# U. S. Police Army Patrols Port Said; Harbor is Cleared

LONDON, Nov. 26 (AP)—Norwegian forces of the United Nations police army took up patrol duty in Port Said today in the first actual move to take over from British and French occupation troops and hasten their withdrawal from Egypt. The Anglo-French command announced today it had cleared a sunken dredger from the harbor mouth leading into the Suez canal, permitting the arrival of U. N. emergency forces, the first of whom to arrive by sea will be 700 troops from Communist Yugoslavia. They will pass through Port Said to meet unaffiliated deserters.

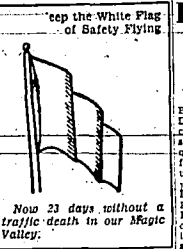

# 8 American Jet Bombers Demonstrate Striking Power, Russian Vulnerability

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25 (AP)—Eight B-52 jet bombers have demonstrated their striking power in a non-stop flight of 15,000 miles from bases in this country and returned to their bases after a week-end, keeping an average of 20 hours in the air. The flight, covering from 12,500 to 18,000 miles, was made by the planes that set an ever new record for the H-bomb if it ever has to be used.

The force called the flights a "routine training mission." But it went out of its way to make sure that it was usually kept secret. The demonstration obviously was a warning to Russia of the inter-continental striking power of the continent's most powerful bomber.

The flight, covering from 12,500 to 18,000 miles, was made by the planes that set an ever new record for the H-bomb if it ever has to be used.

The force called the flights a "routine training mission." But it went out of its way to make sure that it was usually kept secret. The demonstration obviously was a warning to Russia of the inter-continental striking power of the continent's most powerful bomber.

The flight, covering from 12,500 to 18,000 miles, was made by the planes that set an ever new record for the H-bomb if it ever has to be used.

# People of Louisville Not Surprised By Peaceful Integration in Schools

By BEN PRICE

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Nov. 26 (AP)—It seems surprising that the peaceful integration of the public schools here this fall except Louisville.

"As far as we were concerned," says Norman Laska, managing editor of the Louisville Times, "we were adding to the school reports."

Louisville and surrounding Jefferson county went about integrating white and Negro schools against a background of racial violence over the race issue in Clay and Sturgis, Ky., Clinton, Tenn., and Mansfield and Paducah, Tex.

But long ago two strong newspapers, some extraordinary mayors and a rare set of officials, while Negro had foreseen the current racial crisis and had acted to anticipate it.

"It is not to say that the process of integration lies complete here. There still is segregation in theaters, hotels and restaurants, though the barriers are breaking in the last two.

There are two striking facets to the Louisville story:

1. Moves to improve the Negroes' lot were led on the white side almost exclusively by people who call themselves Southerners and who are descendants of Confederates.
2. The Negro apparently has never felt any need to agitate, and thus there has been no hardening of racial prejudices in the community.

Although it would be difficult to document, there is reason to believe, too, that the careful development of a rich cultural life in the area of art, music and literature, easily available to all, has created an aura of tolerance in Louisville.

"Whether it has or not," says Clarence (Dick) Graham, head of the city's library system, "I would like to think so."

Until the mid-1930s Louisville was a placid town, proud of its blooded

horses, beautiful women and bouillon whiskeys.

It was a town in which about 20 percent of the population was Negro.

It was a place where people could erect a statue to Abraham Lincoln and honor both.

Generally, though, only race relations Louisville faced south.

Then two things happened—The Ohio river flooded and Mark Twain's novel came to town.

In the wake of the disastrous 1937 flood Louisville seemed to take on a new and more aggressive look. The necessity for cooperation in rebuilding the stricken city bred a strong sense of civic duty which still flourishes.

## More Refugees Leave Hungary

VIENNA, Nov. 26 (AP)—More than 2,000 Hungarians have crossed into Austria since the anti-communist uprising and the exodus is continuing despite tightened communist border controls and the area of death or arrest, Austrian officials said today.

New waves of refugees were reported from border control points during the night, according to officials of the provincial government of Burgenland. No total figure was given but the number who break through the barbed wire and Soviet border patrols to gain freedom in the West.

The Soviet-puppet Jonas Kadar regime warned that anyone caught trying to escape from Hungary would be imprisoned. A radio Budapest broadcast reported more than 200 "would-be escapees were arrested and detained" Sunday morning at Erd, north of Budapest.

