Balls, Medals, Parade Slated For Ike's Fete

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30 (AP)—Four inaugural balls to celebrate the second inauguration of President Eisenhower were decided upon yesterday as the salient feature of the Jan. 21 inaugural ceremony to cost around a million dollars.

The 1957 inaugural committee at its first full-dress session also decided on an inaugural parade to be directed with the aid of TV and radio to speed it up, and the striking of an inaugural medal featuring Eisenhower and Vice President Nixon on side by side.

Past inaugural medals have carried only the likeness of the president. The 1957 medal will be a bronze disc some two inches in diameter.

Chairman Robert V. Fleming told a news conference the cost of the ceremonies spread over three days will run between \$200,000 and one million dollars. Four years ago the cost was \$700,000.

Tickets to inaugural events will go up accordingly. Fleming said a ticket to the ball, for example, probably will cost \$15 this year instead of \$12.

The top figure of one million dollars is exclusive of the cost of inaugural dinners and other incidental expenses at capitol hill, where the president will have the oath of office and deliver his inaugural address. Congress will foot the bill for that.

The committee decided the two inaugural balls in 1952 were inadequate and doubled the figure this year to four. They will be held in the National Guard armory and in the Sheralyn Park, Statler and Mayflower hotels.

A \$14,370 check was turned over to the Idaho Elks' Rehabilitation center, Boise, Thursday by the Twin Falls Elks lodge.

This amount represents the local lodge's entire pledge to the Debby Dains hospital building fund which will be used to construct a new facility for handicapped children and adults.

Construction of the building is now under way and the official ground-breaking ceremonies will be held Saturday. Total cost of the construction will be \$335,000 and is being raised by Elks lodges throughout the state. Federal matching funds will be used.

The center which will be completed by September, 1957, and will replace the Collier home and army barracks which has served as the Elks' Convalescent home since 1947.

More than 1,500 handicapped children and adults have been admitted to the center since it first opened. Eighty of these have been from Twin Falls county.

Trees Market Now Booming

HALIFAX, N. S., Nov. 30 (AP)—Canada's multi-million dollar Christmas tree business was in high gear today with wood-cutters working overtime to prepare about 17 million trees for export to the United States.

Most of the crop from the Maritimes and British Columbia will be graded, banded into six-tree lots and sent aboard special trains to markets ranging from the Midwest to Florida.

The maritime provinces provided about two-thirds of the total Canadian production of trees last year, and sent the greatest number of trees to the greatest market where they are sold to dealers from parked railway cars. Some go to New York, Boston and other distribution points.

Federal officials estimated that last year's exports mostly of balsam fir, brought growers and cutters \$8 million dollars. They had no figures for trees sold in Canada at a price ranging anywhere from 50 cents to \$10 or more.

Clergymen Noting With Alarm Increasing of Mixed Marriages

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30.—Protestant and Catholic church leaders are concerned about the increasing frequency with which members of both faiths cross religious lines in choosing their mates.

Interfaith marriages, once comparatively rare in America, are being solemnized in large numbers. The Official Catholic directory, for example, reports that of 334,867 marriages performed last year by Catholic priests, 84,726—or more than one-fourth—involved a non-Catholic partner.

Many other thousands of Catholic Protestant weddings were performed by Protestant ministers or by justices of the peace.

Clergymen who are troubled by these statistics acknowledge that many such "mixed marriages" work out fine. Few, if any, contend that a difference of religion should be regarded as an automatic and insurmountable barrier to marriage for a couple deeply in love.

But there is a growing movement, in both Protestant and Catholic churches, to warn young people before they are married.

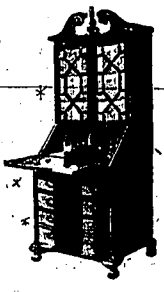

A study made by the YMCA indicates that this tendency to revoke the religious tenets of a mixed marriage by pushing faith into the background also carries over to the children of inter-faith unions. Where both parents were Protestants, 68 per cent of their sons were practicing Protestants.

But where one parent was Protestant and the other Catholic, only 34 per cent of their sons were active members of either faith.

A survey by the Catholic bishops' committee on mixed marriages found that about 30 per cent of Catholics involved in mixed marriages were "lost to the church."

Party's Policy Reaffirmed by Polish Leader

FRANKOW, Poland, Nov. 30 (AP)—Communist Leader Wladyslaw Gombolka warned a pre-election program that there is room for communists in Poland. But he said it was possible to "cooperate" with other parties, including the Catholic Progressives, can plan.

Gombolka launched the campaign for Poland's first elections under a "Polish regime" with a stern declaration of communist aims. In announcing the determination to "crush" any reactionaries, he admitted the "Polish crisis" had there could be no return of capitalism in Poland despite the desires of "reactionary forces."

