber."  
The Rev. Mr. Koyne said the group, some of whom came in chartered buses, was made up of delegates from New York, Philadelphia, Washington and communities in New Jersey and Delaware. The demonstration was sponsored by the American-Hungarian federation. In front of the procession a tattered and stained flag was carried by a young man in period uniform. One of the leaders of the group, Dr. Leslie Agh, said the flag, the Hungarian red and white, was carried in the revolution and that its bearer, Miklos Laszlo, 21, had died in the fighting. Laszlo recently gave the senate internal security subcommittee an account of the rebellion.

### Epidemic Reports

#### Are Found False

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (AP)—The American Red Cross today received a report that communist claims of a polio epidemic in war-torn Budapest are "unfounded."  
The communist-controlled Budapest radio said Wednesday that polio and measles epidemics were sweeping the ravaged Hungarian capital.  
The American National Red Cross cabled International Red Cross officials in Vienna to check the reports, so they could determine whether to try to send Salk polio vaccine and gamma globulin to Budapest.  
A spokesman said today a Dr. Philipson of the Swedish Red Cross cabled from Budapest that the epidemic reports were "unfounded" and that "health conditions are as good as could be expected under the circumstances."

### T. F. Convict Plans Appeal In High Court

### Filer Man Not Only Invents Machines But Builds Others to Make Inventions

PILER, Nov. 24—Wilfred (Bill) Herrett, inventor-owner of Acme Machine works, not only invents but perfects machines to manufacture his inventions.

Starting here in 1946 in a small frame building, Herrett now is looked to as agricultural machine processor for new ideas and inventions.

Herrett "comes" from a family of inventors and manufacturers. His brothers are Norman Herrett, Twin Falls, who is a manufacturing engineer, and specialist in building telescopes, and Elmer Herrett, Twin Falls, who operates a world-known gunnery factory.

Herrett has added to the family contributions by perfecting a link chain conveyor and a corrugator, which molds rather than dies the corrugate.

The big item at the moment is the link chain conveyor, used for potato and beet diggers, combines, cowboys, sorters and washers.

The belts of spring steel are formed by linking dozens of rods. The curvature of bends enable the belts to turn smoothly and efficiently and last longer than belts made of other material.

To make them, Herrett invented a multi-purpose unit, which heats the rod to 2,000 degrees, bends it

to the desired shape, oil tempers it and then draws the rods. He notes the rods are too brittle after being bent and must be drawn to 400 degrees and allowed to cool in the air before the belts are able to give maximum service.

The machine is capable of bending rods from six inches in length to 30 inches.

"Set-up and heating and bending units occupy a small area in the corner of the building. The standard machines designed for the same purpose would require an area six times as large. When he had completed his unit, Herrett called in engineers to inspect the machine.

"They told me the theory was all wrong," he smiles, "but the results were excellent."

Last year orders for approximately 200,000 links were received and filled, marking the third consecutive year the volume had doubled.

Prospects for next year indicate a similar demand, but Herrett is restrained from accepting orders because of the steel shortage.

The molding corrugator was perfected after five years' work and has been on the market for four years. It seemed to be better accepted by irrigating areas outside Magic Valley, but in the last two or three years has been picking up popularity here.

The corrugator actually molds the earth along the corrugate, allowing more even water flow throughout the field and reducing erosion.

With these two items filling most of the Filer firm's working day, the prospects Herrett perfects have been turned out to an Idaho Falls firm. But all the machine work on these is done locally.

Herrett says he started the business as a hobby. "I thought I got

### Russian Editor Says Shriek Whistles Of Doorman Calling Taxis Annoy Him

MOSCOW, Nov. 24 (AP)—Vladimir Kudryavtsev reported Saturday he was most annoyed in the United States by the shrill whistles doormen use to call taxis.

Kudryavtsev is one of three Russians who observed the American presidential election as guests of the state department. An editor of Izvestia, he wrote in that government newspaper of his experiences.

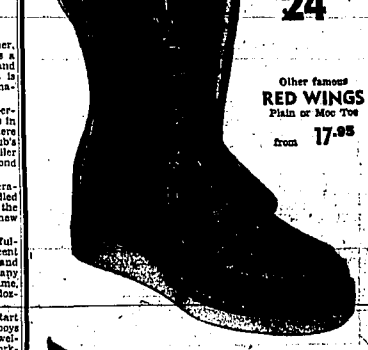



# Life in MAGIC VALLEY

Over the years, recruiting men for the armed services has developed into an art. Instead of flag waving and harassment on "spots" or corners, recruiting now serves counselors to their prospects. KNOX ARTHUR JONES, a recruiter at TWIN FALLS, typifies this new type of recruiter. While the public still may think a recruiter has an "easy life," Jones says the armed services "nation" put in long days.

At 5 p.m., when most workers are going home, the recruiter often faces a long evening of public speaking or meeting with parents of prospects to which their son wishes to join.

This situation occurs here in the Magic Valley. Jones, 32, reached 18 years of age in 1938, and he says he was one of the first to get into the service. Jones reports that the advantages of joining the navy, he said, is that a night's work is carried out for the convenience of the parents, so both may be present to discuss the military career.

The student-leaders\* as they are called, are the city of armed forces recruiters as they vie with each other for enlistees. He continued.

The star athlete and student leader of the boys that will help bring recruits to his crew, he said.

Many youths turn to the recruiter and the armed forces when in action or scholastic trouble. In most cases, Jones says, they are restrained from signing up until the situation has improved and, in all cases of school problems, the boys are advised to complete their high school training.

After coming into contact with the recruiter the boys often turn to his advice on matters other than military. Jones reports that youths have visited his home after hours to discuss their problems.

Navy personnel who are selected for recruiting work are given an extensive training course on public speaking, operating movie projects and public relations.

With this training they are able to talk on the advantages of army life and are able to cope with unusual situations that may arise.

Many recruiters, along with representatives of the other service branches, tour all the Magic Valley high schools each year showing films and speaking. In addition, they speak upon request to civic organizations, in men groups and the Boy Scouts.

Before a young man can be accepted, he must have a perfect civilian record. In cases where the boy has clashed with the law, the recruiter must see to it that either the charges have been dropped or the boy has completed any detention periods imposed. In addition, each navy enlistee must give three character references, which are thoroughly checked out, Jones explained.

The youth then is given a test covering many topics, from mechanics to grammar. Following this he is sent to Salt Lake City where he undergoes a thorough physical examination and another written test. If all these are passed, he is enlisted at Salt Lake City. Only the preliminary and leg work is done by the local subdivisions.

The recruiters then strive to follow their "products" through the enlistment period. They encourage servicemen to "drop in" at the recruiting station during furloughs. In most cases the local boy finds a good friend in his recruiter.

The company pays him a nominal salary, plus room and board, while he is training, and the state organization pays for his lessons. Once he signed on the Merwesteyn, Jopp became the responsibility of the skipper, Capt. Theodore Starrenburg.
