Death of Woman Hikes Valley Car Victim Toll to 36

GOODING, Dec. 3.—No inquest is planned in the death of Sara Lillian Walton, 39, Buhl, who died Sunday at St. Bernice hospital, Jerome, as a result of injuries received when she stepped from a moving automobile near Saturday in the 36th for Magic Valley and in the county so far this year. In the state, 1956, 237 traffic fatalities have been reported for 1956. Mrs. Walton's death is the 36th for the Magic Valley and the 10th for the county. Mrs. Walton was driving a 1954 Buick Wildcat when she was struck by a car traveling between 40 and 45 mph on the highway. The accident happened approximately one mile west of Wendell.

Russian tanks withdrew to inconspicuous positions on the city's outskirts today but remained on the alert against a repetition of yesterday's demonstrations, carried out in open defiance of Soviet guns. Security checks were tightened. Istvan Szirmai, chief of the government press department, first denied and then admitted that the Russians had deported Hungarians. He

Russians Accuse West Of Plotting Bloodbath

LONDON, Dec. 3 (AP)—Russia accused the West today of plotting to drown Hungary in blood. Diplomatic quarters here said the West was "deliberately" fomenting uprisings in its satellite empire. Diplomatic dispatches from behind the iron curtain said the "nervous communist leaders" were strengthening their defenses in Romania, Bulgaria, Albania and Czechoslovakia against "Tito's rumblings within and infiltration from without. There were rumblings from East Germany, as well, and open fears students might touch off a Hungarian-style revolt. There were also East German Communist warnings that a similar revolution there might lead to an open revolution.

Turkey Could Be Leader for Arabic World

By United Press

Turkey is likely to emerge soon as the dominant power in the Middle East. It will not be surprising if, in course of time, Turkey gains the leadership of the Arab world which it held before the end of World War I.

Turkey's position as the most powerful in the Middle East has been emphasized as the result of the Suez canal crisis and the present tension between Iraq and Syria. President Gamal Abdel Nasser has long sought to make Egypt a bridge between the leader of the Arab nations and the leading nation in the Middle East. Nasser looks pretty big at the moment. But he is likely to look much smaller within the next few months.

Nasser's prestige was greatly well illustrated when the Israeli army tipped when the Egyptian Sinai peninsula in the attack which touched off the new Middle East turmoil.

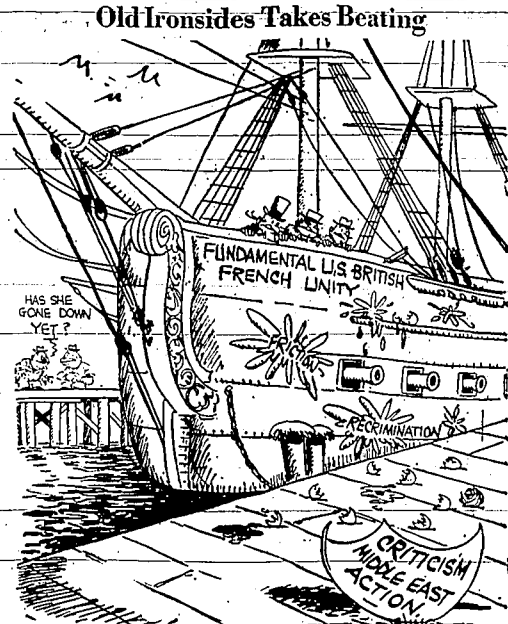
On the other hand, has a claim to Middle Eastern leadership. There are indications that it is ready to claim that leadership now.

Turkey's strategic position is important because it is at the northern corner of the Middle East, and because it is a sub-ark—area, and because it is a link—area, between Russia and the Middle East.

Its political position is important because it is a loyal friend of the West, and especially of the United States.

Its military position is important because it has the best army of any in the Middle East. It has about 400,000 tough, well-armed and well-trained men. The troops Turkey sent to the Korean war won the admiration of the allied world.

Increased Turkish activity in the Middle East would greatly strengthen the position of the free world in that area.



Old Ironsides Takes Beating

The old USS Constitution, known as Old Ironsides, was recently beaten by a modern battleship in a simulated sea battle. The Constitution, a 18th-century wooden-hulled three-masted heavy gunpowder frigate, was outmaneuvered and outgunned by the USS Iowa, a modern battleship. The Constitution's mainmast was struck and fell, and she was forced to retreat. The Iowa's superior firepower and speed proved to be the deciding factors in the encounter.

LONDON, Dec. 3 (AP)—London buzzed with rumors of a new romance today because Princess Margaret, 24, and Lord Fitzalan was tipped to be engaged. The princess, who has been making headlines with her romance with Captain Peter Townsend, spent the week-end at the luxurious Woburn residence of the 25-year-old Earl of Wilton.

The earl is a handsome, hush-hush bachelor who usually shuns the day life of which Margaret is so fond. However, he recently joined what is known as the "Margaret set" in London cafe society.

The Daily Sketch said today the earl was "London's most eligible bachelor" and "one of the princess's best friends."

The party went hunting, and the princess and Lord Fitzalan were mysteriously reported to be "better than satisfactory."