## Seventh Plane of Refugees Lands

CAMP KILMER, N. J., Nov. 26 (AP)—The seventh plane bearing refugees from the conquered Hungarian rebellion to America landed at nearby McGuire air force base Saturday night.

The 73 men, women and children fleeing communist rule in their homeland, bundled against the cold and were driven off to nearby Camp Kilmer and bed.

This group swelled the number of refugees who have come to camp since the first plane landed to 429.

Other Hungarians have been flown to Milwaukee.

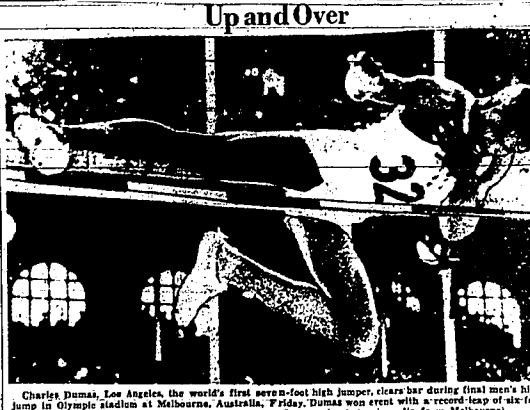

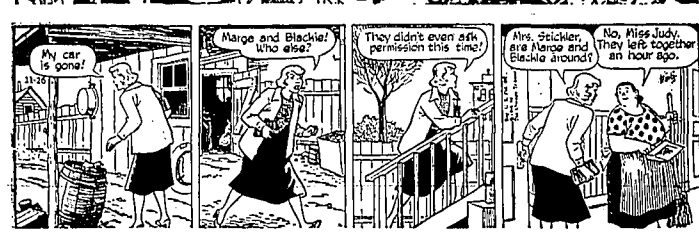

### Auto Markets Report Boom Period Ahead

**DETROIT, Nov. 24**—A retail demand level approaching boom-time levels is reported from the national car market.

To meet the demand many retailers lack sufficient 1957 model cars early to say the hold-outs. In many cases are getting it with little resistance from the car buyers.

**Just Starting**

Indulging the 1957 model year still is less than a full month on its way. For that reason it probably is too early to say the hold-outs. In many cases are getting it with little resistance from the car buyers.

But nowhere in the industry is there any inclination to doubt that the 1957 model year will require upward of \$1 million new model assemblies. Some authoritative industry spokesmen are currently predicting a 1957 model year output of \$1 million units.

**Buyer Reaction Good**

The buyer reaction to the new models is far better in the lower price range because the price brackets was first on the market was greater than even the most optimistic of the producers anticipated. If you ask the manufacturer what precipitated the rush for new model cars the answer invariably is:

"The 1952 model brought a better and has more eye appeal than any the industry ever turned out. Coupled with this is a continuing natural growth of the car market."

"There probably is more to it than that. For varying reasons new model assemblies have been so far below schedule that an actual shortage has resulted in certain models."

### Postmaster Asks Cooperation On Early Christmas Mailings

Pointing out the need for your cooperation on his 1956 "Mail Early" Christmas campaign, Postmaster W. W. Franke says if you will follow three simple rules, all of your mailings will be delivered before Christmas day:

Wrap them securely, and address them correctly, and mail them early.

Amplifying these rules, the postmaster said, "Avoid the risk of mailing poorly wrapped packages. Use sturdy wrapping paper, use plenty of heavy brown wrapping paper, and be sure that every package is tied with string cords."

"Carbons containing several self-addressed return envelopes will not be mailed with the other letters."

He also reminds us that size and weight limitations for parcel post packages vary according to place of mailing and destination, and advise us to secure pamphlet No. 2, "All for Out of Town Delivery."

Then, sort your Christmas cards into separate bundles with each address facing the same way, and attach the correct label to each bundle.

Early mailing of all Christmas gifts and cards is the biggest factor in getting everything delivered before Christmas, according to the postmaster. The whole Christmas mailing period is a battle against time.

Delays now in getting your Christmas cards and gift packages to the post office may cause a slow-down all along the line. Then, there's always the danger that commercial shipments and incoming Christmas mail will conflict with the outgoing operations.

In conclusion the postmaster said that he was glad to see that many people are getting the Christmas gifts and cards for distant points mailed the week, pointing out that all mail some long distances should be sent before Dec. 10 at the very latest.

Christmas packages for local delivery should be mailed by Dec. 15 and all Christmas cards for nearby destinations by at least a week before Christmas.