"We realize," he said, "that there are those reactionary forces who are working on the crisis of the wave of democratization and reactionaries themselves."

"They deny this is so. If it is the husband who finds his wife in bed and a man in the cupboard, should he return to the husband to believe the man when he says he was waiting for a woman?"

CHICAGO, Nov. 30 (AP)—The grand champion steer of the 1956 National Livestock exposition was sold yesterday for \$20.50 a pound, a record.

Purchaser of the steer was the Greenbrier Hotel, White Sulphur Springs, W. Va.

The grand champ, a senior year Shorthorn named P & T Trouble, weighed 165 pounds at the time of the sale Tuesday, but it gained 60 pounds since then and weighed 225 pounds today.

The steer's owner, Pennsylvania State University, 152529730.

The previous record price for a steer was \$18 a pound at a sale held at Hereford shown by Sue White, Big Springs, Tex., in 1955.

Sydney A. Clark Taken by Death

U.S. Operates Gigantic, New Radio System

ANCONA, Alaska, Nov. 29—A new 100 million dollar military communications system was today being turned on in Alaska's northern district.

The system consists of a sprawling network of stations for sending and receiving messages without the old bugaboo of wire failure and atmospheric interference. It began more than a year ago and bears the code name of "White Alice."

Yesterday's ceremonies mark the opening of a doglegged 260-mile segment. It extends from here to Wainwright, 30 miles to the northeast, then 80 miles southeast to Cordova and from there to a station in the Gulf of Alaska.

When all the big stations are completed, they will be scattered far and wide across the bleak tundras, jagged mountains and deep valleys for a total distance of 2,100 miles. One important station will be on St. Lawrence island in the Bering sea, scarcely a hundred miles from Russian Siberia.

The odd-looking contrivances employed in the communications system are matched only by the technical name of one phase of the radio relay system. They call it "forward propagation tropospheric scatter."

Two types of radio relays are used, mainly because it is next to impossible to build, maintain and service wire circuits across some of the world's roughest and meanest terrain.

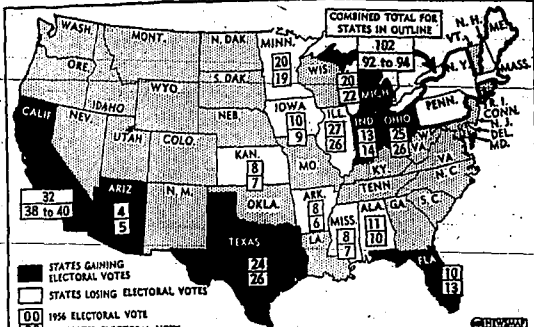

Secret Labor Is Held to Control and Tame Incredible Energy of H-Bombs

By ALTON L. BLAKESLEE
PRINCETON, N. J., Nov. 30—U.S. Princeton university scientists have given newsmen a frustrating little peek into a brand new laboratory dedicated to taming the H-bomb to produce peaceful power.

If it succeeds, the world will have all the energy and power it needs for a billion years.

If it fails, the world faces eventual exhaustion of energy from coal, oil, and even from uranium.

The whole project is shrouded in secrecy under the atomic energy commission.

But Dr. Lyman Spitzer, Jr., and Dr. Henry D. Smith expressed guarded hopes the H-bomb reaction can be controlled, perhaps in 10 to 20 years.

"We're making progress. But we can't tell you what it is," they said. And they outlined in a general way how the cores of hydrogen atoms might be fused to release fantastic energy to create electricity.

Hydrogen atoms in the sea would become a limitless source of power.

Secrecy made it a frustrating task. Indeed, the new \$600,000 building is one of the most interesting labs I never quite saw.

In one room you could look through a big clean window of control room. But the room you were looking into was dark, and other equipment—shrouded in eric

(fashion—was cloaked by a curtain anyway.

In another room, gay in lavender and green paint, there were merely big boxes—the frames of steel. Classified equipment was still to come before the doors would be turned to outsiders.

Then there was a questions-and-answers period.

As Dr. Spitzer, director of the laboratory said, some questions they don't know answer to yet, and others they aren't permitted to answer.

Dr. Spitzer, 42, an astrophysicist, got some ideas of how to tame the H-bomb reaction five years ago while riding up a mountain in a ski-lift.

He heads Project Matterhorn—named for a formidable peak to conquer—which is part of a general project to control H-bomb fusion. Laboratories at Los Alamos and Livermore, Calif., all are cooperating toward the same goal. Russia and Britain are trying to tame the H-bomb too.

The H-bomb gets its terrific power from fusing cores of light-weight atoms, such as deuterium or double-weight hydrogen.
